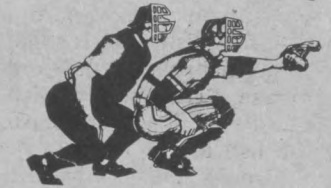

Kyoto: Sushi Like the Pros!

First of all, let me say that I am a sushi guy from here on in. It didn't use to be that way, of course, but that was before I tried Kyoto.

Kyoto, known to most Santa Barbarans as one of the hottest sushi venues in town, is serving it up raw and good six nights of the week at its nearby upper-State Street location. But I didn't know that. Until last week, I was aware of Kyoto only through their excellent word-of-mouth. I mean, what do I know from sushi? I had never tried it before, but my friends kept insisting that I mosey down to Kyoto and get schooled in the fundamentals.

I had my reasons not to try sushi. The most pervasive one was the childhood memory of my mother experimenting in the kitchen with her "Make Up a Little Sushi" sushi kit by Ronco. Somehow, my mom's sushi came out tasting like a mix between death and the Gorton's fisherman's old sweat socks. If this wasn't enough, there was also the fear of being one of those trendy sushi eaters that were so ubiquitous a few years ago.

Do you remember when sushi was starting to get really popular? It was certainly the hip thing to do, huh? Remember? They had sushi bars sprouting up everywhere. They had television comedies like "I Love Sushi" and "Greatest American Sushi" ... but I digress. What I mean to say is that when sushi was getting really popular, I held back and didn't try it, but just out of an urge to keep from being trendy. Now that sushi has achieved a good plateau of popularity, I figured that the time was right to get out

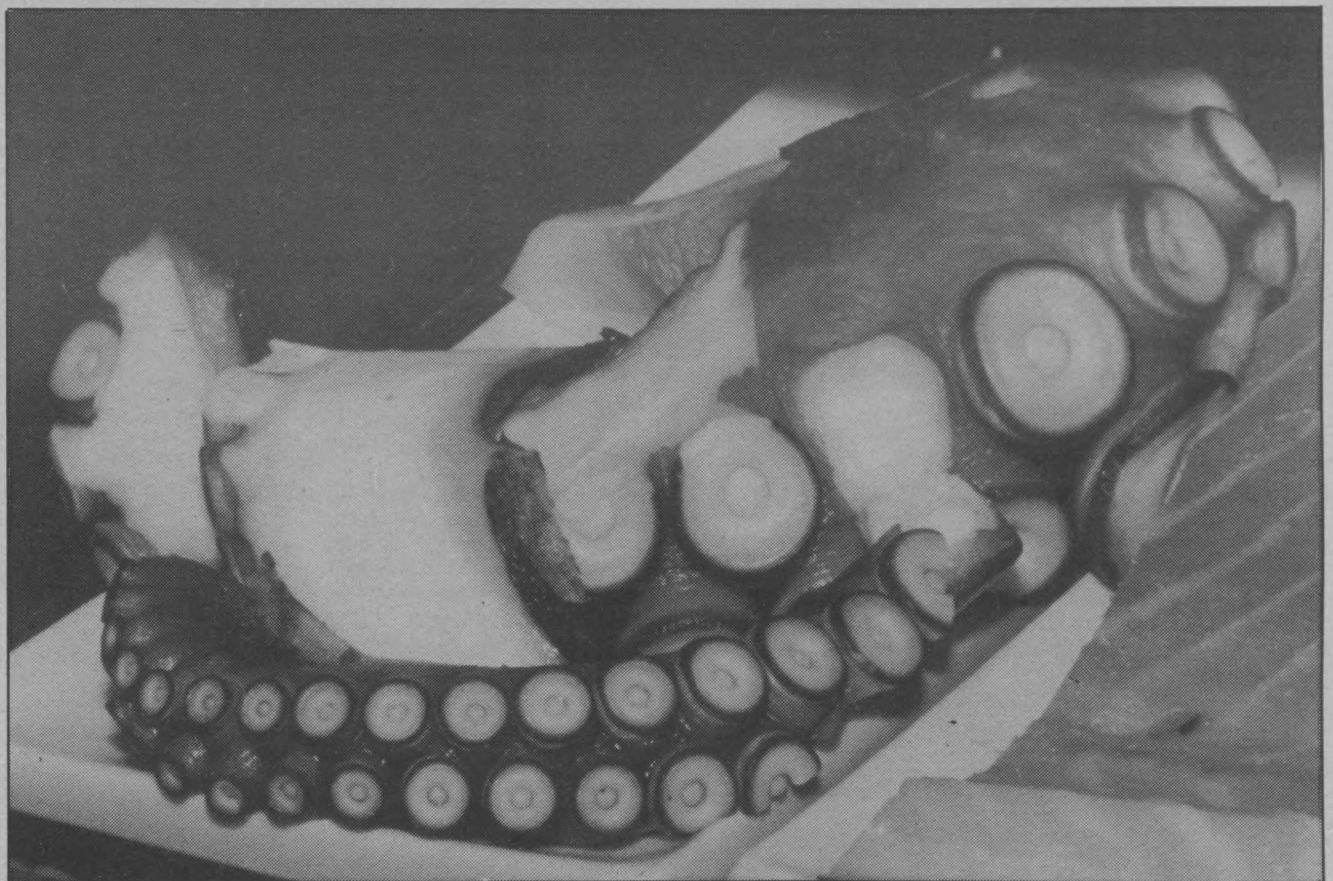
there and start eating some of that raw fish.

