IRISH WRITER TO LECTURE

Dr. Vivian H. S. Mercier, noted Irish scholar and writer, will give the second talk in the Summer University Lecture Series next Tuesday (July 5) at 3 p.m. in the Classroom Building Lecture Hall.

Dr. Mercier's subject will be "Romanticism and Revolution?"

Born in Dublin, Ireland, the visiting lecturer was educated at Trinity College there, receiving his Ph.D. in 1945. He has edited and contributed to a number of books and published numerous articles and reviews in professional journals in the U.S., Ireland, and England. Dr. Mercier holds the rank of Professor of English at the City College of New York. He is on the faculty at UC, Berkeley this summer. Tuesday's lecture is open to the public free of charge.
