## ACADEMIC FREEDOM

This committee is to study and report to the Faculty Legislature concerning any condidtions which may affect the academic freedom of the University, especially with regard to acceptance of university appointments, resignations from such appointments, and to the reputation of the university and individual members of its faculty ADMISSIONS AND ENROLLMENT

This select committee's purpose is to consider and report to the Faculty Legislature and to the Chancellor on matters involving admissions, enrollment and redirection at Santa Barbara. AFFIRMATIVE ACTION

This group will study and report to the Faculty Legislature on all matters o affirmative action including (a) academic personnel and policies affecting women and ethnic minorities; (b) access of women and ethnic minorities to graduate and undergraduate programs in all academic areas; (c) seeking information and making recommendations regarding actions necessary to remove and correct inequities of opportunity. AMERICAN HISTORY AND INSTITUTIONS

This committee shall formulate policies for the administration of the Senate Regulations regarding American History and Institutions, and to review the application of these policies.
ARCHITECTURE, PLANNING AND

## ENVIRONMENT

This committee will consult with the administration to select profes sional architects, planners, and landscape architects. They will also work with the administration and planners in setting and reviewing campus planning goals and implementation. They will also have the job of consulting with facilities $m$
management respecting maintenance and alterations of campus facilities, including landscaping
ATHLETIC POLICY
These people will determine eligibility for intercollegiate competition. They will also review and report matters involving intercollegiate competition to the Legislature and the Chancellor.
COMPUTING, INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY AND
TELECOMMUNICATIONS
The goal of this committee will be to represent the Division and its faculties on all matters affecting academic instruction and research policy involving the use of computers, information technology and telecommunications. Also to advise the Chancellor and/or designees on all matters concerning this technology. EDUCATION ABROAD PROGRAM

This committee represents the Santa Barbara Division in all matters concerned with the EAP. EDUCATIONAL POLICY AND ACADEMIC PLANNING

This committee is concerned with formulating and recommending educational policy as its primary responsibility in all matters of Divisiona concern. They establish, from within its membership, a Planning and Resources Subcommittee who will be responsible for several things. Among them, to formulate for adoption by the whole committee on behalf of the Santa Barbara Division reccommendations to the Chancellor
regarding the long range educationa plan of the campus and the university. EFFECTIVE TEACHING AND INSTRUCTIONAL SUPPORT

To promote good teaching, to propose programs that will foster it, and o develop crteria for its evaluation. To ormulate and recommend to the Chancellor general policies concerning instructional support activities of the Santa Barbara campus; to advise the Chancellor and the Dean of Instructional Development. EXTENDED LEARNING

To advise the Chancellor on any matters concern ing the functions and the educational and related budgetary and personnel policies of University extension and Off Campus Studies. To advise appropriate officers with respect to (a) University Extension courses yielding credit, (b) admission requirements for such courses, (c) establishment and discontinuance of Extension programs, and (d) criteria for appointment and retention of Extension teaching staff within the jurisdiction of the Santa Barfbara Division
FACULTY WELFARE
This committee advises the Faculty Legislature on matters concerned with the economic welfare of the faculty, such as salaries, benefits, insurance, retirement, housing and other matters that affect the conditions of employment.
GENERAL EDUCATION
To study every aspect of the general education program at Santa Barbara, make comparisons with similar programs in other instututions, consider recommendations from members and committees of the Division, and in general seek to provide a common cultural experience for all students. To determine standards governing the general education requirements for the degree of Bachelor o Arts and Bachelor of Science, subject to ratification by the faculty Legislature GRADUATE COUNCIL

To make recommendations to the Universitywide Coordinating Committee on Graduate Affairs concer ing new programs for existing higher degrees To establish policies, consistent with To establish policies, consic regarding: (a) admission to candidacy for higher degrees; (b) limitation of graduate study lists; (c) appointment o committtees in charge of candidates' studies and research (d) supervision of examinations for higher degrees, supervises all graduate courses o instruction in the Santa Barbara Division.

