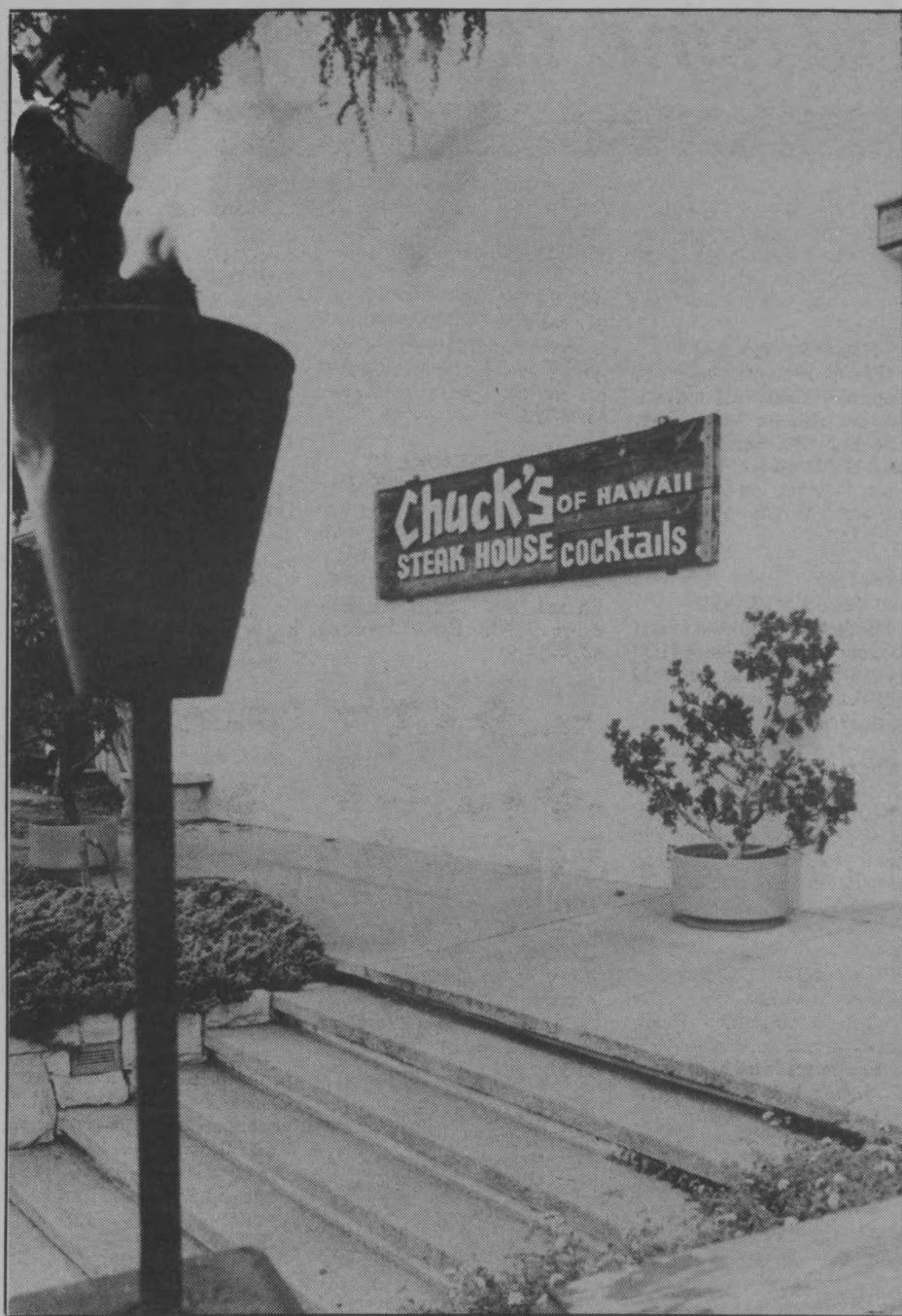
Chuck's, as astute readers of Weekend Connection will already know, is

Forty-five minutes later we all looked like Mr. Creosode. And yet the Dominator still remained. We were vanquished. But we were set for breakfast the next morning.



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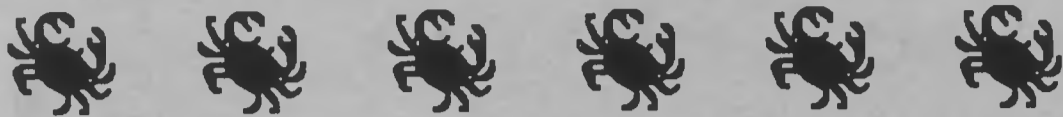
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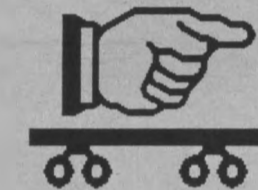


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Italian Food Done Right!

