UCSB Finds a Pair of Big West Opponents Ripe for the Picking

Oranges can be sliced, diced, garnished and peeled. But, they can also be crushed, and that's what the #13 team in the nation decided to do last weekend.

The UCSB women's basketball team faced two Orange County schools, UC Irvine on Friday and Cal State Fullerton on Sunday, and the Gauchos sent the two teams home packing in not-so-dramatic style. Not-so-dramatic in the fact that the two wins were by an average of 28.5

Friday brought UCI and droves of fans to the Thunderdome for the promotional "Fill the 'Dome" night. The record of 4,760 fans set in 1996 is now the secondbiggest crowd in women's basketball history, as 4,835 people showed up to see the Gauchos win 75-58. The promise Head

Coach Mark French made about dyeing his hair platinum blonde will be debuted in Santa Barbara's next homestand beginning Feb. 18 vs. Pacific and Long Beach

"With my physical appearance, it can only help," French joked.

As for the game that was played, junior guard Erin Buescher recorded her 11th double-double of the year with a seasonhigh 26 points and 13 rebounds. Seniors Kristi Rohr and Tawnée Cooper added 13 and 12 points, respectively. Junior Rachelle Rogers dropped in 10 and junior Nicole Greathouse boarded 12 missed

"Erin's unbelievable," Irvine Head Coach Mark Adams said. "She can score out there anytime she wants. She had a lot of boards; she can just score so many ways, it's hard to defend her."

The name of both games for the Gauchos (19-3 overall, 7-0 in the Big

West) was rebounding. Against Irvine (10-9, 3-4), UCSB pulled down 53 total rebounds compared to UCI's 35, and vs. Cal State Fullerton, Santa Barbara held a 49-27 advantage.





Gauchos Police Their Neighborhood, Keep the Streets Safe From Vandals

Vandals broke into the Thunderdome on Saturday evening, but were quickly rounded up like a bunch of juvenile delinquents by the authority of the UCSB men's basketball team.

The only serious dam-Gauchos' own nets, as Santa Barbara (8-11 overall, 4-4 in the Big West)

shot a scorching 52.9 percent from the field and an even more nylon-engulfing 55.6 percent from behind the three point line in a 72-55 victory over the Idaho Vandals.

"I think we're trying to be more aggressive," said freshman forward Mark Hull, who led all scorers with 17 points. However, Idaho made a small run in the closing minutes and trailed only 32-24 at the break. was the burning of the games. Being aggressive Without their leading scorer Gordon Scott, who was out with the flu, the Vandals suffered a tremendous setback according to UCSB Head Coach Bob Williams.

"[Scott's absence] did hurt Idaho's chances coming in here," Williams said. "I think it's indicative of them going for 55 points at our place. They lacked on perimeter shoot-

UCSB Takes Two of Three in First Home Series

The UCSB baseball team played host to the Spartans of San Jose State Caesar Uyesaka Stadium this past weekend, in Santa Barbara's first three-game series of the 2000 season. At Sunday's end, the Gauchos (4-2 overall) found themselves the winners of two of three games, each of their wins coming on the final at-bat of the game.

On Friday, UCSB faced SJSU (2-2 overall) for the first time since 1996. Neither team was able to produce much offense, save for sophomore Tyler Von Schell's first home run of the year in the sixth inning. After eight innings of play, the scoreboard read 3-3, and stayed that way until the ninth.

After beating out a drag bunt with one out in the ninth, sophomore Andy Campanella advanced to third on an errant pickoff throw by Spartan pitcher Tim Adinolfini. Junior Chad Peshke then drew a walk to give UCSB runners at the corners. On the next at-bat, Campanella scored the game's winning run on a botched doubleplay grounder that would have ended the inning.

"Defensive breakdowns in the last inning [are] very uncharacteristic of a San Jose State team," UCSB Head Coach Bob Brontsema said, adding, "It's always nice to win a wellpitched game with good defense, and ... we did both those things well today."

