Gauchos Still Green, Wildt to Cossacks in Season Opener, 42-10

In the late 1970s, the ever optimistic Ernie Banks was asked why he still had hope for his team after the Cubs lost 10 of their first 12 games.

His answer: "You have to back up before making a running start."

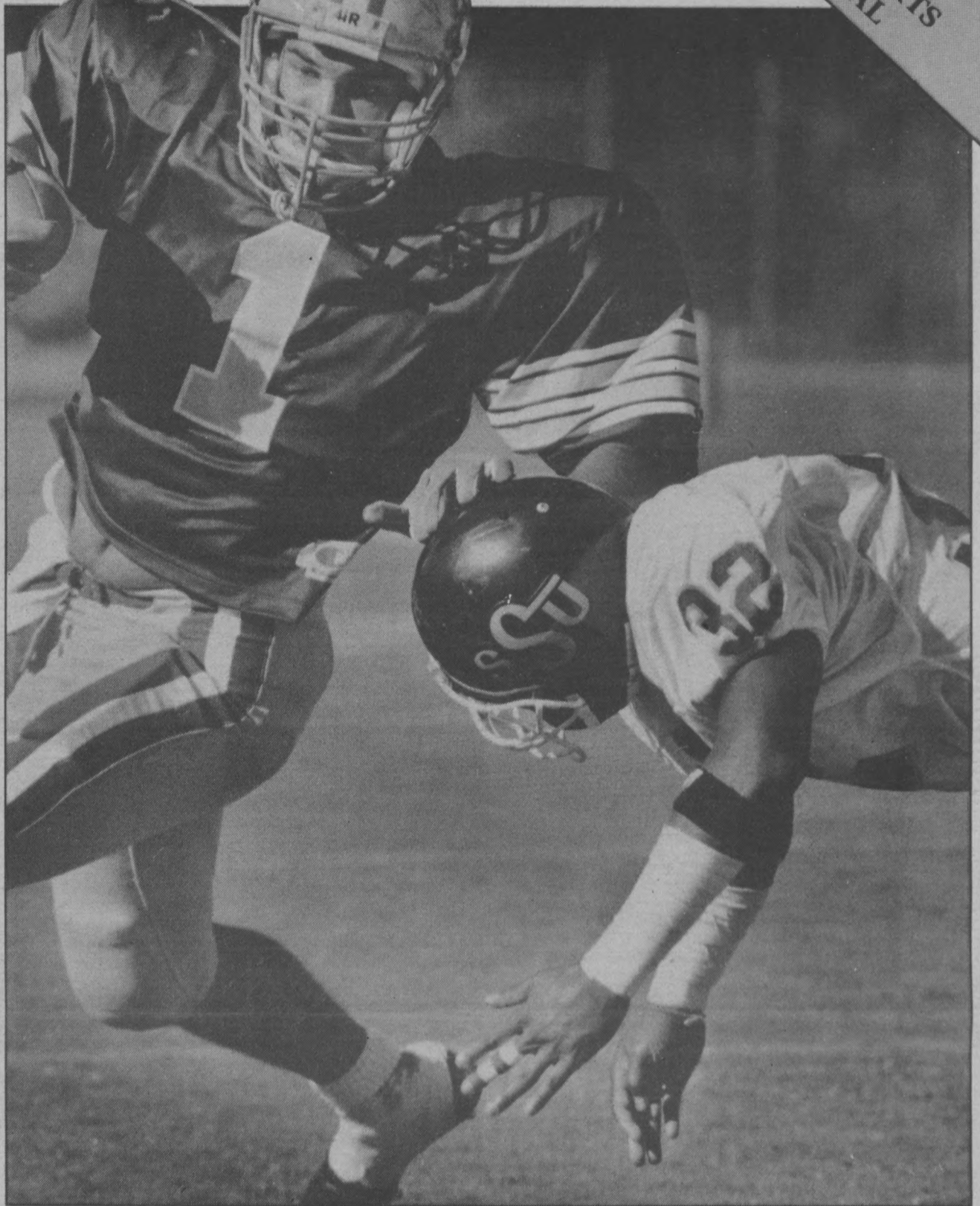
Much like last year, when it began the season with a 1-2 record, the UCSB football team backed into the 1990 season with a 42-10 loss to the Sonoma State Cossacks last Saturday at Harder Stadium. The season opening loss ranked as its worst defeat since the program was brought back in 1986.

"This feels a lot like the San Francisco game last year. We have to turn it around. It's like a 180 degree turn from top to bottom (from last year)," Gaucho wide receiver Brian Fleming said after the loss. "It seems (the youth of the team) could be part of it, but I'm not making any excuses. They were a good team, we just didn't execute and have our good stuff on every play. It's a new season with new players so we've just got to adjust."

The likenesses between Saturday's contest and last year's 32-14 loss to the Gators are notable. The Gauchos turned over the ball eight times in each game, with five coming on interceptions Saturday. In 1989, Santa Barbara let the Gators gain 453 total yards, while the Cossacks gained 315 to the Gauchos' 177 on Saturday. Finally, the Gauchos used three quarterbacks in '89, while Head Coach Rick Candaele called upon junior Rick Wildt and senior Mike Curtius against SSU.

