## UCSB Ghetto

In an intense and clingy discussion Wednesday, the Isla Vista Community Government finally relinquished all attempts at incorporating the small campus community which has been repeatedly labled a ghetto by high-up campus administrators.

"It was simply a futile concept arrived at after massive drug inducement," Marc Bourgeoisie, government chair, said. "We've got more capitalistic theories in the works — cityhood was a too conventional concept."

After much debate and a citizen's vote of 3 to 0, the community government members moved to form a new commission. This commission, Bushes For Bucks, will emphasize the destruction of Isla Vista apartments. The hope is to eventually turn the area back over to the wild and open up a pay-as-you-play campground.

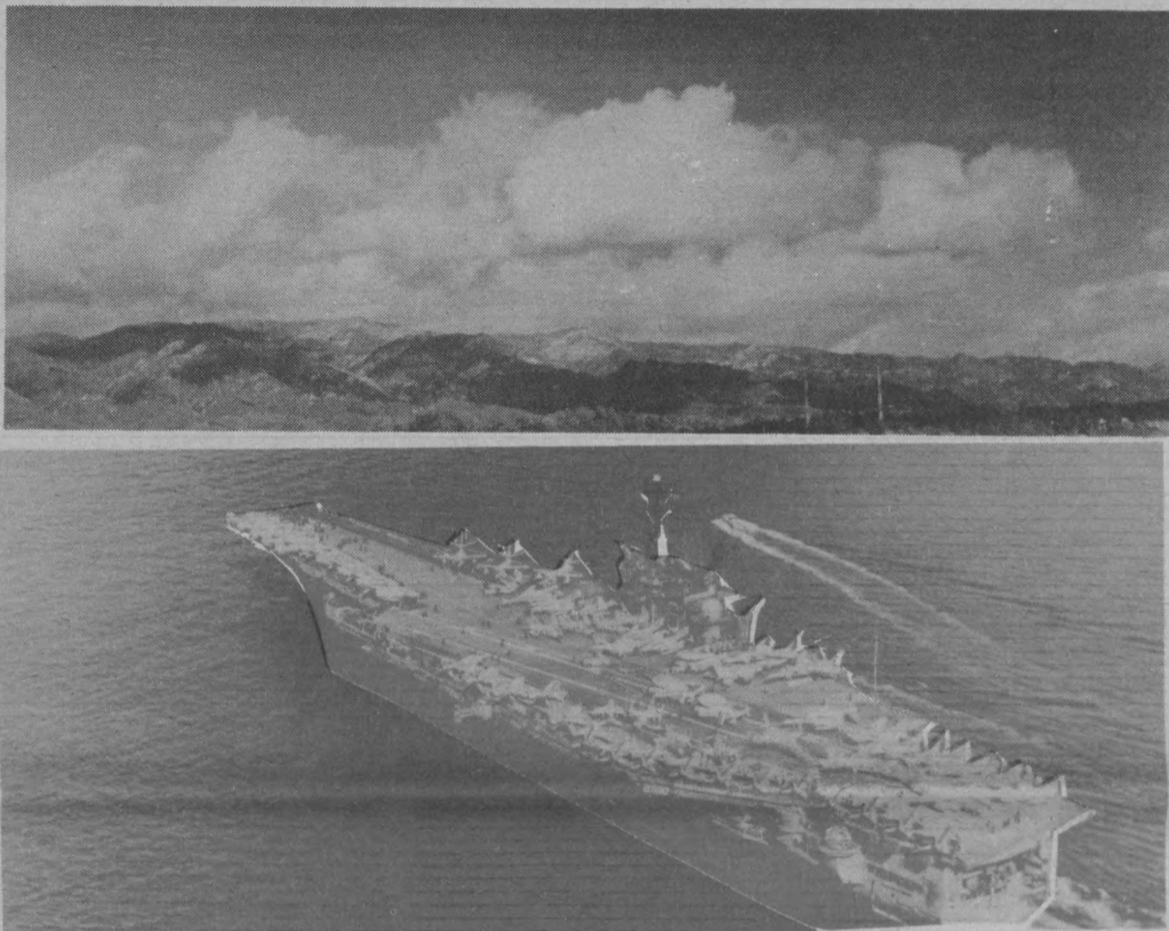

"Well, we plan to have a drug dependence center, a dreadlock hair parlor, a doggie soupline, and a community bedroll lean-to," Gone Froagy, a government member, explained. "Even if we let nature take I.V. over again, we can probably still incorporate these services for the native I.Vites who will continue to stick by the place."

