Shake Your Booty: Gauchos Going to the Big Dance



The UCSB women's basketball team overcame adversity on and off the court to win its fifth consecutive Big West Tournament Conference title. The Gauchos slammed California State-Fullerton in the first round, 79-50. Santa Barbara then slipped by Boise State in the semifinal game Friday, before topping Long Beach State for the postseason conference crown.

ANAHEIM, Calif. -The 2000-01 season was unlike any other for the UCSB women's basketball team, and that was what made this weekend's results that much more gratifying.

The Gauchos continued their Big West dominance at the Anaheim Convention Center, defeating Boise State 78-63 and Long Beach State

its players to perform with heart against a determined Long Beach State team Saturday afternoon in the Big West Tournament championship game.

Looking to avenge two regular season defeats to the Gauchos and sporting tees that read 'unfinished business,' LBSU bolted to a 13-0 lead. Despite the early deficit, Santa Barbara did not panic, responding with a 7-0 run of its own. Freshman forward Lisa Willett led the UCSB comeback, righting the Gauchos' ship with three early points. Riding the superb play of Willett and Rogers, who combined for 18 first half points, Santa Barbara dominated the 49ers following the opponent's early burst, outscoring LBSU 30-15 for the rest of the half.

The second half was a seesaw affair, featuring 13 lead changes and four ties, with each team laying it on the line.

The Gauchos jumped out to a 41-38 lead with Rogers scoring nine quick points, including a threepoint play. Giving up more than three inches inside to the taller 49ers, Rogers crashed the boards with a vengeance in the second half, grabbing nine rebounds in the second half and 11 for the game.

Despite the outstanding play of Rogers, UCSB was unable to maintain its lead, falling behind 42-41, and again 44-43. Long Beach then tied the score at 49 on a three-pointer from senior guard Reta Sula, who finished with 20 points on 6-7 shooting from behind the arc.

UCSB would need all away, Sula would provide an answer from LBSU in the form of a clutch threepointer. Although she

played well, Sula was disappointed with her performance after the game's conclusion.

"I felt like I could have done more," Sula said while fighting off tears. "But I just didn't do it today."

UCSB managed to nurse a slim three-point lead for much of the second half, going up by scores of 67-64 and 69-66. The Gauchos finally appeared to have the game

wrapped up when Rogers nailed two free throws to give Santa Barbara a 77-71 lead with only 32.6 seconds left to play. But junior forward Ekuah Ramsey pulled the 49ers to within four on a layup and, following another Rogers free throw, junior guard Tamara Inoue buried a three-pointer to make the score 78-76.

Christensen was then sent to the charity stripe with three seconds left and a chance to ice the game for UCSB. Christensen hit the first free throw, but came empty on her second try, giving LBSU one final attempt to tie. However, Ramsey's heave from

behind half court was just short, hitting the front iron, and Santa Barbara held on to win the title. "This team has a different personality and differ-

ent character than past teams," French said. "But of course, I am very proud of them."

UCSB will now advance to the NCAA Tournament, where it will face 1999 National Champion Purdue on Friday in West Lafayette, Indiana. The trip to West Lafayette will be a homecoming of sorts for Willett, whose parents attended Purdue.

"I'm excited to go back to Purdue," Willett said. "I have a lot of friends and family down there. I think we have a great chance."

The Gauchos were awarded a #14 seed. Santa Barbara was expected to gain a higher seed after capturing the Big West Title.

"I thought we might be a 12 or 13 seed, because we have some wins over teams seeded higher than us," French said. "But the selection committee goes by [the Ratings Percentage Index] and our losses to Cal Poly and Irvine were too much to overcome."

In spite of the low seeding, UCSB still feels it can battle with the Boilermakers and the team is looking forward to the challenge.

"The team is really excited," French said. "There will be a huge crowd and it's going to be a blast. This is a huge reward for our team."