It's true, sushi has reached a healthy level of popularity and proved not to be a flash in the pan. And since sushi is uncooked, it has proved not to be a *flesh* in the pan, either! Indeed!

When my friend, Groovy, decided to take me to sushi, she wasn't kidding. She, a sushi aficionado, told me that Kyoto was the rockin'-est sushi place in town, so we headed down Hollister onto State and into the Kyoto parking lot. Once inside the handsome restaurant, we were seated and given ice water and some nice green tea. That really *wet* our appetite!

We took a good look at their triple-fold menu and our cumulative mouths dropped instinctively. There was so much to choose from, we didn't know if we were in a restaurant or if we had just joined the Columbia House Record Club! They had Chirashi Sushi and Kabuki Sushi and Temaki Sushi and Itasan Sushi. They had tempura and chicken and beef and pork on noodles on rice on whatever. And fish, fish, fish, fish. It's like they disproved that old phrase, "There's other fish in the sea." It's not true! All the fish are at Kyoto!

Groovy had less trouble ordering than I had, being that I had never been to a sushi place before. She opted for the combination plate which came with everything imaginable. Yes, it even comes with the kitchen sink. (That is, if you can't pay the bill and have to wash some dishes!) After much deliberation, we decided to split her combination plate with my Chicken Ju, which is some tender yummy chicken on noodles with vegetables.

We ordered and sat sipping tea and exchanging pleasantries. Not long after, delicious soup, some cucumber-vinegar-sesame deal and some weird melon-tasting cabbage was delivered to us. We ate our first courses slowly, enjoying the exotic, warming flavors of the Eastern food.

Then they brought out the big guns.

Groovy's came on a boat, this big wooden eating-tray boat thing with seven different kinds of Nigiri sushi, California Rolls and Tuna Rolls. Hello! Groovy, I'd like you to meet a boat of sushi!

Mine was equally impressive, although it was served on a platter whose sea-worthiness was ques-

tionable. There were noodles and piles of chicken. There were onions and carrots and mushrooms. It was good.

We played around, trying this and that from her boat and tasting the nubbins of chicken from my plate, for more than an hour. Try as we might, we were unable to finish either of the massive entrees, and we took a seri-

ous amount of leftovers home with us.

One of the greatest things about Kyoto is the natural aspect of the food. Everything was so fresh. Even the menu exudes healthy; it says "Anyone caught smoking on the premises will be hung by the toenails and pummelled into unconsciousness with an organic

carrot." Indeed!

Suffice it to say that if you go to Kyoto, the only MSG in the place will be me. Just call me Mr. Sushi Guy from now on.

By now it should be simple. If you want rock music, you listen to the Stones. If you want ice cream, you get Haagen-Dazs. If you want to watch a movie, you watch "The Godfather." If you want to fall asleep, you watch "The Rick Dees Show." And if you want Italian food, you get on up and get on down to Baltieri's.

Everything in life should be so simple.

Baltieri's, effectively putting all the other Italian eateries on Hollister's restaurant row to culinary shame, gives you what you want in Italian food. Pure and simple.