"To be honest, with the young team that we have, I wasn't quite sure what to expect," Candaele said. "What it looked like when we started defensively was that we were playing eight new starters. We didn't play well defensively right at the start and offensively the big key was that they dominated the line of scrimmage. Then we

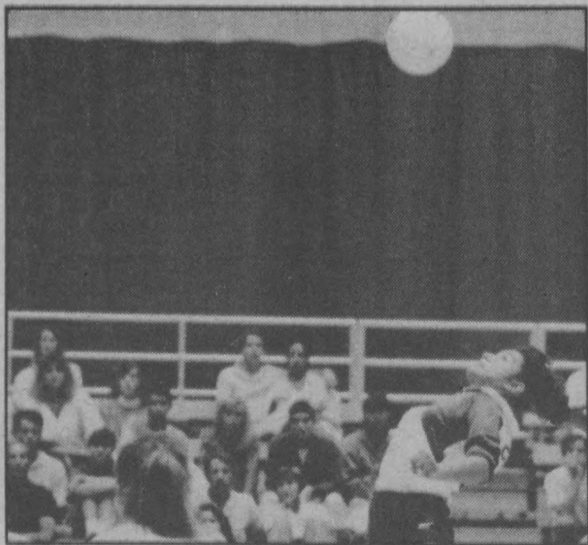

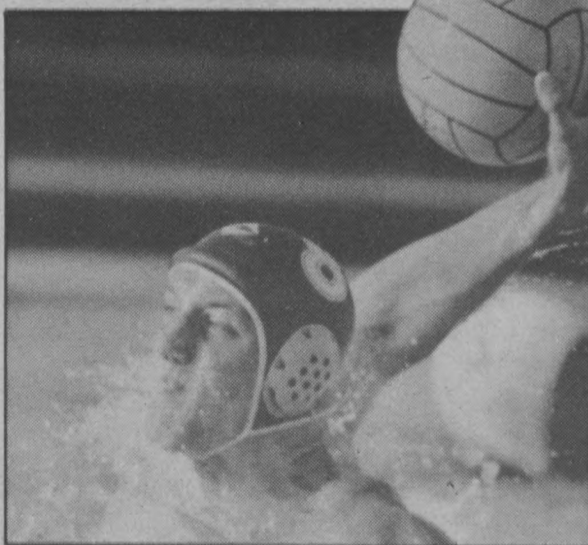

Playoffs: None. Although the Gauchos finished with a #10 ranking, it wasn't enough to gain a berth in the NCAA playoffs. UCSB plays in the rugged Big West Conference, where a plethora of top-ranked teams can be found. Thus, the Gauchos' 3-7 league record was good for only fourth in the conference standings and, in order to achieve a balanced field, the NCAA traditionally only selects the top two or three schools from the Big West in order to include more schools from the eastern part of the United States.

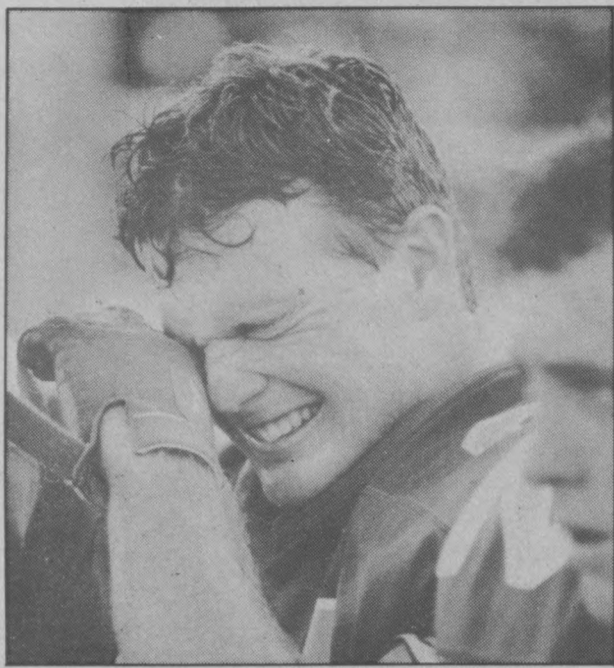

Gaucho Football Wins Div. II Status for 1991

UCSB football's drive to step up in division classification ended this summer when the NCAA announced the Gauchos will have Division II status in time for the 1991 season.

The announcement comes four years after the school's Division III gridders regained intercollegiate status in 1986 following a 15-year hiatus, and three years after the program began actively seeking Division II membership.

UCSB Athletic Director John Kasser said the automatic approval means UCSB will not have to petition the Division II convention in January for reclassification ef-

threw five turnovers for three touchdowns and you can't do that to sustain."

Of course there is a happy ending to the 1989 story, after losing to the Gators, Santa Barbara embarked on a seven game winning streak and ended the season with an 8-2 record. Is it possible again?

"We have to play better than that," Candaele added. "They were definitely more physical than we were. We just have to play with a little more effort and a little more precision."

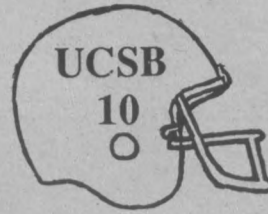
Youth and inexperience are most likely the team's worst enemies, as Candaele noted.