This recent decision has thrown the campus Administration into an uproar. "Where will all the kids go for their weekly intake of Mexican food," Chancellor Robert Hootenholler exclaimed. "Beer and flautas keep these students happy. And, remember a happy student is an apathetic student."

One campus member, however, was overjoyed by the the local community's move toward nature. "At last — a little bit of wilderness in the campus' own backyard. This is simply awesome. I'm glad I'll be a part of it," Professor Roderick Havabash, campus nature enthusiast, said.

"This is a decision that will be easier than cityhood. Afterall, these old buildings won't really need to be torn down. With a little less maintenance they'll fall apart on their own and we'll be well on the way to opening up Camp Odorjuana," Froggy concluded. "We got the great name from all the local scents: oil, greasy food, dog ---, weed, and body odor."

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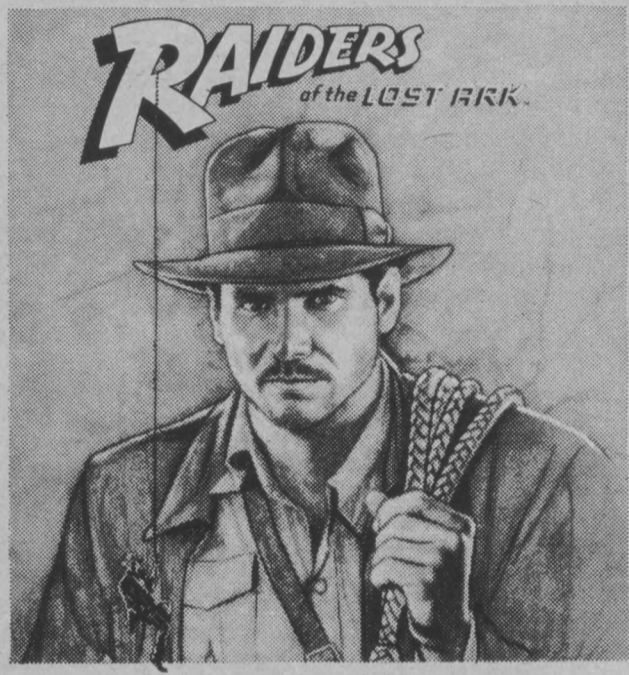


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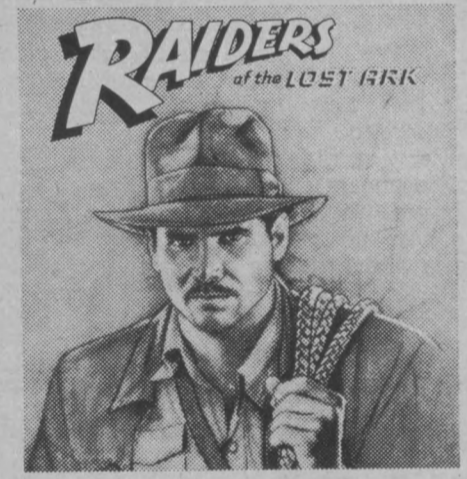

