Gauchos Hope to **Double Their Fun**

Goldberger, Peterson Go to NCAAs

To put it mildly, the UCSB's women's tennis team had an extraordinary season. Now, after defending its Big West title, earning the Big West Player and Coach of the Year honors and having a few weeks to bask in their exploits, two Lady Gauchos are ready to confront one more challenge; the NCAA Championships.

Santa Barbara's #1 doubles team of senior co-Captain and Big West Player of the Year Debbie Goldberger and freshman phenom Kathy Peterson received a berth to the NCAA playoffs, which begin today at Stanford. The UCSB duo has played exceptionally well all season, garnishing a 12-3 overall record that resulted in the #23 ranking at the end of the season. At one point they were as high as #18.

"We were kind of thrown together at the beginning of the season, but we played well," Goldberger said of her pairing with Peterson. "I'm pretty excited about the coming week ... we have had the chance to concentrate on our game lately to a degree that wasn't possible during the busy

The doubles tournament consists of the top 32 teams in the nation, based on season record. This season Goldberger and Peterson defeated the #9 ranked team from Pepper-

dine, and their only losses came to teams in the top 20.

"They can play with any team in the tournament," Head
Coach Chris Russell said. "It will be the little things that make the difference.

"This is good experience for Kathy," Russell added. "Debbie has been there three times before and hopefully Kathy can now bring this experience back to benefit the team next year as Debbie has done."

Russell also indicated that similarities between Goldberger and Peterson have made the pair so competitive.

"Kathy has a lot of parallels with Debbie," he said. "Debbie came in as a freshman and began playing #1 doubles as well. They have had time to fine tune and have been working hard at doing everything possible to become a better doubles team. Communication is a major factor. It's going to come down to not making mental mistakes, because

This weekend's Late Afternoon Decathlon went off without a hitch, and in doing so, brought to a successful conclusion the year of competition at UCSB's Pauley Track.

"It was a good decath-lon," said a satisfied Sam Adams, the outgoing men's track and field coach who organized the event.

Of the 15 competitors, two gained provisional entries into the NCAA Championships, while another virtually assured himself a spot on his country's Olympic team try's Olympic team.

Winning the Decathlon was Dave Mesgoy, a compe-titor from UCSB Outreach, who finished with 7,659 points. Mesgoy, who was in fourth after the first day of competition, was a provisional qualifier for the Olympic Trials prior to the competition and now has nearly solidified his chances of appearing in the late June





Junior right-hander Travis Rodgers, top, threw an early season shutout, but couldn't hold on to his spot in the rotation. Fortunately, relief for Head Coach Al Ferrer was on the way in the form of a trio of young hurlers, righthanders Steve Lane and Armando Delsi, and lefthander Mike Wolger, above left. Wolger also did it with the bat, hitting .304 on the season. Junior shortstop Danny Lane, above right, was also an offensive threat, hitting



.366 with eight home runs, and is the UCSB player most likely to be taken in the upcoming Major League Draft. His double-play partner, senior David Waco, hit a career best .353 and exhibited one of the best pair of hands in the Big West, if not the nation. Senior Jeff Antoon, bottom, who saw time at five different positions this season, battled back from a slump to hit .322 with seven home runs. Antoon, who owns the Santa Barbara record for career homers with 37, doubles with 67 and RBI with 203, also has a shot at a professional career.
