



I thought that after school got started I would have more time to study and such. But I was wrong. For the last week I have been so busy. I've been to every college activity except classes.





"The College may be expected to develop in accordance with the foregoing principles," President Robert Gordon Sproul said, "into a unit worthy, within the range of its activities, of the University of which it is an integral and respected part."

In a statement from the Provost, Dr. J. Harold Williams, he said: "This would seem to settle the controversial issues concerning the introduction of work beyond the bachelor's degree and the retention of the Industrial Arts as a part of the program."


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


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
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