Missing offensively is quarterback Steve Armstrong, last season's leader of the Gaucho "air show" which was grounded last Saturday. Wildt (6-17, 41 yards, 3 int.), a junior-college transfer from Long Beach who redshirted last year, started the game and Curtius (10-22, 104 yards, 2 int.), who has seen playing time in each of the last two seasons, ended it.

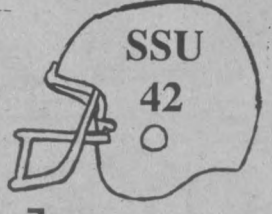
"I couldn't see that either quarterback stood out, to be honest," Candaele said. "I will have to look at the film to evaluate it, but it really doesn't appear that either was better than the other."

The two found preseason All Americans Johnny Ace and Fleming a total of just four times each — Ace for just 39 yards (one TD) and Fleming for 49.

In Candaele's eyes, however, the game was lost in the trenches. "Offensively it looked like they dominated

the line of scrimmage the whole game and we never could generate any running game. We turned the football over five times — three picks for three touchdowns," he said about his team which returned just two starters at offensive line this season, center Lance Comes and tackle Greg Hirschler.

"Defensively we put out as good a performance as I've seen," said Sonoma State Head Coach Tim Walsh, whose unit held the Gauchos to just 32 yards rushing. "It was an unbelievable performance. We've always had problems with Santa Barbara every

year we've played them and defensively we took them out of the game.

"We were (expecting a little bit more from UCSB), they've always given us a lot of problems. We were expecting it to be a real hard battle," he added.

Although Santa Barbara's defense was run over by the Cossacks early in the game — Glen Campbell scored on a 38-yard run and Shelton Troclair ran 10 yards for a TD in the first quarter — it solidified after that, allowing just one more offensive touchdown. However, it was still outshone as SSU returned three interceptions for TDs.

"We've just got to play better as a team, we have to condition a little bit harder and we've got to come on to the field more ready to play," Gaucho cornerback Kurt Bomke said after the loss. "Game-wise I don't think we were quite as intense and enthusiastic as we should have been and ready for this game, on the other hand we pretty much got out manned by the other team."

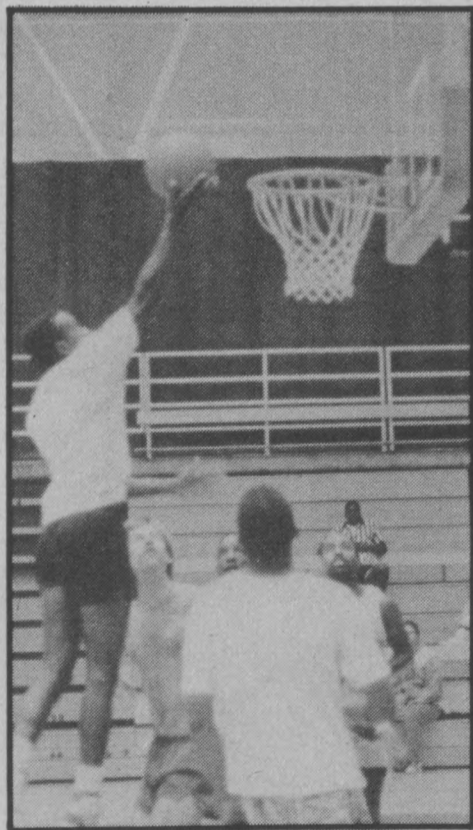

BRIAN FLEMING

Brian Fleming — Jr., WR, 1989 honorable mention All American, 1990 preseason second-team All American. After two seasons he is fourth on the UCSB all-time receiving list. Last season he led UCSB with 60 catches for 847 yards (seven TDs) — a school record. His best games came against St. Mary's, 137 yards on 10 catches, and Asuza Pacific, eight receptions for 141 yards. Caught at least one pass in 10 games last year. Against Sonoma St. he led UCSB with 39 yards on four catches.



JOHNNY ACE

Johnny Ace — Sr., WR, 1989 honorable mention All American, 1990 preseason All American. Last season he caught 43 passes for 665 yards (six TDs), averaging 16.5 yards a grab. He caught four passes for 39 yards (one TD) against Sonoma State last weekend. He had at least one catch in every game last season with his best performance coming against USD — eight catches for 144 yards. He is 15th on the UCSB all-time receiving list.



MARK HENIGAN

Mark Henigan — Sr., ILB, defensive captain. Candaele will look to him to provide leadership to the young defensive squad. He started all 10 games last season with 45 tackles, 15 of which were solo. He had six tackles against Sonoma St. last weekend. Henigan had a season high of eight tackles against San Francisco St. last year.

