Campus Blackout Caused by Angry Staffer Seeking Fame and Fortune

Nexist Photographer Freaks Out; Held for Psychological Examination

The two-hour blackout on campus Thursday evening was apparently caused by an angst-stricken Nexist employee who hoped to capture the limelight for his award-winning photos.

Staff Photographer James Ku was detained by campus police after they discovered the employee's camera equipment hidden at the main generator. Ku is being detained at the county jail until he can seek psychological help.

Ku said he pulled the plug because he hoped to re-create a traffic accident at the east end of campus and capture the catastrophe on film. He said he was bitter he did not garner more awards for his work at an annual competition last weekend.

"I deserved to win more awards. I thought if I could make my own crisis and be the first one on the scene, I would surely sweep the competition next year. That Rachel girl will not

outshine me again," he said.

Ku's colleagues were not surprised the boy-from-next-door photographer was capable of concocting such a plot. Photo Editor Rachel Weill said Ku was always a shady character.

"I often wondered how he always happened to be the first photographer at the scene of the

crime," Weill said. "I noticed there was something odd about him from the first moment he walked into the darkroom."

Copy Editor Corey Cohen, however, was stunned with the allegations and described Ku as the ideal co-worker.

Yang Ousted; Reagan Will be Chancellor

University of California President Jack Peltason, in a stunning move, has reversed his decision to appoint Henry Yang as the next chancellor of UCSB, instead offering the post to former President Ronald Reagan.

Publicly, UC officials main-

tain that Peltason hopes to boost the University's image by hiring the former president.

"Reagan was one of the most popular presidents in recent history," said Office of the President Spokesman Mike Alva. "He's got plenty of experience with deficit spending as well, and goodness knows we need all the help we can get."

However, the Nexist has obtained tapes of phone conver-

sations between Peltason and several UC Regents in which he outlines more personal reasons for snubbing Yang in favor of Reagan.

"Purdue's basketball team made it to the Final Eight, but where's UCLA? Where's Cal?" Peltason said in one conversation with Regent Roy Brophy. "It just wouldn't look good to

Bosnia-Herzegovina Wants New Name

SARAJEVO, Bosnia-Herzegovina (AP) — Due to frequent misspellings in local and international publications, Bosnia-Herzegovina is considering officially changing its name, Bosnian Serb leader Radovan Karadzic announced Thursday.

"We want to choose a name which is easy to spell, yet is characteristic of the passion and spirit of our people," he said.

Sources close to Karadzic say the decision to change names is in no way influenced by a mistake found in an official government memo from him dated March 2.

The memo, written in Serbian, spells the name of the country as "Bozksnea-Hairsegovia." When approached with questions about the memo, Karadzic



was unable to comment.

Ljubomir Berberovic, assembly president of the Muslim-led Bosnian government, was enthusiastic about Karadzic's plan.

"We are happy that the Serbs want to remain part of Bosnia, unified under a different name," he said. "As a show of solidarity, I have decided to change my name as well — to Muhammad Ali."

Miroslav Yerodzveski-Morkveskdzx, leader of the group "Bosnians Un-

tied To Tradition" (BUTT), has come up with many alternatives to the multisyllabic original.

"Personally, I am in favor of changing the name to Trout Fishing in America," Yerodzveski-Morkveskdzx said. "It is a symbol of our country's individuality, a paean to our youthful ignorance."

Richard Brautigan, late author of the quasi-beatnik novel *Trout Fishing in America*, was unavailable for comment.

"I would not be against changing our name to Trout Fishing in America, because it symbolizes the struggles we have had to face — with regards to fish, as well as our daily lives," Karadzic said.

Sources close to Brautigan say he has been dead "a long time."

A rival Croat faction has spoken out in favor of keeping the difficult name.

"Let them misspell it," Croat traditionalist Yuri Ugrivsk told *The Associated Press* Thursday. "I would prefer to add to the existing name, if anything."

"Bosnia-Herzegovina-Gadda-Da-Vita," Ugrivsk said, as an example of an addended name.

EuroDisney Running Illegal Operations

PARIS (AP) — Officials in the French Ministry of Culture have decided to close EuroDisney, the sprawling theme park outside Paris for reasons of French pride, the newspaper *Le Monde* is reporting.

According to Culture Minister Jack Lalange, EuroDisney has represented a "disgusting eyesore of American culture spoiling our landscape." Lalange reported that in addition to being an insult to French national pride, EuroDisney had also been running several illegal operations that authorities had been heretofore unaware of.

"Yes, we have now extensive knowledge of these illegal things and we shall punish these individuals and put them in prison," Lalange said.



According to records from investigators with the Paris Police Department, Snow White had been running a secret brothel at the park for at least eight months in her on-site home. Speculation is that as the financial fortunes of EuroDisney had declined so much that alternate fund-raising methods that were kept very quiet were put into action by EuroDisney's parent company.