This means lasagne, this

means linguini, this means spaghetti, this means ravioli, this means pesto, this means ceasar salad. This means Italian food that you have dreams about (you know who you are!). This means Italian food like your mamma would have made ... but only if your mamma had worked at Baltieri's!

From the minute you walk in, you know it's a classy joint. Not swank, to be sure, but nice. Nice like you don't normally find in Goleta, to say nothing of Isla Vista. They seat you and then they set you up with some nice wine or water or whatever kind of drink you will be drinking. Then the fresh bread. This bread is so fresh, many female patrons will be tempted to slap it right in its crusty face. But don't! If you did, you would miss out on the warm,

steamy-buttery taste that gives meaning to the phrase, "lovin' from the oven." And the pats of butter are even at room temperature, which is a sign of a restaurant that knows what it's doing. Still, the bread and butter, rather than sating your appetite, only gets you rolling on towards the truly satiating entrees.

And do they have choice. If it were a Chinese restaurant, they would have to call it "Choy's." Get it?

It's just about the perfect place for a UCSB student to take a date. It's out of Isla Vista, it has a romantic atmosphere, it has astounding food and it has a lot of good wine. For the kind of atmosphere, food and service that they have at Baltieri's, they carry an extremely moderate price tag.

Baltieri's has all the

classic Italian dishes plus a few specialties that will turn your mouth into one giant taste bud. Their marinara sauce is tangy and smart, with just enough thickness to make it cling to each noodle. As our waitress told us, their sauces are "herby," which I guess was her way of saying "yummy." Their sausage is meaty — not fatty — and seasoned just right to give a normal pasta dish that extra push over the cliff.

So when the massive raviolis and forkfulls of spun spaghetti come invading your dreams at night, do yourself a favor and get busy with Baltieri's.

And as if depositing a crown at the feet of a king, he brought them to our table, removed our empty basket, spun and headed back toward the kitchen. He said not a word.

"Yep, this place is for real," my companion said, demonstrably relieved.

"Dang," I answered with similar gratitude.

Thus my companion and I came to believe in Pepe's Mexican Restaurant. It couldn't have happened at a better time. We had traveled to Pepe's seeking a momentary shelter from winter's bitter, uncompromising snarls; and, like an emergency \$25 from Mom, Pepe's offered us the redemption we so hardily sought — a chance, finally, to surrender our demons and feast on some highly delectable Mexican food at the same time. We were there for more than two hours.

Outfitted with classic brick porticoes and studded with authentic wrought-iron accessories — doork-

nobs, lanterns, mirror frames — Pepe's offers a classic Mexican-restaurant ambience, replete with an expansive, suitably dimmed dining area, old-style bar, wooden chairs, colorful tile and numerous paintings of men in sombreros fighting roosters. There is no pretension in Pepe's art — only a firm sincerity. Pepe's doesn't want to overpower you, it just wants to get you in the right mood.

Our moods were quite enhanced when, early on, a problem arose with the margaritas. My companion had ordered a fruity one, containing bananas and such, but our waitress soon returned with a glum look: They had just run out of the necessary fruits. Momentarily knocked off balance, we stuttered around in indecision for awhile, until the friendly barkeep unexpectedly arrived at our table. With commendable *elan* and composure he described the quandary, offered substitute courses of action, and headed back to the bar to deliver our pleasure. Within minutes we were sipping away on salt-flecked ice-domes of cool delight.

"Good. Very good," cooed my companion in response to her Pepe Cuervo Margarita on the rocks. She has long experience in Mexican restaurants. "You can taste the tequila — that's the advantage of having it on the rocks, you can taste the tequila."

"Right," I agreed. Other things stood out as well: the homemade, moderately salted chips, the Aztec sun-calendar on the wall, the kitchen's thatch palm roof, the wooden caps on the imported Cholula hot sauce, the drippy, lip-smacking cheese covering every inch of our burritos.

Foodwise, Pepe's was

hard to beat — its menu is loaded with a smashing variety of beef, chicken and pescado dishes, and I had no doubt that there was something for even the most finicky of Mexican-platter connoisseurs. Me and my companion, well, Pepe's food engineers served us generous portions of burrito and tostada treats — into which we murderously ripped, thoughtlessly shoveling pile after mound of Mexican heaven into our mouths. The spicing was at a near-perfect spice-to-non-spice ratio, and when my companion asked our waitress to deliver a side platter of lettuce — lettuce, mind you — it arrived nicely crisped and ready for submersion in Pepe's robust collection of cheeses and sauces. We couldn't have asked for a more satisfying food operation.

