The Brothers of Beta Theta Pi have endeavored into many charitable acts over the past few years. We pride ourselves on being one of the most active houses on campus when it comes to this area. Our biggest charitable contribution comes in the spring with the annual Beta Softball Tournament. This two day event, which is sponsored by the American Heart Society, incorporates the other Greeks on campus, along with chapters from other institutions. This event raised over \$2,000 last year, in our biggest production to date. The major programs of the Sorority are based upon the organization's Five Point Thrust: Economic Development, Educational Development, International Awareness and Involvement, Physical and Mental Health, Political Awareness and Involvement.

Zeta Phi Beta Sorority was founded January 16, 1920, on the campus of Howard University in Washington, D.C. by five astonishing women. These women dared to depart from the traditional coalitions for Black women and sought to establish a new organization predicated on the precepts of Scholarship, Service, Sisterhood, and Finer Womanhood.

The sorority was the first Greek-letter organization to charter a chapter in Africa (1948); to form adult and youth auxiliary groups, the Amicae, Archonettes, Amicettes, and Pearlettes; and to be constitutionally bound to a brother group, Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity, Incorporated.

The legacy of Zeta Phi Beta Sorority Inc., was brought to the campus of the University of California at Santa Barbara on May 22, 1999, by 11 illustrious women. The following women: Divita Wright II, Tedra Tanner, Courtney Burbridge, Ebbony Kee, Melody Ngaue, Shanieka Brown, Tawiah Burrows, Samantha Rainer, Samara Ashley, Eboni Bryant, and Crystal Polk continue to carry out the principles and programs that the five pearls established 80 years ago. There continues to be thousands of chapters located in nine regions throughout the U.S., as well as West Africa, West Germany, Bahamas Islands, Virgin Islands, South Korea and Italy.