Isabelle Leblanc, the person playing Snow

White at EuroDisney was apprehended late Thursday night by French border police while attempting to flee to Italy. In a taped confession, Leblanc admitted she had run the brothel and told police that Cinderella, the Little Mermaid and Sleeping Beauty were also in on the ring. She also told the police that Beauty and the Beast were also popular with people looking for a little variety.

As the park prepared to

shut its doors for good, "The Maginot Line" ride, which had been so popular with the German crowds to the park, was

one of the first rides to be shut down. Park employees then went from ride to ride pulling the plug on this 56 billion franc endeavor.

"Hey, come on, we lost two wars this century," said Karl-Uwe Weber, a visitor from Munich. "At least they should let us have a little fun."

Throughout its two-year history, EuroDisney had been plagued by financial troubles and cultural incongruities. In late January, Belgian guest-workers manning the cafeterias walked off the job in protest at having to cook french fries.

Smith v. Regents: Some Oily Affair

While the political and practical ramifications of the California Supreme Court's *Smith v. Regents* decision continue to reverberate throughout the University of California, the question of many people's minds is: "Just who was this 'Smith' anyway?"

Enterprising investigative reporters at the *Daily Nexist* believe they just may have found some clues to the identity of Smith, clues that may help students and administrators to predict the next batch of lawsuits to face the UC.

Smith & Wesson v. Regents

Investigators intercepted a memo from the management of the Smith & Wesson firearms company that may provide a clue to the origins of the *Smith* suit. Executives apparently believed that the collection of mandatory fees for political purposes represented a threat to citizens' right to bear arms.

Corporate spokesman Sam Colt IV confirmed his company's involvement, but was quick to clarify the nature of their responsibility.

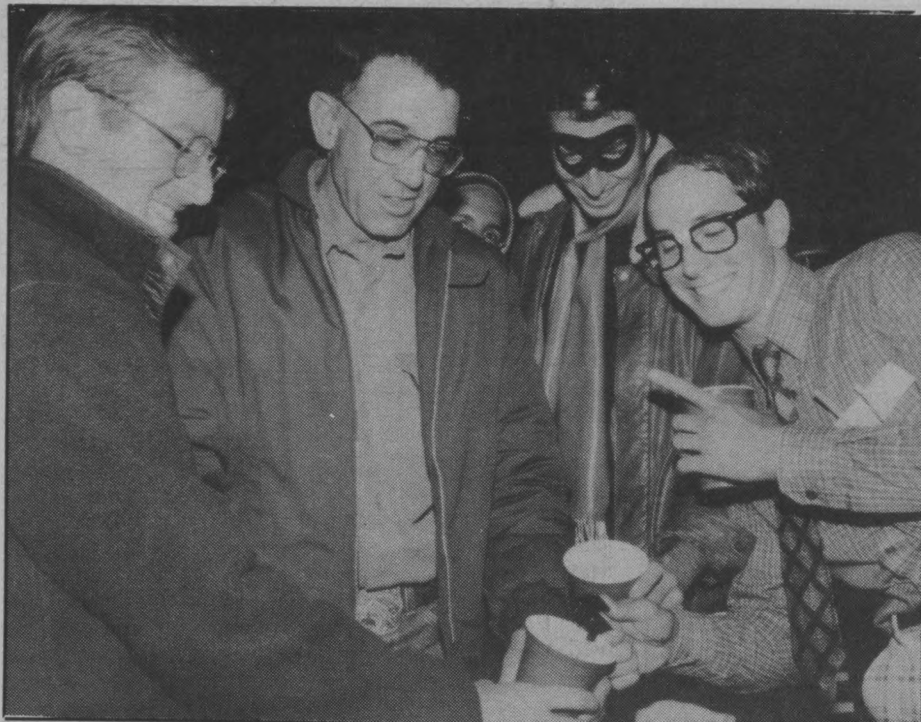
"Well, we might have been in on that, we are all for the Second Amendment. Who are these regent folks again?" he said.

Unarmed sources inside the gun manufacturer were even more explicit. "Yeah, we did it, our lawyers just goofed on the amendments so it ended up coming out as a First Amendment issue. Oh well," said anonymous source Bob Handlebar.

Secrecy was initially the directive of the heirs to the Wesson share of the firm, who feared student members of political and religious groups would boycott Wesson vegetable oil products. As a result, only the Smith name was attached to the case.