LIBRARY
To advise the Chancellor regarding the adequacy and growth of the Library at Santa Barbara. STUDENT AFFAIRS

To meet regularly with the Vice Chancellor for Student Affairs and to consult with him on matters affecting the relationship between the administration of student affairs and the academic mission and goals of the University.
UNDERGRADUATE COURSES
To exercise plenary powers regarding the authorization, discontinu ance, supervision and final approval of undergraduate courses, including the power to determine the appropriateness of the assignment of an instructo to a specific course

UNDERGRADUATE PREPARATORY AND REMEDIAL EDUCATION

To monitor and conduct periodic reviews of preparatory and remedial education; to supervise the administration of the examination in Subject A and the course in Subject A to supervise the use of placement examinations in mathematics.

ADMISSIONS COMMITTEE: Recom-
mends on admission policies and guidelines. (2 undergrads needed)

ARTS AND LECTURES COMMITTEE: Works with Arts and Lectures on the development of Arts and Lectures programs. Only one undergraduate student is needed.

BIOSAFTEY COMMITTEE: Assists the Environmental Health and Saftey Commission in developing guidelines for sate use of biohazards. (1 student needed)

CAMPUS ACTIVITIES CENTER ADVI SORY COMMITTEE: A forum for discussing and making recommendations about the services provided by the Activities Planning Center. (4) (one from A.S. , one from R.H.A., one from fraternity/sorority group, and one from a cultural organization.

## COMPREHENSIVE CHILDCARE

 ADVISORY COMMITTEE: This committee studies childcare issues and develops recommendations for addressing the childcare needs of the campus community. Two undergradu ate students. (One student parent.)COUNSELING AND CAREER SERVICES ADVISORY COMMITTEE. Provides advice on policies and programs pertaining to Counseling and Career Services. We need three undergratuate students for this one.

DIVING CONTROL BOARD: Establishes and/or recommends diver training programs. Recommends changes in policy. It also recommends or approves locations, new equipment or techniques. One student is needed (University certified diver).

FINANCIAL AID ADVISORY COMMITTEE: Advises and recommends to the Director and staff of the Office of Financial Aid. (4)

HUMAN SUBJECTS COMMITTEE: Establishes and administers policy on the protection of human subjects. (1 undergrad)

INTERCOLLEGIATE ATHLETICS POLICY BOARD: Provides advice on policies and procedures (excluding eligibility) pertaining to intercollegiate athletics programs and club sports. Two undergraduates, one junior or younger, and one senior are needed. WOMEN'S CENTER ADVISORY COMMITTEE:
A forum for making recommendations about the services provided by the Women's Center. Five undergrads needed.

NATURAL RESERVE SYSTEM COMMITTEE: Recommends to the Systemwide committee concerning potential reserve sites. Reviews the activitiews of the reserve advisory committtees -(2 undergrads )

## OMBUDSMAN ADVISORY

COMMITTEE: Serves as an advisor to the Ombudsman Office--Where all questions are answered. (2)

PHYSICAL PLANNING COMMITTEE:
Provides advice concerning the physical development and alteration of the campus. TWO undergrads needed

## PROGRAM REVIEW COMMITTEE

Participates in the periodic external site eviews of undergraduate academic programs and departments. Just ONE undergrad needed.
PUBLIC SAFETY COMMITTEE:
Aforum to discuss, evaluate, and make recommendations to campus officials on pub and bicycle issues.

## STUDENT FEE ADVISORY

## COMMITTEE:

Advises on activities supported by income from student registration ,recommends priorities for funding STUDENT HEALTH ADVISORY COMMITTEE:
Serves as an advisor to the Studen Health Center by reviewing health programs and student opinions.

RADIATION SAFETY
COMMITTEE: Reviews and recommends on safety policies and procedures, purchase of radioactive materials, resolution of potential safety problems. (2)

RATE AND RECHARGE COMMITTEE: Revies and makes recommendations on rate structures and proposed changes to rates submitted by campus service units for goods and/or services. One undergrad needed.

