# Men's Soccer Kicks In With **Best Start Since 1971 Season**

■ UCSB Hopes to Ride Successes Into Postseason

After a disappointing end to the 1994 season - in which Santa Barbara went winless in its last six games and finished with a 9-10-1 record — the UCSB men's soccer team has come back with a vengeance in 1995, jumping out to a blistering 7-0-1 start to the new campaign.

Fourth-year Head Coach Mark Arya has his squad dancing all over its opponents both on offense and defense, out-

scoring foes 22-5 thus far.

The team is off to its best start since 1971, when the Gauchos won their first nine matches.

Arya credits a new team focus for UCSB's success this season.

"We've adopted a new philosophy on how we want to present the game and that has carried over into our transition game," he said. "We are a lot more disciplined, a lot more organized and we play with a lot more teamwork.

The Gauchos boast an impressive group of returning starters including senior midfielder Ralph Robertson, an All-Mountain Pacific Sports Federation Pacific Division selection last season when he tallied seven goals and nine assists. Senior sweeper Patrick Griffin comes back after earning Second Team MPSF honors last year. Santa Barbara returns nine more players who saw action as starters in 1994: senior defender Steve Hennessey, junior defender Mike Squellati, senior forwards Jeff Johnson and Kristian Berre, junior midfielder Brian Mackerer, senior forward Greg DePaco, sophomore defenders Jason Deal and Danny Sparks and sophomore forward Danny Mann.

She was recently named Most Valuable Player of the Cal Poly career digs and kills at San Luis Obispo Classic after posting 45 kills, 32 digs and 16 blocks in the three-match tourney.

Stiner, a middle blocker, was named to the All-Tournament Team after her performance at the Cal Poly Classic. She posted 41 kills, 29 digs and 31 blocks during the tournament.

After a decent season last year, Kaylor, also a middle blocker, has become one of the strongest blockers in UCSB history. In her past 17 games, Kaylor blocked 32 balls for an average of 1.88 per game.

Sophomore outside hitter Jennifer Stroffe and senior outside hitter Shannan Meixsell have been banged up of late, but their presence on the court will be well noticed once their injuries heal.

Sophomore setter Maile Mortensen experienced a sluggish start for the Gauchos, but at the Cal Poly Classic she regained her composure and set two of the best matches of her

Newcomers:

Freshman middle blocker Katie Crawford has been coming off of the bench to provide the Gauchos with a little extra hitting and blocking power. Freshman setter Meri-de Boyer backs up starting setter Mortensen.

Perhaps the most pleasant surprises have been defensive specialists Michelle Pavicich and Tania Yamashita. Both have been providing UCSB with key defensive plays. Other newcomers include opposite Hilary Gunsaulus and outside hitters Charlene Conley, Danielle Leon, Erin McCown and Jill Peterson.

Strengths:

Blocking has been a big plus for the Gauchos thus far. They are currently second in the Big West Conference in blocks per game, averaging 3.23. However, the biggest strength for UCSB has been the strong leadership from Keys and Stiner and the all-around improvement of Kaylor.

Depth is another asset for the Santa Barbara squad. Gregory boasts a roster with over 12 players she feels can come in a match at anytime and contribute.

Concerns: Offense is probably the biggest worry for the Gauchos. According to Gregory, the team's tempo



Losses:

The Gauchos lost nine of their 11 starters from 1994, with only Hunter and Hayes coming back.

Newcomers:

Some of the biggest pieces of the team's puzzle are walk-on freshmen: defender Jana Matteoli, forward Kristy Witzman, midfielder Karna Forschler, defender Paula Haas, goalkeeper Katie Eichhorst and forward Darcie Frounfelter.

• Strengths:

Although Santa Barbara is young and inexperienced, Cossaboon believes that its most noticeable strength thus far is the squad's work ethic and positive attitude.

"We're not a team loaded with superstars. It could be silly looking at a team that is 2-7, analyzing the strengths but in this case it is not so," Cossaboon said. "Their unwillingness to quit is by far this team's biggest asset. When things start getting bad, most young teams have a tendency to give up and quit, but this team is not

# Cross Country Teams Look for Big West Titles

The 1995 UCSB men's and women's cross country teams not only look strong this season, but look to take the league titles.

With a strong winning performance over 1994 Big West Champion Utah State on Sept. 16, the Gaucho

men are in the driver's seat in the conference.
In the same event at UC Irvine, Santa Barbara's women's team took a tough 54-point loss to league rival and 1995 conference favorite UCI. However, UCSB Head Coach Pete Dolan fully expects the women to battle the Anteaters for the top spot by season's end.

On the men's side, the Gauchos have a deep pool of returning runners. Brad Glosser, Dave Cullum, Liam Jones, Nate Weber, Dave Blum and Forest Quinlan all

have come back to lead UCSB in '96.
For the women, Eliza Alexander, Eva Mattson, Gaby Rodriguez, Mary Crane, Heather Bray, Julie Marshall and Laurie Murphy look to be the top returnees to help the squad win a title.

Santa Barbara's women's team was hit hardest by losing top runner Kara Bradbury and Beckie Levy (in the top five) to graduation, while its #2 runner Deanna Hadley is no longer on the squad due to discipline problems, according to Dolan.

The men lost only one top-five athlete in Paul Goodrich, but also will not have the services of Gus Harper, who is now the assistant coach.

### · Strengths:

The men's strength will no doubt be their depth in the pack but in also the strength of its top three runners. Glosser, Cullum and transfer standout Ben Flam all posted good times in the first two meets.
"This is the best depth since 1990," Dolan said.

"Coupled with our top three guys, it makes the possibil-

ities for this team very good right now."

Like the men, the Gaucho women will rely on their top three athletes, Alexander, Mattson and Rodriguez, to carry the load for the squad.

### Outlook:



There are certain code words that coaches and athletes use to let the media know that good things are not on the horizon.

Two of these words seem to come up often when the UCSB men's waterpolo team is the topic of conversation: rebuilding and improvement.

The Gauchos were hurt big time by graduation, losing nine seniors from

last year's squad. Now Santa Barbara's team consists of two seniors, one junior and a whole lot of inexperience.

### • Returnees:

The lone senior returnees are driver/two-meter man Adam Estabrook and driver Kevin Eggert, who was expected to leave for UCLA but ended up staying at UCSB.

The Gauchos also have seven returning sopho-mores who will need to be a strong force if Santa Barbara's season is to be a successful one.

### · Losses:

Among the nine seniors lost to graduation last year were two-time All-American Doug Wierenga and All-Mountain Pacific Sports Federation selection Nikola Ivanovic.

The Gauchos finished last season ranked sixth in the nation, but without the help of those seniors, regaining that ranking will be difficult.

"We did well last year,"

Estabrook said, "but we relied on our seniors a lot."

### · Newcomers:

Santa Barbara only has one junior this year, Air Force Academy transfer Tyler Rameson. He will be looked upon for some experience at the driver position.

True freshmen Donny Hooper and Morgan Williams will also be asked to carry a sizable load this year. Hooper was a Second Team High School All-American and Williams a Third Team selection.

"I really like the younger guys," Estabrook said. "I think they have a really promising future."

### Strengths:

Santa Barbara has a lot of young players, but it will try to make up for its inexperience with its tenacity.

Rameson believes that what the team lacks in size it makes up for with speed.

'We're really fast and we're a good counterattacking team," he said. "Because we aren't as big, we try to swim under our opponents."

### • Concerns:

An obvious one here. The team is essentially a brand new one, and with only two seniors, it will be


