PEACE RUMORS. Rumors of a disposition on the part of the Russian government to make the first advances for peace continue to prevail, but except information that the mercantile class in Russia are weary of war, there is no ground for the rumors. It is reported that M. De Munster, military envoy of Prussia at St. Petersburg, had visited the Czar at Nicolaieff, with a view to induce him to recognise certain conditions of peace, such as would be laid before the French and English cabinets. The Czar listened favor-