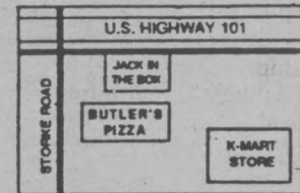

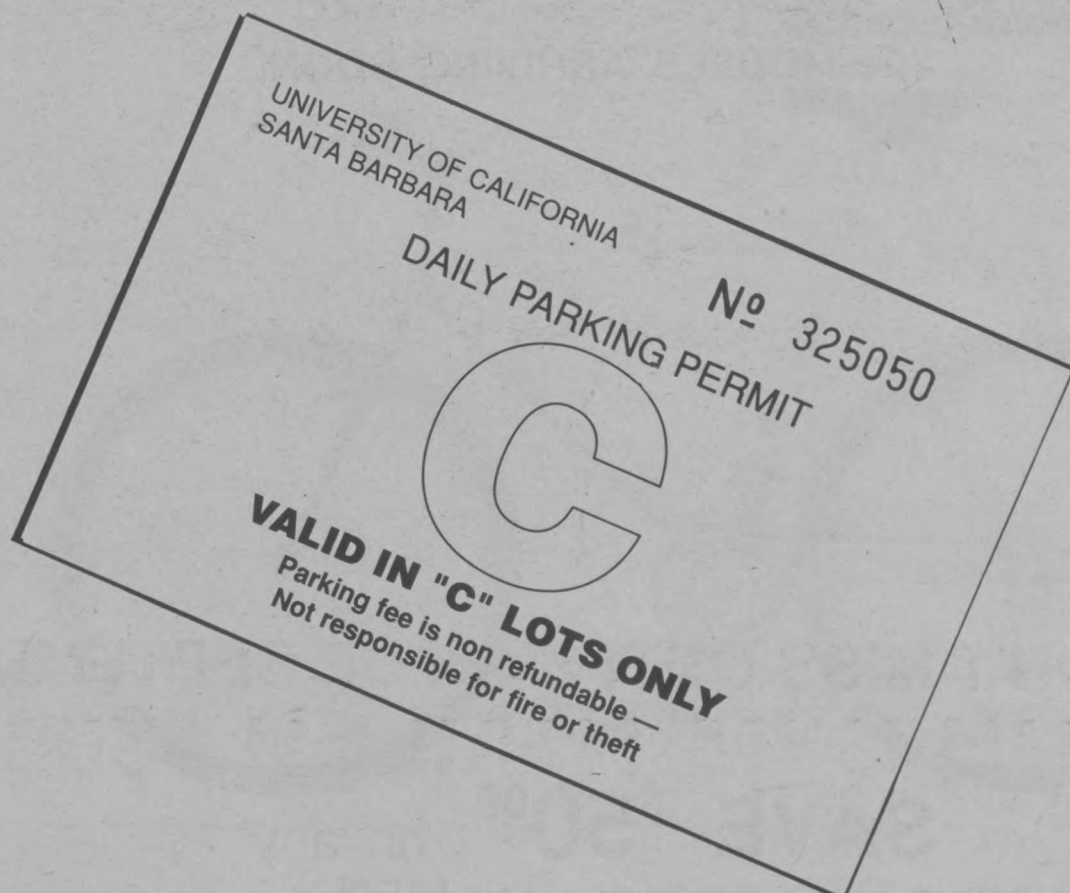

fective next year.

"I was surprised we got an automatic approval and I'm glad we don't have to go through the appeals process," Kasser said. "It's appropriate because we've been playing by Division II rules and that's the main issue."

NCAA rules state that teams seeking reclassification must be in compliance with the rules of the desired division for two years prior to the effective date of reclassification.

NCAA Membership Coordinator Shirley Whitacre said UCSB has certified its compliance with Division II rules last season, adding that the school plans to comply with the rules again

we have our sights set, as far as our program and our players, that we will be a Division II program, non-scholarship, and be the best in the country."

Kasser also noted a proposal being voted on at the NCAA's January convention which seeks to create a Division I-AAA classification. The proposal would give all Division I institutions Division I playing status, and the Triple-A category would consist of non-scholarship programs operating at the Division I institutions, which includes UCSB.

"Moving to Division II doesn't change much; we're still going to be non-scholarship," Kasser said. "We're not going to change what we're doing within the program."

Whitacre said if UCSB does not comply with all Division II rules this season, the NCAA would be forced to rescind the reclassification announcement.

"Division II has been our goal," Gaucho Head Coach Rick Candaele said, "and

UCSB continued to roll, grabbing a win at Loyola Marymount before winning the ASICS-Tiger Grand Prix in San Diego. In pool play, the Gauchos put up wins against Providence and USIU before losing their first match of the season to Pepperdine. However, UCSB came back to beat Arizona St. and host San Diego St. in the championship round to capture the tournament crown. 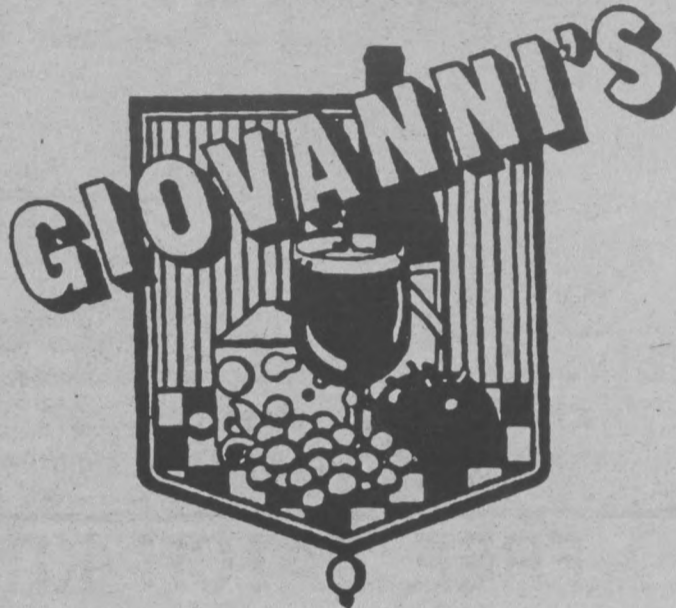