# Full Speed

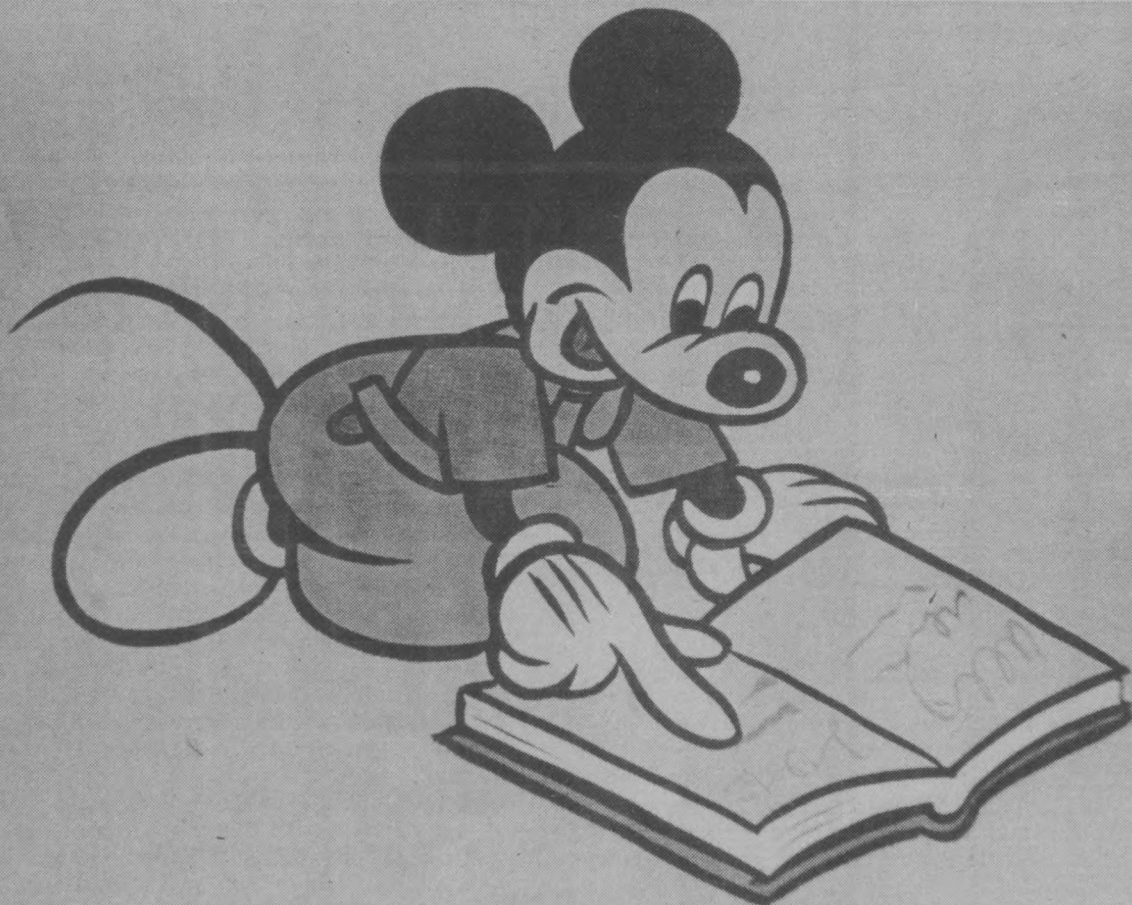

MOSCOW—It's 11 p.m., well past the normal bedtime of the average Russian proletariat. The lights on Krushchevwalk, the main drag in Moscow, are dim, the air warm and stagnant. My rendezvous with "Alexeyev", a top-ranking Soviet official and double agent, is only minutes away. Beads of sweat decorate my forehead as I wait anxiously in front of a filthy closed-down bakery.

The life of a foreign correspondent is by no means easy. Day after day, while Americans sit in their cozy homes reading my yawn-provoking columns, I risk my life in the name of journalistic excellence. But no matter — it's a job, and it must be done.

In the last fourteen hours, I have learned from different contacts that America is in deep trouble. The Soviet leader Andropov is rumored to be storming around the Kremlin, furious at President Reagan's call for a new defensive nuclear system. Some sources claim he is ready to launch Russia's entire nuclear arsenal at the U.S.

Clearly, these reports have been exaggerated. But they do point to the state of affairs behind the Iron Curtain, as President Reagan's recent ABM proposal has Moscow turned upside down. Top officials are hibernating in fall-out shelters, planning their response and preparing for the worst. In short, Russia is in chaos, my life is in danger, and I'm seriously considering getting out of this business.

It's hard to blame the Ruskies for their reaction. After all, if it weren't for that meathead in the White House who calls himself President, we wouldn't be in this mess at all. Who does Reagan think he is, anyway? Luke Skywalker, equipped with the latest laser weaponry? ABM systems went out with the archaic thinking of the sixties, and trying to rekindle this kind of weapon is like trying to iron the wrinkles out of Reagan's face...it's hopeless.

