California, at their meeting at L Alamos, N.M., on Sept. 26, accept ed a joint report of its Committee

on Educational Policy and Ground on Educational Buildings, including a state-
ment of policy for the future of Santa Barbara College, and a final plan for the development of the
Goleta campus.
The policy statement adopted unanimously by the Regents

college of the highest quality, enabling it to become a distinguished graduate instruction should be be