Except for maybe one thing. My companion really dug that imported Cholula hot sauce. Thank God our bottle wasn't near empty.

"This great!" she exclaimed, slathering her dish with more of the stimulating red sauce. Her hands writhed with energy.

Thanks, Pepe's.

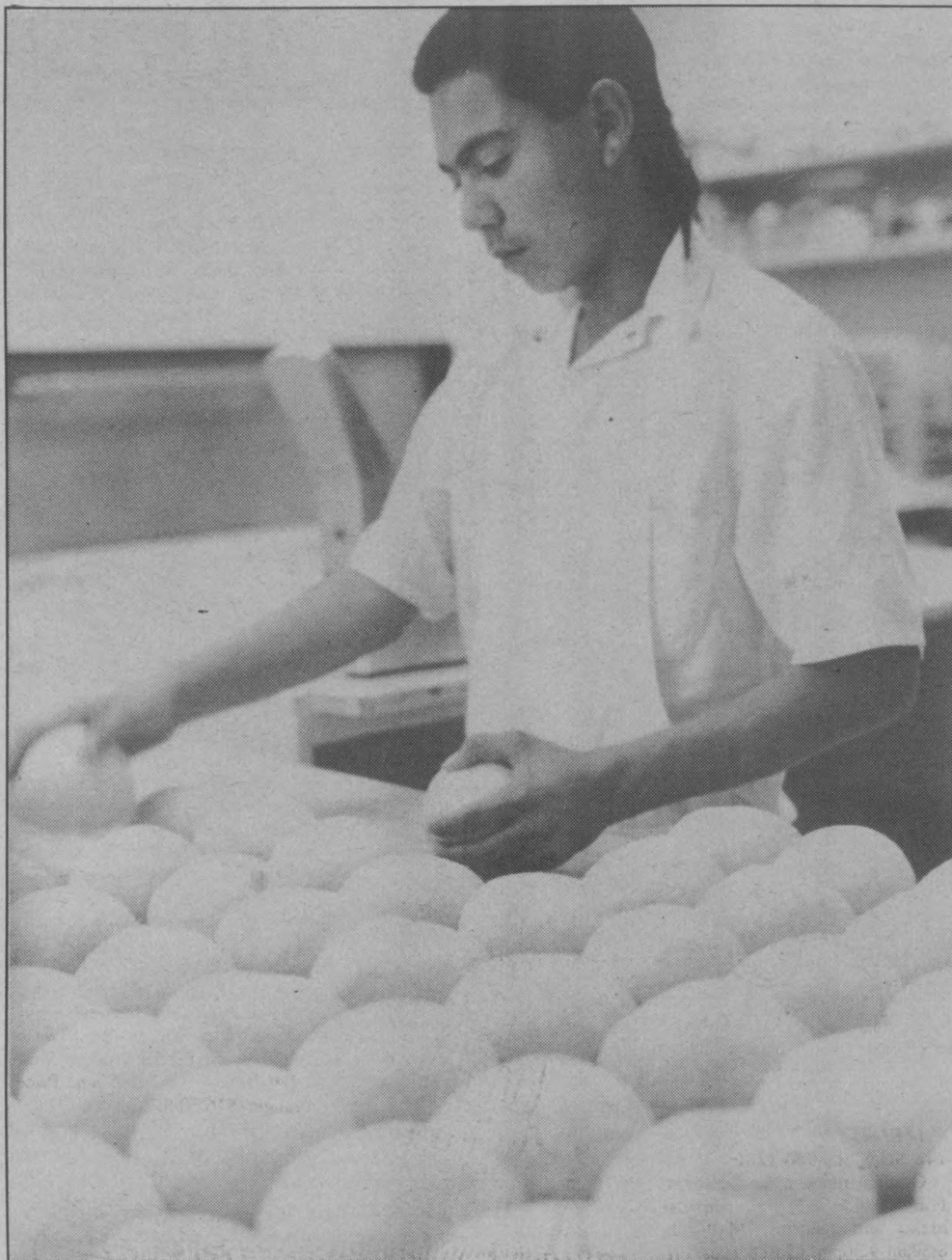
So I attempted to focus my eyes and order something out of the colorful selection. Sombreros — a