It's time the people of the United States stand up and do something about our hapless leader. Your lives — not to mention my life — are at stake. As a professional journalist, I have a responsibility to the public to write sensible commentary on the state of affairs at home and abroad. The student leaders from all U.C. campuses will be meeting in Malibu to discuss further strategy in the boycott, Spewing said.

Chancellor Robert Hootenholler strongly supported the boycott. "Just think I won't have to deal with continual student complaints."

He added, "It's great! I will even have more time to play soccer."

Hootenholler plans to fund a exclusive soccer club replacing the A.S. space in the UCEN.

Wisecrack commented, "This is indicative of the system the we are in. The administration is not interested in the meaning of the students protest."

He added, "Hootenholler doesn't care about his tan the students' main concern, he only cares that he can use student monies for his own soccer club."

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# Bullocks Moves

In a move which took Santa Barbara Mayor Lila Sludge, the City Council and the Earthing Bookstore by surprise, the Bullock's department store chain announced it has struck a deal with the Isla Vista Municipal Advisory Council, and will locate its planned Santa Barbara outlet in the

recently vacated Bank of America building.

The controversial store was originally slated to be located on State Street.

"The B of A building is a bit smaller than we had originally wanted," Bullock's spokesman Sylvester Stench said. "But its parking lot already has lines painted on it. We project a resultant savings

of almost \$60." He added that Santa Barbara city had not offered Bullock's an "acceptable" plan for painting the downtown site's lot.

Mayor Sludge reacted angrily to the news, claiming that the city's recently formed Bullock's Parking Lot Committee had almost finalized a line-painting plan which would have been

"mutually beneficial" to both parties. "But no, they (Bullock's) have to go and pull a stunt like this," Sludge said, adding that the city will now only give Bullock's half of the nearly \$10 million it had planned to spend on the downtown site. "I would rather they (Bullock's) didn't get any of the money, but we did, after all, shake hands on it."

# Protestors Embrace Violence

In a stunning turn around, the members of the "Cheadle Hall 57," who staged a sit-in last January in protest of U.C. ties to nuclear weapons, have changed their name to the "Cheadle Hall .457 Magnums."

The organization which was dedicated to raising people's consciousness and promoting peace, will now dedicate itself to raising money by threatening aging hippies and eager college students with .457 magnums. The money raised will be invested in companies which manufacture armaments.

"We're tired of using non-violent means to raise people's consciousness. Now we're going to use brute force to get rich," Gone Froggy, of the Radical Education in Economical Killing said.

Rickey Freshman, attorney and weapons specialist for the organization said that another sit-in is planned.

to disable. "We don't want to create opposition to our cause capriciously by blowing away a lot of people.

Freshman declined to say if the group would take prisoners.

Anyone who wishes to join the group will be trained in violent protest in which they will be taught how to use small arms and must be able to survive on tofu and bean sprouts for three days.

# Movies Set Fashion Trends

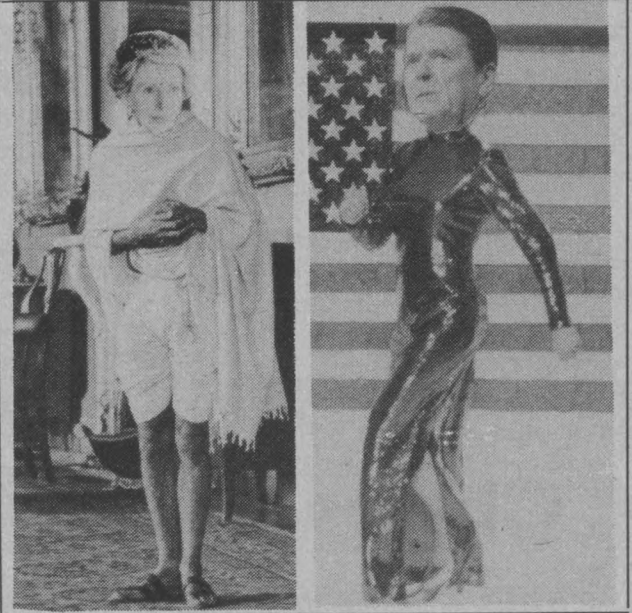

newly-released *30 Days to a Better Bust*.

