FREE LECTURE TONIGHT--CIVIL DEFENSE AND THE H-BOMB

Dr. Albert W. Bellamy, Chief of Radiological Division for the California State Office of Civil Defense and national authority on military and peacetime implications of nuclear energy, will speak tonight, July 29, in the Santa Barbara College Mesa Campus Auditorium at 7:30 p.m. Students and faculty in the summer session community, their families and guests, are cordially invited to hear this informative talk. Dr. Bellamy has been closely identified with the development of atomic weapons since World War II. Since 1947 he has been a consultant for the Atomic Energy Commission. He was a radiological safety monitor during the Bikini atom bomb tests and has gained a first-hand knowledge of radiological dangers involved in nuclear weapons. Don't miss this lecture tonight. Tomorrow Dr. Bellamy will speak before the limited membership of the Channel City Club.

DEADLINES APPROACHING FOR ADMISSION TO REGULAR SESSION

The deadline for the admission of new students to the fall semester of Santa Barbara College is drawing close and those planning to enter college here with regular status should take immediate steps to see that an application and credentials are filed with the Registrar's office. This also applies to summer session students who have not applied for admission to the regular semester. Undergraduates must submit application and other necessary papers for admission by Aug. 16. For the first time, also, graduate students working toward the Master of Arts degree in selected fields will be enrolled. For this program, an application and credentials must be filed not later than Aug. 2. Fields authorized for the MA degree are economics, history, political science, and psychology. Regulations governing graduate work may be obtained from the Registrar's office. Only students with superior scholarship will be admitted to the graduate program.

NATURE STUDY INSTITUTE SECTIONS ARE FILLING UP

If you plan to enroll in the 22nd annual Institute of Nature Study and Conservation following the Summer Session on August 9-21, you are urged to apply at University of California Extension, 906 Santa Barbara St., immediately. Field classes will be taught in seashore life, native birds, western trees, native plants, insects, astronomy, rocks and minerals, conservation principles and elementary science methods. Of particular interest to teachers are special projects which may be applied to the classroom throughout the year in the area of nature study. Two semester units of credit are authorized for those qualified. Outstanding authorities from the College faculty and the staffs of the Museum of Natural History and Botanic Garden will be on the teaching staff.