Maria Reyes — 1990 team captain and an All-American candidate. She holds the UCSB and Big West Conference records for most digs in a season (591, set last year). In 1989 she was an All-Big-West Second Team selection, First Team All-Northwest District. She was second on team in kills and service aces last year with 407 and 45, respectively. Gregory: "Maria is our best all-around player and our most competitive player. We need her to play within her limits and really be a leader on this team."



KRISTIE RYAN

Kristie Ryan — She posted a rookie record of 486 kills last year and led the team with 47 service aces. She was named to the Big West All-Freshman Team. The only question is the status of her injured right shoulder. Gregory: "Kristie is at about 85 percent right now. I don't think we would've beat San Diego or Arizona St. without her play. Even her at 90 percent is better than most everyone else, so I think that she'll be confident and have a good season."



MARITA BERNTSEN

Marita Berntsen — She is a transfer from Norway who has taken over the starting setter duties. She played five years for the Norwegian National Team. Gregory: "She's still adjusting to our system and has a lot of potential. Once she gets confident she can really help us."

Task Awaits Draeger

he had coached men's soccer since 1982. During that time he built a 101-36-21 overall record, reached the playoffs seven out of eight years and won three league championships.

"He was a well-respected coach and we were sorry to see him go," said DeAnza Physical Education Dean Tom Banks.

Prior to that, Draeger had been the head soccer coach at Saratoga High School since 1971. However, his route into the world of soccer was different than many coaches'. Unlike most of his counterparts, he had never played the game.

"The sport I really loved to coach at that time was basketball. I had been coaching basketball when the soccer thing came up," he remembered. "It was an afternoon sport, and I was getting home to be with my family. ... We had a little success the first year and I said 'Hey, this is great. It's afternoons, I don't

have to scout much and I'm having a P.E. period.' I just got involved with it and it went from there. It just took off."

To say it "took off" is being modest. In his 12 years as head coach there, his youngsters won 10 league championships, won their section eight of the 10 times, reached the final four six times and the finals twice, winning the state championship in 1982.

"I had a lot of help there. A lot of people in the youth groups did an awful lot of work," he said. "What we did was to keep the youth program just with Saratoga High School players. It was the community of Saratoga only. We didn't allow other people into it. It was ours.

"Our soccer players on the high school team played as many as 60, 70, 80 games a year," he added. "So when we got into season we were really ready."

Draeger's lack of playing experience doesn't faze him. "I think my backgrounds in the other sports, particularly basketball, helped me immensely in coaching, sometimes more than the 'pure soccer coach' who is a soccer player," he said. "I think my variety of athletics is a big plus over someone who has been brought up on soccer alone, because tactically I think I'm very sound, and I can adjust quickly to the game and get players doing things quickly and easily."

It's this cerebral aspect of the game that appeals to Draeger, and convinces him

Season highlights: The Gauchos won a record 12 straight games to open the season before falling to #1 ranked North Carolina, 1-0. They also beat UC Berkeley, 2-1, for the first time in school history.

Returns: F Maren Batchelor (sr.), FB Linda Dorn (jr.) FB Cari Goldy (jr.), MF Laurie Hill (jr.), F Trisha Kimball (jr.), MF Laurie Klein (sr.), FB Lara Nesbitt (sr.), MF Miriam Palma (sr.), GK Jan Ulrich (jr.).

Key Newcomers: FB Karen Eustaquio (jr.), F Phronsie Franco (fr.), GK-FB Amy Goodwin (fr.), MF Lelia Haber (fr.).

Bad sign: Senior midfielder Kiersten Taub, the fifth all-time leading scorer in UCSB history, tore the anterior cruciate ligament in her right knee in the defeat of UC Irvine and will be lost for the season. She will red shirt this season and return in 1991 for her last year of eligibility.

Youth Movement: With the loss of Taub, the Gauchos will carry only 14 players on their roster, and they will rely heavily on newcomers Franco and Goodwin — two of the top players in Southern California — to pick up the slack. Look for Goodwin — described by Bobak as a "skillful and talented young lady," — to see some time in the net this season to get some game experience.

More \$\$, more players: Despite being a top-10 team, recruiting is proving difficult, as evidenced by the small roster this season.