Senior Gabe Neboyia started for the Gauchos, and held SJSU to five hits over seven innings of work. Replaced by sophomore Chris Quiroz in the eighth, Neboyia felt he was as effective in the late innings as he was in any other point in the game.

"My arm feels great," Neboyia said. "I felt I could have gone the whole way. I didn't think they were getting real good hits off of me."

On Saturday, UCSB visited the brink of defeat before eking out its second victory of the series. Trailing 6-1 in the seventh inning, the Gauchos rallied for two in the seventh and three in the ninth to send the game into extra innings, where they won with a score in the 10th.

UCSB was down to its last out in the bottom of the ninth, but loaded the bases with a walk and back-to-back singles. After Peshke drew a walk to force in a run, junior Mike Kolbach laced a single to tie the game. In the tenth, freshman Donovan Warrecker drove the winning run in on a deep fly that scored junior Jeff Carter.

On Sunday, UCSB was beaten 7-4 by a Spartan team determined not to get swept. It was the Gauchos' second loss of the year. UCSB will be in action again Wednesday, when the Gauchos face the UCLA Bruins in Los Angeles at 3 p.m.

"I think Santa Barbara is one of the best offensive rebounding teams in the country," Adams said. "We gave up 21 'O' boards, and they either got putbacks or we fouled them. If you can't control the boards, that's going to cost you - especially against good teams. Obviously they're a very good team, ranked 13th."

Sunday afternoon brought CSUF to the Thunderdome, a place where the Gauchos hadn't lost for 21 consecutive games. Make that 22. The Titans (2-18, 1-7) weren't too mighty, or didn't prove much of a challenge, falling to the class of the Big West, 104-64. The 40-point blowout was just another win along the line of victories that UCSB has strung together. UCSB has now won 15 straight

games, 22 on its home floor and 40 straight Big West matches.

UCSB was without the services of 6'3" sophomore forward Kayte Christensen (10.4 ppg, 6.3 rpg), and will be without her services for five weeks. Christensen broke her left wrist in last week's game vs. Vanderbilt and will be re-evaluated in the first week of March.

Rohr led the Gauchos with 25 points and 10 boards. Buescher added 24 and Cooper and freshman Jess Hansen each had 10. Rohr's point total moved her into third place all-time, passing Gaucho coach Barb Beainy. The next mark for Rohr is 1,554 held by Patty Franklin, who graduated in 1982.

"[Beainy] told me that when I was shooting one of my free throws, she was saying 'Miss it, miss it,' " Rohr said. "I didn't like that part of her. And I did tell her."

The Gauchos, on the other hand, lacked nothing from the perimeter, as their shooting percentage from behind the arc shows. Junior guard Brandon Payton continued his hot shooting, going 5-8 from the floor for 15 points. But much of UCSB's success came from fast break opportunities and easy layups. For the Vandals, anything that came on the inside was either swatted away by Gaucho junior forward Adama Ndiaye or misdirected by Ndiaye's presence in the paint. Ndiaye chipped in with seven points, and had three blocks plus a gamehigh 16 rebounds.

"I thought that where Adama had the greatest effect was the defensive end," Williams said. "Adama really changed the game and bothered a lot of shots. Then he goes for 16 boards. I really believe he'll get 20 [rebounds] in a game this year."

Santa Barbara led by 23 points, its biggest lead of the game, at 51-28 with 14:24 left on the clock. However, Gaucho turnovers and sloppy play let Idaho back into the game.

"I think [we] got a little bit ahead of ourselves," said senior guard Larry Bell, who paced the Gauchos with six points, four boards, and nine assists. "We were up by more than 20 points ... and I think the guys just got

rattled and didn't compete well at times. But we had a chance to come back into the huddle and talk about it and stepped up our intensity level."

UCSB's intensity was kicked up a notch after Hull drove to the basket and threw down a slamdunk while being fouled. Hull converted on the three-point play and increased the Gaucho lead to 58-43 with 4:33 left. Idaho would come as close as 10 points with just over two minutes left, but Santa Barbara wouldn't let up. Payton converted on four straight free throws in the final minute, and Hull capped off the game with another three-point play as he was fouled after making a layup.


