I wandered into Santa Barbara on a Wednesday. All I needed was a drink and a quickie. I knew exactly where to go. Calypso is a bar. In any other town it would be a nice bar, but in Santa Barbara, where everything has to be glossy and bright, it might be considered a dive bar. I like the dance floor; I like the bartender Remy; I like the

Remy pours 'em strong, like a tall bull. Like Hemingway drinks 'em. Remy's got six beers on tap. But then, Remy tells me that Jack Daniels isn't bourbon. Jim Beam is bourbon. Remy also told me about the food at Calypso. He told me about the Rasta Pasta, a real big hit on Reggae Tuesday. He told me about the Island Jam, a chicken sandwich with a good name. It sounded good

Unfortunately, the kitchen at Calypso closes around 5 o'clock, so I was out of luck. My luck changed when I went outside to smoke a cigarette (Marlboro Reds, \$5 at the bar). Whom did I espy but my old friend and associate. Under an enormous sombrero and clinically attached to a gin and tonic, my associate was easy to recognize. We greeted each other with our accustomed half-hug (the one where you still shake hands, but you also grasp each other's shoulders). My associate and a friend, it turned out, had been stuck in Santa Barbara since the end of winter, when the local badge had slapped anklets on their legs, which implied an indefinite invitation, if you get my meaning.

entrées and salads. It has a


burger so spicy it's served with

My own entrée of a double Jack Daniels with a side of chain smoking was sitting well with me when the DJ arrived. As the volume of the music increased, the feeling of the place took on the tension of a man about to run ... or dance. Disco melted smoothly into hip hop. Hip hop melted smoothly into '80s pop, and it all ran together into the lights and dry ice on the unpopulated dance floor.

Eventually a lone girl, in a short black dress, made her sweet little way to the floor to shake groove thing to the compact discs the DJ spun. I wanted to see her dance to Prince, so I sent my emissary to request some. Sure enough, the next song (again smoothly melting, this time from a David Bowie medley) was a forgotten Prince favorite.


Goleta's 20-year-old Elephant Bar and Restaurant, part of a statewide chain, is no secret to UCSB students who have been around for a while. Located at 521 Firestone Road, off Hollister (and across the street from the \$2.50 movie theater), E-Bar's "safari" atmosphere and wide selection of appetizers, lunch and dinner entrées and full bar are an automatic favorite.

"We have a great spicy cashew chicken, which is one of our most popular dishes," General Manager Corey Gresham said. "The safari steak is also a popular one, as well as the oriental chicken salad."

At E-Bar, you can pretty much count on an entrée for around \$7 to \$9. I stopped by last week with a friend and spent around \$30 for a great meal which included its "famous" artichoke dip appetizer (try it even if you're not a huge veggie fan), their mahi-mahi fish tacos, and a steak dish for my hot, but stubborn, date. The only problem group. (I would suggest swinging by

Students looking for a quick fix we found with the menu was its size on a less crowded weeknight, if you're not there to drink).




It does get better, too. E-Bar recently caught up with the electronic age and will now page you when your table's ready. Exciting,