UCSB offers only three soccer scholarships, while competing against teams with 11. Despite this disadvantage, Bobak remains upbeat. "We are a team that is together on and off the field. We understand how to play together. We understand our style of play," he said. "These are strengths we have going for us. It's always good to have a cushion of depth on a team — when injuries come into the scene — but I don't have the depth there to cover it up. So everybody on the team has to make that super-extra effort that we've always done: to stay very united, very organized and very together on and off the field to over-

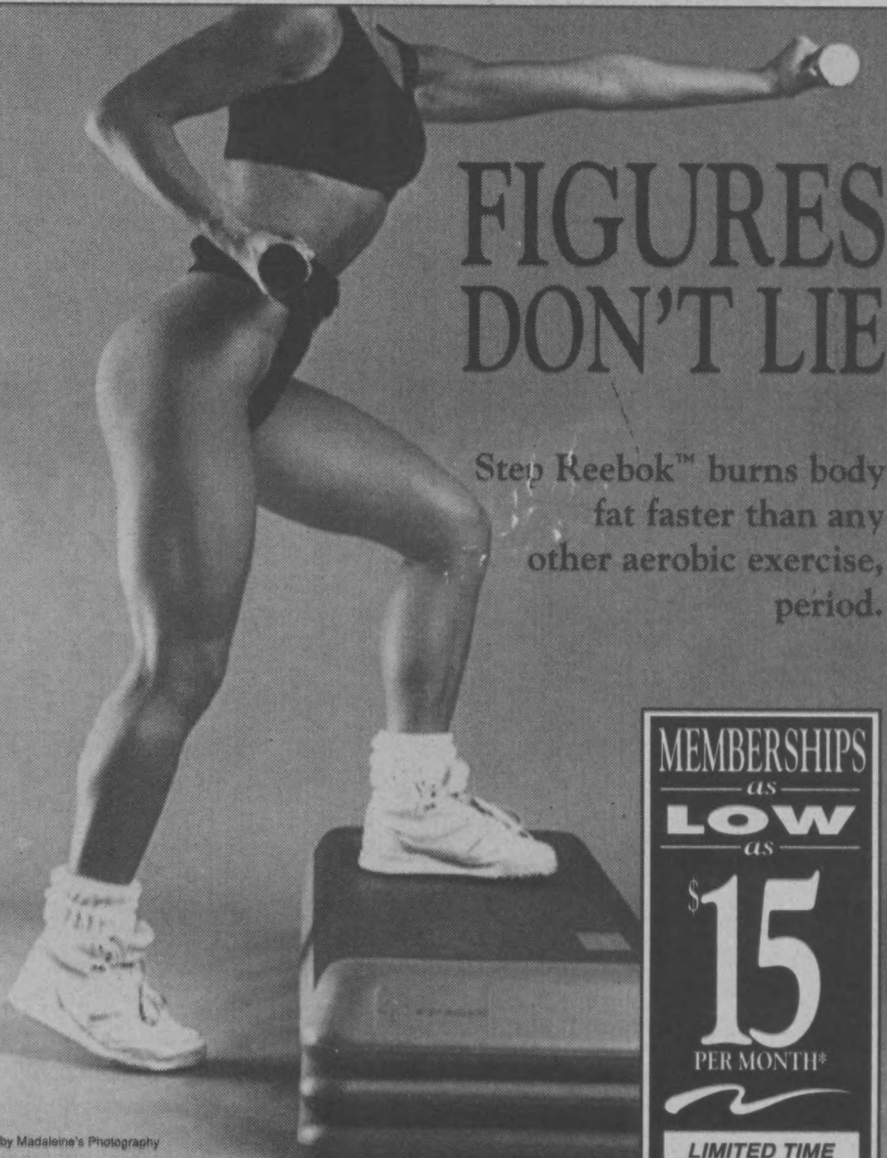

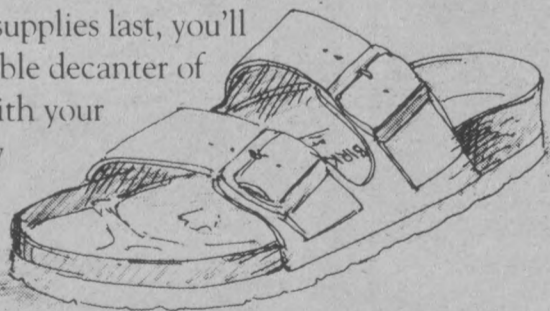

Key Newcomers: 2M Gunnar Gustafson (fr.); 2M Nikola Ivanovic (fr.); 2M Jean-Phillippe "J.P." Lalonde (jr.).

Strengths: "I think we have a lot of guys who can contribute offensively — we have relatively decent team speed," Snyder said. "I also think we have a pretty fair amount of experience."

Weaknesses: Snyder — "Defensively we have a tendency to lapse at times. We have to improve in that regard. We also have to be more consistent with our six on fives."

1990: UCSB has put


together a 2-1 record so far and is currently ranked eighth in the nation. The Gauchos opened against Cal State Los Angeles and trounced the Eagles, 16-2. At last weekend's Wasko Tournament in Pepperdine, Santa Barbara lost to UCLA before coming back to edge the sixth-ranked Waves in overtime, 11-10.

Coach's Comment: "We experimented with some different things this past weekend and now we're

past that point — we have to try and play on a consistent basis and try to score a high percentage of our six on fives. Every game counts on our overall record so we have to try to do well enough to win as many games as we possibly can. I'm certainly hoping that by next Thursday (the beginning of league play) we've gotten to the point where we're in high gear."

