Train Canceled to All-Cal; Rooters May Fly to Berkeley

Cancellation of the proposed rooters train to the All-University Weekend in Berkeley next week was announced by Graduate Manager Russ Erikson. Reason given was the fact that UCLA rooters will fly to the celebration instead of go by

Mary Ann Zane, Cal Club chairman in charge of arrangements for students on this campus of the University, said that arrangements are being completed to charter an insured DC4 passenger plane from Robin Airlines to fly Gauchos to Berkeley leaving Friday afternoon and returning at noon on Sunday.

Reservations for the flight will be \$16 round-trip, with transportation provided from Oakland airport to Berkeley. At least 64 reservations must be made by Monday, November 5, or the flight will be cancelled.