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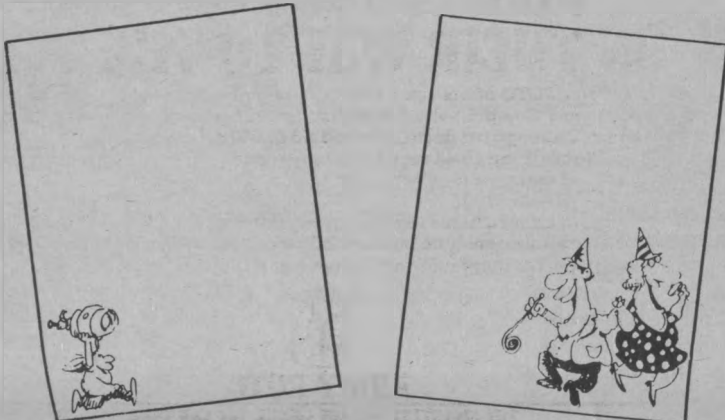


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Peltason Feels God is on His Side

In light of UC President Jack Peltason's recent statement that God and his wife feel he should retain his post, a senator who recently called for his resignation publicly retracted his criticism, claiming to have "seen the error of his ways."

In response to criticism from Senator Quentin Kopp (I-San Francisco) and members of the Board of Regents, after the *San Francisco Examiner* revealed in late March a private video conference between Peltason and his Council of Chancellors, Peltason wrote, "I said my tenure depends on God, my wife and the Board of Regents. So far, two out of three want me to stay on."

Kopp, who had submitted a resolution citing eight grievances against Peltason to the California State Senate requesting his resignation, said he was "moved by Peltason's poignant retort," and felt that it was his duty to revoke the proposal.

"Peltason reminded me of an important reality — the natural chain of command. There is a hierarchy in place and as long as we

all recognize and accept our place we should have no problems. I see now how silly I was to question Peltason. Just silly," Kopp said.

"If God spoke to Peltason, how can I refute that? Word goes from God, to the UC President, to the chancellors, then slowly trickles on down the line. If we cannot see the righteousness of a particular action carried out by Peltason, it is simply because we are lesser beings," Kopp said.

According to Kopp, students, faculty and staff at the UC are lucky that, in such a time of economic crisis, they have a leader who knows the right thing to say to console members of the public and inspire their confidence. "He's an incredibly articulate man," Kopp said.

University of California Student Association representative Aaron Jones, who previously advocated the replacement of Peltason, also had a surprising change of heart after hearing that, according to Peltason, not only God, but his wife wants him to retain the position.

"I've always thought that no one can really measure the quality of a person better than one's spouse. It

may appear to the rest of us that he's lousing things up, but if his wife is still behind him, then I have to say I am too," Jones said.

Even many members of the Board of Regents, who were quick to join the anti-Peltason bandwagon, were also quick to regain faith from his words of assurance. In fact, rather than continuing to scrutinize their leader, most seem busy redefining themselves in accordance with this newly recognized level of prestige.

"Well, now, Peltason is saying he is God's choice to run the University. I guess that would make me an apostle of sorts, now wouldn't it?" said Regent Wyte N. Mayle, who was apparently excited by the notion. Claiming to have found a renewed sense of purpose in his appointment as a regent, Mayle added, "I always knew I was special. I always knew I would make a difference."

While Peltason was unavailable for comment, his wife Marge eagerly asserted, "Why sure he's the man for the job. I'm just glad that folks are recognizing all the wonderful things that I have known all along."

Survey and Symposium on Circumcision

Survey of the long-term effects on men of infant circumcision is being conducted by the National Organization of Circumcision Information Resource Centers (NOCIRC), a non-profit educational resource center organized in 1986 by parents and parents. NOCIRC will also convene the Third International Symposium on Circumcision, May 22-25, 1994, near Washington, DC and welcomes university students, minorities, health care professionals and lawyers in attendance for the survey and the symposium.

Tim Hammond states, "The male foreskin is a normal and beneficial part of the male anatomy, providing lifelong protection, lubrication and pleasure. Amputating an infant's foreskin has as yet unstudied long-term physical, sexual, emotional and psychological consequences. A lot of men are living with these effects and are either not aware of them or are too embarrassed to talk about it."

Some of the harmful effects being reported by men include prominent penile varicose veins, skin tags and bridges, tight painful erections, and sexual dysfunction as well as feelings of violation, mutilation or betrayal by parents. A very common side effect is progressive sensitivity loss, causing many men to resort to exaggerated masturbation techniques to achieve sufficient stimulation for orgasm, sometimes to the point of exhaustion. Hammond went on to say, "When you forcibly amputate the foreskin, healthy and functioning genitalia of either sex, it has effects upon both physical and emotional functioning."

A one-page confidential questionnaire, which is to be completed and returned for statistical purposes. The preliminary findings of this ongoing survey, begun in 1992, were presented at the Third International Symposium on Circumcision in May.