Coach: Pete Dolan, fourth year.
1989: Finished third in the Big West.
Season highlights: Placed second in Stanford open race. Finished third in the Big West Championship meet, the team's best finish since 1980. Finished a disappointing 11th out of 14 in the NCAA District 8 regionals.

Runners to watch:

Toby Freebourn (sr.) — Santa Barbara's #1 runner at this point in the season, he placed first in the race against Cal Poly SLO. He was the top UCSB finisher at the Big West Championships in 1989, finishing 13th. He placed fourth in the Big West 3,000-meter steeplechase with a 9:09 last spring. A multi-sport athlete in his youth, he chose cross country for the independence of the sport.

Tim Corbin (sr.) — Returning from a year of studies in Italy, he expects to battle Freebourn for the top spot, which he relinquished when he left the team to study abroad. In 1988, Corbin placed 12th at the conference meet.

Returns: Mike Brown, Jeff Buhl, Damian Capozzola, Bruce Carter and Brett Kohler.

Newcomers: Local product Paul Goodrich out of Dos Pueblos High School, Rene Rigal and transfer Brian MacMillian.

Season so far: The Gauchos only lost one of their top seven runners last year. The team defeated Cal Poly SLO on Sept. 7th, 25-34, at home. Freebourn placed first in 25:05.60, and Corbin's 25:19.10, was good for fourth. Mustang coach Tom Henderson noted UCSB, "ran a smart race." According to Freebourn, the Gauchos stayed smooth after Cal Poly exploded from the starting line. He added: "Our team's looking really good; we're just all tired right now because we just got back from a training camp. ... We're gonna be really good, I guarantee (it)."

Coach's Comments: Dolan is equally excited about the season after his team's first win, which he attributed

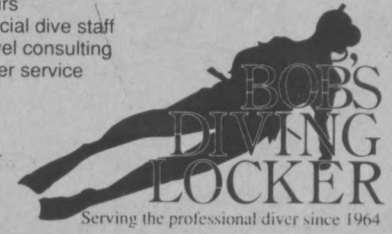

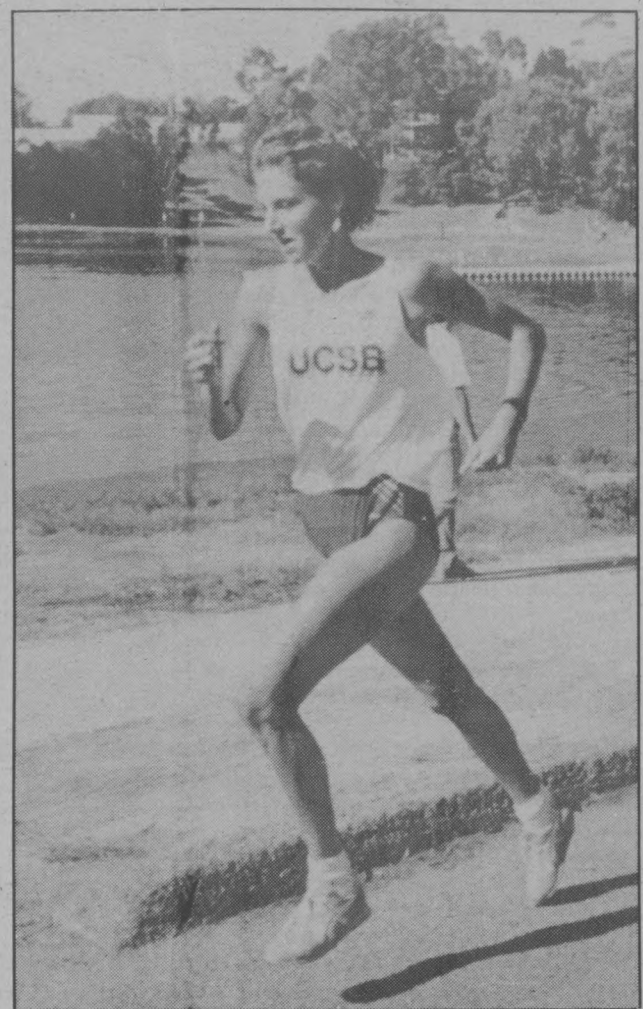

Coach: Jim Triplett, seventh year.
1989: Finished seventh in the Big West.
Season highlights: Placed fourth out of eight teams in the Fullerton Cross Country Invitational.
Runners to watch: Cathy Norbutas (sr.) — #1 runner for this season in only her second year in Gaucho cross country; also ran for the track and field team last year. Placed first at home against Pomona Pitzer, finishing in 18:30.90. A converted high jumper and heptathlete, she joined the cross country team on the recommendation of Triplett as a way to train for track and field.



Returnees: Karen Courter (sr.), the only other senior on the squad will be looked to for leadership along with juniors Julie Caufield and Jody Gannon. All additionally run for the track and field team.
Newcomers: If there was ever a youth movement of any sort for UCSB cross country, this is it. Six of the eleven runners are freshmen and coach Triplett views this both with optimism and excitement. "A new era has begun with the Gaucho women's program," Triplett said.

Gaucho senior Cathy Norbutas will provide leadership for the youthful UCSB women's cross country team this weekend against Westmont.