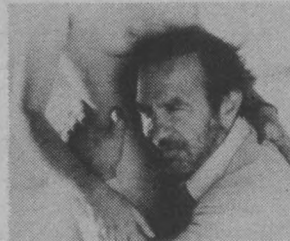
The authors follow the main character, Clea Vegge, through her adventure-filled journey from being "a carpenter's dream" to becoming "a full-busted, desirable female."

The book addresses issues that reach far beyond the usual "We must, we must, we must build up our busts" exercises, and examines the socio-psychological implications of having a bigger bust, as well as the question of the political ramifications of wearing horizontal stripes.

The most fascinating — and inspiring — moments are Clea's struggles between her physical and spiritual selves. She must come to terms with the fact that striving for a bigger bust, though an admirable goal, will not necessarily help starving children in India, her life-long ambition. This passage illustrates the philosophical torment she goes through while deciding whether or not to continue with her 12 repetitions of Alternate Dumbbell Curls: *To curl or not to curl. Do I curl, aiding my blooming bosom, while denying the poor children of the Third World? Or do I commit myself to charity, bettering my world and the world of my children, while denying myself a chance to wear low-cut dresses? What would*

*Eleanor Roosevelt do? How about Jane Fonda? Dolly Parton has a big bust and a successful recording career. But can I sing? Would I really want to tell all on Johnny Carson? And what about implants? Is Carol Doda really happy with herself? Does she go to sleep at night knowing that perhaps in some small way she has made this society a better place to live in?*

To divulge her decision would ruin the climax of the book, but be assured that readers of this masterpiece, whether flat or full, will never be quite the same after sharing this woman's moving experiences.

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

Newly-appointed University of California President David Gardner, the man who would have replaced current president David Saxon on July 1, announced his resignation yesterday at an emergency press conference.

Gardner said he called the press conference after reviewing the U.C. budget for 1983-84.

"(Governor) Deukmejian's budget slash of \$23 million to the U.C. System is a measure which shows heartless inconsideration of the California education system. I think it is a forewarning of cuts to come," Gardner said.

"I simply cannot deal with the pressure of trying to maintain the level of excellency that the U.C. System has prided itself on in the face of these kinds of budget cuts. I don't think it can be done. And I certainly don't want to be associated with a university that is less than excellent," Gardner stated.

Gardner added that he will "gladly" resume his position as President of the University of Utah.

After Gardner's announcement, the presidential search committee reconvened for an emergency meeting. "We had to think quickly," Committee Chairman Dean Watkins said.

"We contacted the other candidates who had not been chosen, but they all declined the position," Watkins explained. He said that most of the candidates were embarrassed at not having been chosen the first time around and didn't want to chance another embarrassing loss.

"This is quite a predicament," UCSB Chancellor Robert Hootenholter said of the situation.

Upon hearing of the president's resignation, Associated Students leaders at UCSB called an immediate caucus. After eight hours of deliberation, they say they found someone who will take the job.

Manuel Collocuccci, a UCSB sanitorial engineer, has agreed to tackle what Gardner has called the "thankless" position of head of the University of California.

"I've worked hard all my life. This will be not different," Collocuccci stated.




"He's a humble man," John Feeny, Collocuccci's colleague, said. "But I've never known a man more competent and able to lead others. I think he'll be an excellent president."

A.S. President Jay Wisecrack said that he is "just thrilled" about Collocuccci's willingness to take a job that no one else wants.

"He's a heck of a guy. I have met him and I am very, very, very pleased to see that a minority has been placed in this influential position of power. I think it's just great," Wisecrack enthused.

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# Student Aliases Used To Cover Campus 'Commies'

Pentagon officials announced today that they have "definitive proof" that communist insurgents, masquerading as UCSB students, are operating out of camps in the Santa Ynez foothills with the intention of manipulating the nuclear freeze movement.

Pointing to a large map, Pentagon press agent "Red" S. Care identified the specific sites of the camps, which he said are the bases for "hundreds of sneaky commies."

Skeptical reporters who attended the outdoor briefing, demanded more substantial proof, and were shown one captured "insurgent." Photographs were prohibited during the briefing, but a UCSB TODAY staff artist was able to reproduce a likeness of the prisoner.