It was girls' night out and the three of us, Lizanga Taylor, Marsala Borghese and I were hungry, tired, ready for a little female bonding and looking for Italian food. Baltieri's restaurant seemed like the best bet, close by and specializing in pasta.

We took over a table in the corner. Our waiter showed up instantaneously. Three women and a plethora of menu choices — we knew it was going to take us a while to decide. So the waiter, wonderful guy that he was, brought up a basket of chewy sourdough and three diet sodas, one with lemon. The bread was devoured in under a minute and a half.

After deliberation — "I don't know, what do you want? — I don't know,

what do you want?" — we decided to split the chicken picatta, which came with a choice of pasta or vegetable side dishes. "Pick something else too," Marsala said. "Something with meat."

Cheese ravioli with meatballs seemed like the choice. When the waiter told us everything came with a salad, we were suddenly thrown into another frenzy of decision making. Two Caesars, and one plain with vinegar, no oil. The waiter faithfully recorded our order and was about to dash off to the kitchen when Marsala remembered something. "Oh, and by the way, more bread." He brought us two baskets this time, just in case.

I like Caesar salad. I mean, I really like Caesar salad, that rich, spicy dressing and just the faintest hint of anchovies.

When it's done bad, it's still pretty good, and when it's good, it's great, and I must say Baltieri's was in the second category. In fact, I ate Lizanga's too, even though she tried to fight me off with her fork using fencing moves.

The ravioli were huge squares of pasta filled with a blend of cheeses, in a sweet marinara sauce, and were accompanied on the plate by four enormous meatballs. The chicken picatta was three sizeable breast pieces, covered in a tangy lemon sauce and topped with capers, and came with a side dish of Fettuccini Alfredo, thick noodles in a heavy cream sauce.

We converged on the plate when the waiter laid it on the glass-top table. "Oh, by the way," Marsala said when he walked away. "Could we have some more bread?" She

dangled the empty basket above her head and smiled sweetly.

Marsala used the heel of the loaf to mop up the last bits of sauce. Suddenly, we realized there was one lone meatball in the middle of the platter. "You eat it. Go ahead. Really, I'm stuffed," Lizanga said, looking menacingly at me. I rolled the meatball to her in a gracious Lady and the Tramp sort of move. "No really, you eat it."

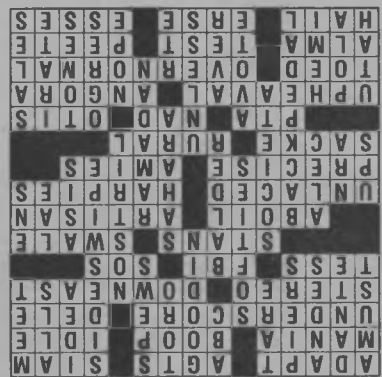

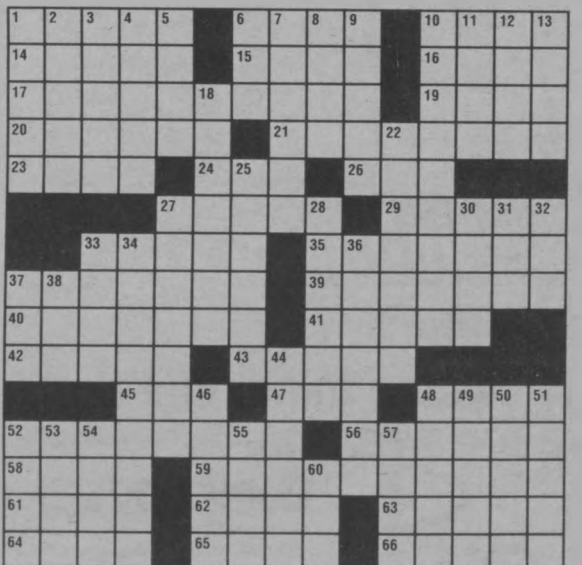

With a flick of the wrist, Reynard slipped in a few quarters and soon we were grooving to our own selections. Good stuff.

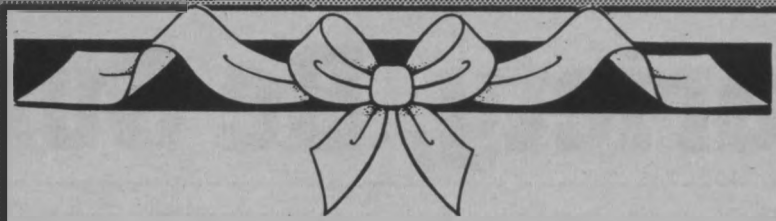