Leading the way for the freshmen is Julie Thomas of Newport Beach. According to Triplett she has good middle distance experience and is this year's top recruit. Del Mar's Lisa Daly is also highly regarded by Triplett. The converted tennis player is considered to have a natural talent for distance by her coach. Sophomore Allison Pontius, also from

the track and field team, joins the team for her first year of cross country after being culled by Triplett from his jogging & fitness class.
Coach's Comments: Triplett is aware of his squad's inexperience, but is not concerned by it. "This (season) is the coming together of a young team (that) has one common goal — which is to be the best runners they can be."

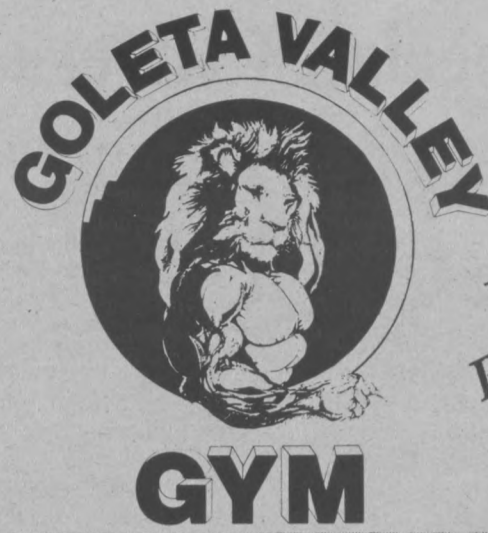

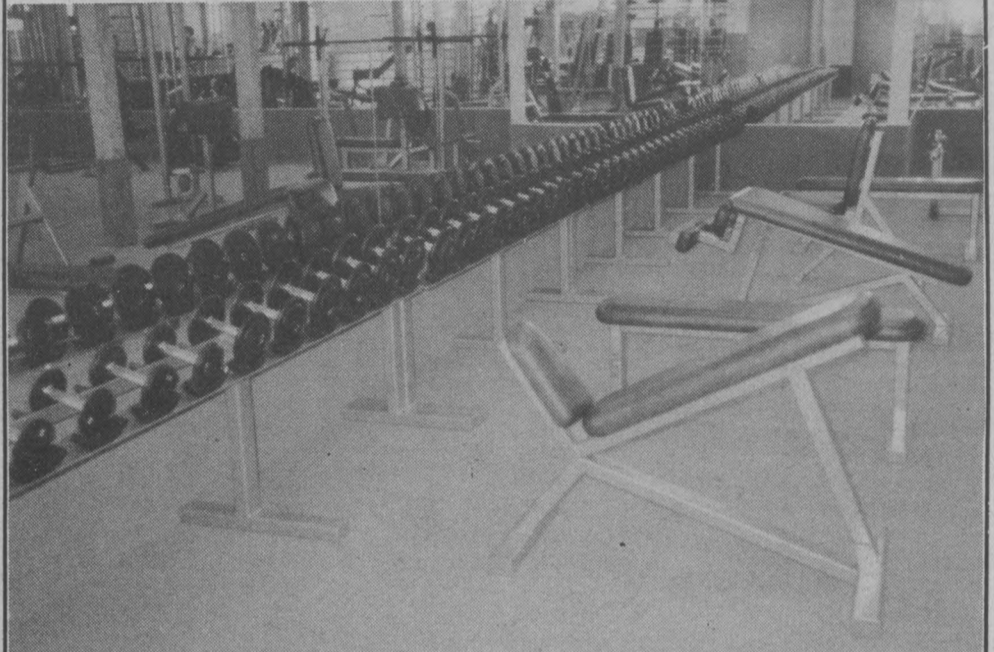

Rebuilding Specialist Rivera To Guide Women Gymnasts

Seeking to rebound from a dismal 1990 season which concluded in the resignation of Head Coach Liz Marino, last month UCSB hired Tim Rivera to take over the women's gymnastics program in 1991.

Rivera, 34, comes to Santa Barbara from Cal Poly SLO, where he had coached since 1983. During that time, he built the program up into one of the top Division II teams in the nation.

"Cal Poly was great, but after a while it was time to move on," Rivera said. "I'm excited about the move."

The Chico State graduate was chosen over three other coaches in the search to replace Marino, who left Santa Barbara to pursue other interests after compiling an 8-30 record over two seasons.

"We were looking to replace Marino with an experienced coach,"

him a natural for the job. He takes over a team which was troubled by injuries and an academic disqualification last season. It stumbled to a 1-20 record — the lone win coming, ironically, in a forfeit over Cal Poly when the Mustangs were unable to field a team due to injuries.

"Tim's reputation as a good coach in Northern and Southern California should help build a recruiting program," Kasser said. "His experience should also help improve the women we have."

The Gauchos have seven women returning to the team, lead by seniors Jessica Blagen and Jessica Stratton. They will be joined by five athletes transferring from Poly with Rivera. Junior Dawn Fowler, sophomore Stacey Peterson and Terry Mickels and two freshman recruits have been released from their obligation at Poly and will be eligible when the season begins in January.

UCSB Athletic Director John Kasser said. "Tim is a hard worker and fits in our program."

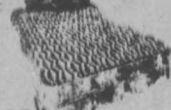