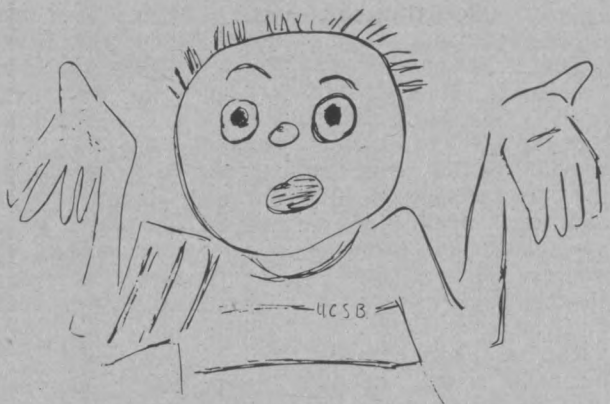
In response to the threat, President Reagan ordered the Pacific Fleet to move into the waters off the Santa Barbara coast.

Care would not reveal the administration's plans on dealing with the insurgents, but he chuckled and warned students that they should "watch out" for anti-espionage agents hidden in the bushes.

"Our agents have the most sophisticated training available," Care said. "They know how to make weapons out of everyday household objects, all of them can speak numerous languages, and they can peek around corners without being seen."

A.S. President Jay Wiseacre expressed doubt that the administration charges were true, but said he would demand that students be allowed to participate in the search program.

"This is simply another example of the callous disregard with which students, who are really the fundamental reason for the existence of the university system, are treated by the administration which displays a totally feudal attitude toward what should be, but all too often isn't, the rightful role of students and

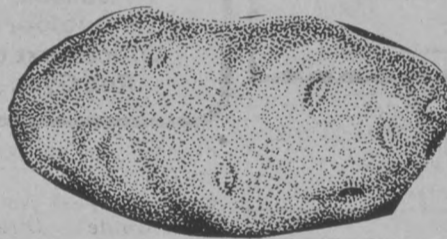

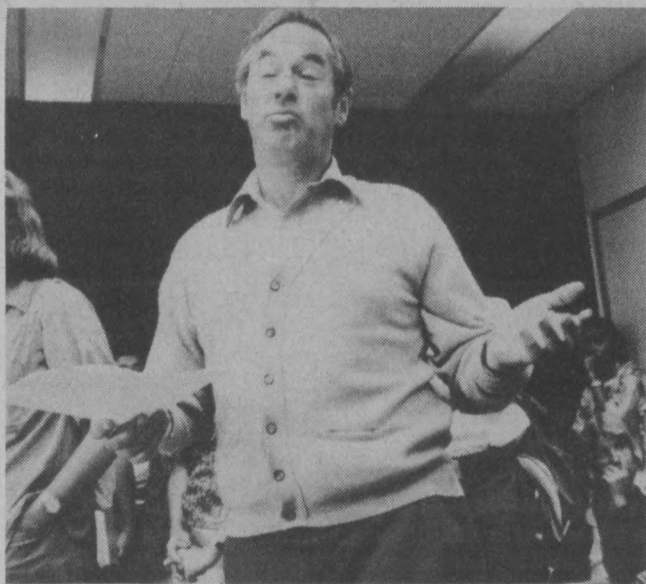

okay," Toodeigh pointed out. "But a bruised ego stays with you...and even builds the longer you have it."

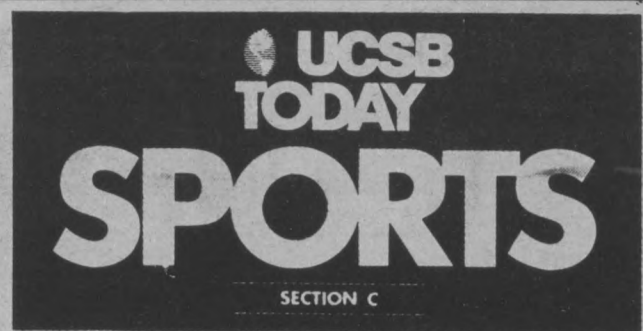

Allen was a pivotal point man in the UCSB second place finish last week against Fresno State, Boise State, Southern Oregon, and Cornell. The Kiwi placed second in the 400-meter hurdles, and ran on both of UCSB's scoring relay teams.