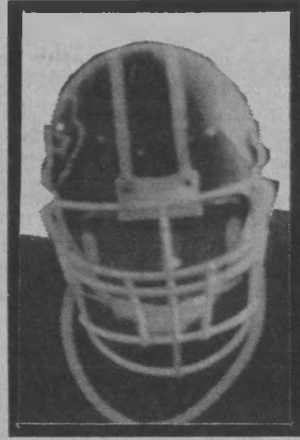

"I heard he invited the judge — it's a conspiracy," said Bill Wallace, a Goleta veterinarian and Chamberlin's political opponent. "It's not fair."

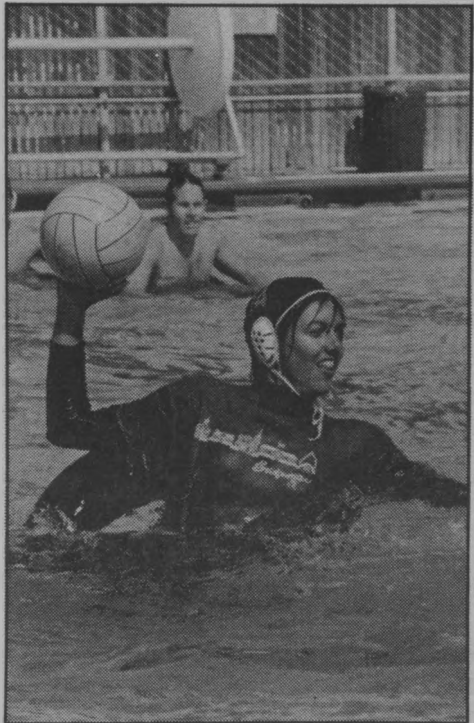

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NCAA Sentences UCSB Hoops to Death

The UCSB men's basketball program has been given the death penalty by the NCAA for a ton of violations, the NCAA reported from its headquarters in Kansas City, Missouri. The Gauchos will be banned from playing basketball for two years and not allowed to have scholarship players for three years.

As one can imagine, reaction was one of shock around the athletic department as they learned the Nachos would not be playing basketball for two years. Known for a squeaky-clean reputation, it sent shockwaves throughout.

"I am profoundly astonished at the scope and magnitude of these implications," UCSB Acting-Athletic Director Gin Rummeo said. "The ramifications of this show an interesting dichotomy of how the sports world — and the competing manifestations of contemporary American society at large — act with celebrity."

According to the Secretary-General of the NCAA, James L. Rennonford, UCSB displayed an "arrogant, elitist attitude, thinking they could cheat the system." The SMU

football team and the Tulane basketball team were the last recipients of the NCAA's death penalty.

In a 13-page report issued by the NCAA, it listed the major violations. It accused Head Coach Jerzy Primm of impropriety in giving \$5 handshakes to those members of his team who passed the ball five times before shooting. The report also accused Primm of striking several little Ballpersons totally hard with his cast after tough losses.

"Well, this is a young team," Primm said from Charlotte, NC, where he is scouting the Arkansas Razorback offense to copy for next year. "This is not indicative, I think, of the type of shooting team we're going to be.

"But if it wasn't for those meddling kids [Ballpersons] I would've got away with it, I should be sitting pretty up at Cal! Those kids always get in the way at halftime when my team is trying to shoot. Damn them! Damn them!"

Assistant Coaches Blobby Lasagna and Been Howlin' were also cited for numerous recruiting violations. Rennonford indicated that the duo of Lasagna and Howlin' one-upped legendary recruiter Jerry Tarkanian by going after a prospect currently up for a parole hearing, but

on Death Row at San Quentin Prison. The two UCSB assistant coaches also were reprimanded by the NCAA for offering recruits toothpicks after a meal at a steakhouse. The NCAA termed the toothpicks "illegal gifts".

"Hey, the guy had a great jumper," a visibly angered Howlin' said while holding large orange, grey and black pieces of cardboard. "What were we supposed to do, not recruit him?"

Howlin' and Lasagna declined to comment on the toothpicks.

Numerous other violations were brought into the limelight by the report, including allegations of paying players for work done in summer jobs that in actuality was not done. According to Rennonford, four current Gauchos were on the payroll as architectural partners and welders with the contracting firm handling the construction of the new

UCen.

Chancellor Barbara Uehling was quick to respond to the Gauchos' off-court problems and spoke of the close relationship the administration and athletic department share.

"Uh uh," Uehling said, counting her \$179,000. "I think that Florida State has a much better football team than UCSB."

As punishment, there will be no basketball for two years and no scholarship players for three

years. The Athletic Department is apparently considering using the winning teams from the intramural leagues in exhibition games against UCSB's slated opponents to keep basketball fans amused.

The NCAA also mandated that Primm will receive no fewer than 25 swats from any Big West officiating crew which cost UCSB a game this year. The corporal punishment

UCSB Hangs on After an Accidental Killing