REGULATIONS REVIEW BOARD: Advises on organizational discipline and regulation interpretation. SCHOOL AND COLLEGE OUTREACH AND VISITATION: Recommendations to the Director of Admissions and the Director of Relations regarding the school and college visit plan. (3)

STUDENT CONDUCT COMMITTEE:
Recommends disciplinary action in response to inappropriate sudent conduct in academics, and in all other areas, with the exception of the Residence Halls. Possible three year term--three positions available.

## ACADEMIC AFFAIRS BOARD:

Works to increase the quality and participation of students at the University in their educational process. They provide services that help students find and define their educational goals, and also tries to increase the contact between students, faculty and the Administration. AAB oversees and coordinates informa tion from students who represent Associated Students on the Academic Senate Committees

## A.S. COMMISSION ON THE STATUS OF WOMEN

To promote "womens"' issues here on campus and in society. Every fall they sponsor TAKE BACK THE NIGHT to raise community awareness of the rape prevention. Search for all members interested in political and social issues.
A.S. I UCSB COMMUNITY AFFAIRS BOARD (CAB):

Coordinates volunteer programs in the Goleta and Santa Barabara areas. A.S CAB acts as a liaison between the Community and UCSB-providing students academic as well as professional experience for students. Come join the student run projects--and/or go out and volunteer!!

## A.S. BUSINESS SERVICES COMMITTEE:

Oversees and manages all A.S. Businesses including A.S. Notetaking, Bike Shop, Legal, Word Processing, and Cashier services.

CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS COMMITTEE:
Responsible for recommendations on all matters pertaining to the ASUCSB legal code. The committee will study the code and make recommendations on needed legislation.

## COMMUNICATIONS BOARD:

Serves as a voice for Associated Students to the student body through publication of The Inside Wave. Members research and write articles on all the different groups and institutions which make up A.S.. This committee is responsible for the weekly NEXUS calendar page and any other A.S. projects concerned with communications.


## COMMUNITY RELATIONS COMMITTEE:

Works on restoring Isla Vista Pride. Issues such as Parking, saving open space, Womens' Safety, and tenants rights are all being worked on and need more student input. The committee is currently working with several agencies in Isla Vista in order to educate students and remind us that IV is our home.

## ELECTIONS COMMITTEE:

Coordinates the mechanics of A.S. elections, mainly to run the spring general election, including poll set-up, and computer programming, among many other facets.

## FINANCE BOARD:

The financial arm of A.S. Legislative Council. It is responsible for the yearly budget (annual allocation), and implementation of Associated Students' finances.

## INVESTMENTS COMMITTEE:

This works in four sub-committees: Market Research, Stocks and Bonds, Interes Bearing Accounts, and Group Home Project. It targets current economic conditions, is hostile to the deficit and boycotts non-ethical investments. It also advise Legislative Council on the management of its $\$ 50,000$ capital reserves account.

## JUDICIAL COUNCIL:

Shall be empowered to hear and decide any case under original jurisdiction as set forth in Article V of the A.S. Constitution.

## PROGRAM BOARD:

A group of committees funded by ASUCSB undergraduates, it provides diverse programming for the campus. It consists of ten seperate committees: Concerts, Lectures, Publicity, UCen activities, Production, Cultural, Films \& Video, Special Events, Security, and Art Gallery.

## RADIO COUNCIL:

To oversee the operations of KCSB-FM including the selection of the Associated Manager, review of managerial decisions, resolution of FCC problems, and approval for KCSB-FM budget breakdowns of A.S. appropriated funds.

## UNDERWRITE BOARD:

Responsible for granting underwrites, "no interest loans," to eligible student groups for fundraising. It shall also be responsible for requisitioning and all othe administrative duties associated with underwrites. Responsible also for the follow-ups on the underwrites it grants.

COLLEGE OF LETTERS AND SCIENCES EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE: This committtee is seeking three nominees for considerations for appointment as student representatives. This committee represents the Faculty in all aspects of the academic administration of the College. Should be able to serve two years.