INS spokesman, A. Lee Lin, stated that Allen, a native of Waikamae, New Zealand, had been under investigation for over six months for illegal sale of vegemite sandwiches. By law, any resident foreigner convicted of a crime is subject to deportation. Reports show that Allen had been using untreated, inexpensive algae from the lagoon, not that of sanitized algae farms as stated in USDA bylaws.

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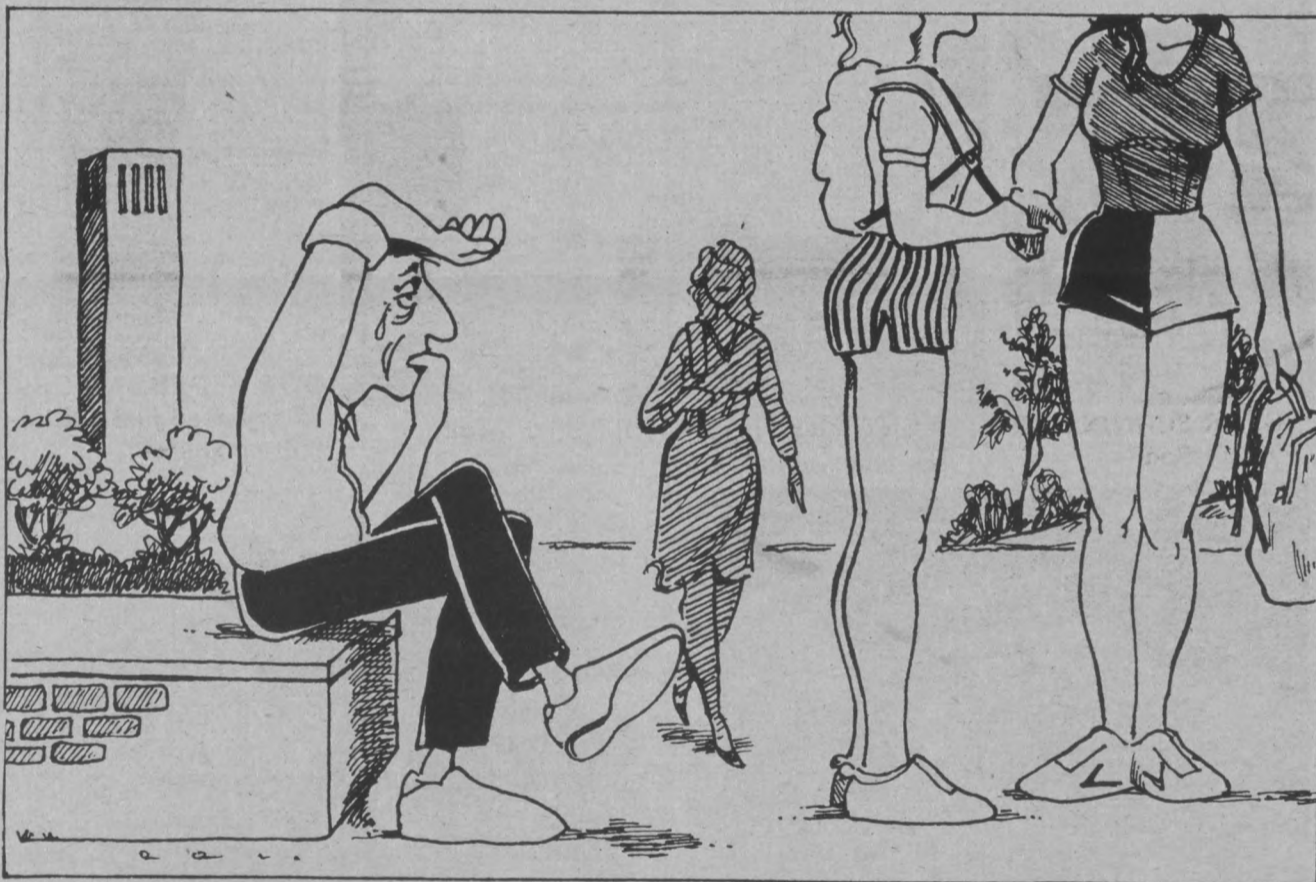

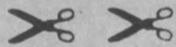
