Bruins Barely Breeze by SB; Gauchos Comeback at Irvine

Tough Overtime Loss to UCLA Triggers Win Over Irvine

Dangling like a carrot in front of the UCSB men's soccer team this weekend was a chance to say "Yes, we came in undefeated, and stayed that way." However, the Gauchos (8-5, 3-1 MPSF) were only able to do the next best

thing.

Perhaps the biggest game of the season for the young team was lost against UCLA Friday as the Bruins beat the Gauchos 2-1 in overtime at Spaulding Field. Yet Santa Barbara converted the disappointment into an immense desire to win as they went to UC Irvine two days later.

Ranked 9th in the nation, the Bruins provided the greatest threat to the Gauchos this season. But with a lot of determina-tion, the UCLA squad worked hard on the field to maintain their title.

The entire first half of the game consisted of numerous shot opportunities for both squads but ended 0-0 until Bruin mid-fielder Eddie Lewis finally put a goal on the score-board in the second half. Within 12 minutes,

freshman forward Danny Mann, out of Riverside, CA, scored UCSB's first and only goal, tying the

and only goal, tying the game 1-1.

Athletes from both UCLA and Santa Barbara sped up and down the length of the field for the remainder of the second half, struggling to play a strong defense as well as attempt to break the tie with a winning goal. with a winning goal.
But neither team was

successful in pushing itself over the top until the game went into overtime when the Bruins finally declared

"I really thought we were going to beat them," goalie Travis Harding said.
"We were better than them." and we outplayed them. It just takes everything out of you and we've definitely come around so far."

"I think our biggest weakness was that we were just unlucky," Mann added. "It isn't just skill and tactics. We also need luck to win. We're going to come up higher for Irvine. I just know it."

The Gauchos did seize the opportunity to trans-

any game: desire.
But along with that de-

sire, coming off the UCLA loss created an enormous sense of determination for the players and the coaching staff, and the team has a 5-3 win over the Antea-ters to prove it.


UCSB midfielder Matt Arya kicked off the after-



The Gauchos' water polo team split two games this weekend, but the one victory may be the springboard for UCSB as they head into the tail end of the 1994 season. The Gauchos lost to UCLA at Campus Pool, Friday, 9-7, but rebounded yesterday to post a historic 12-10 triumph at home over the #2 California Golden

Why was the win so historic? Well, it marked the first time in 12 years that a Gaucho water polo team has been able to defeat Cal and only the seventh time in 37 series games. On top of all the history, the victory snapped a three-game losing streak for Santa Barbara (7-9 overall, 3-4

"It was a very exciting game," senior tri-captain Doug Wierenga said, who played a huge part in the win during UCSB's thirdquarter surge. "I've been here four years, and it is the biggest win I've been a part of."

"The team finally figured out that if you put together a whole game of fundamentals, it pays off," senior Colum Lavelle said. "We were dictating the

play and they were having to come back. Dominating the way we did, it's just incredible."

The Gauchos and Bears went back and forth in an entertaining first half, with UCSB holding a slim 6-5 advantage. However, it was only a prelude for what was to come, with Wierenga providing the early second-half spark.

Strong Finish at SLO Puts **Cross Country in Good Spot**

The UCSB men's and women's cross country teams ended their season on a good note this weekend, and hope that the same note will carry them into their conference championships with a crescendo.

The Gaucho women finished third at the San Luis Obispo Invitational with 93 points while the men finished their race in second with 63 points.

"It was [the men's team's] best performance of the year," Santa Bar-bara coach Pete Dolan said. "I think that they're getting stronger and stronger. I feel very confident going into the championships."

UCSB's top finishers for the men were sixthplace Dave Cullum (25:58), seventh-place Brad Glosser (26:04), and eighth-place Paul Goodrich (26:08). San Luis Obispo's men's team won the race with 47 total points.

One reason for the Gauchos success at this weekend's meet was that they were able to run in a tight pack, something that they've been striving for all season.

"I was talking to Fresno State's coach [Red Estes] after the meet and he was saying how we were starting to turn some heads," Cullum said.

The UCSB women's team competed in their race with a couple of runners who were sick (Beckie Levy and Heather Bray), but still put on a good show.

Kara Bradbury fin-ished first for the Gauchos, coming in 15th with a time of 18:25, while Eliza Alexander finished right behind her in 16th at 18:25, and Deanna Hadley came in 18th at 18:35.

"They were a little bit off," Dolan said. "They were in better shape than they ran."

Fresno State finished first with 47 points and Stanford came in second with 85 points.

Both teams are expecting positive results in the Big West Conference Championships.

"Our goal is to win Big West," Bradbury said. "But to do that everyone will need to run a good race.'

Coach Dolan's decision on who to put in the starting seven was made over the weekend, and there weren't many surprises on his list. For the women, the team

Last week, the UCSB Athletic Dept. announced that sophomore guards Kim Shielke and Raquel Alotis have decided to leave the women's basketball program. Both players attribute their decisions to personal reasons.

Schielke, a 5'9" sophomore guard from Palmdale, Calif., played in 23 games as a freshman and averaged 4.6 points and 3.2 rebounds per game. Alotis, a 5'7" redshirt sophomore guard from Palos Verdes, Calif., played in 25 games as a freshman and averaged 1.9 points per game.

"We are very sorry to see them leave the program," UCSB Head Coach Mark French said. "We will miss them a great deal and we wish them the best of luck in their future endeavors."

With the two guards leaving, the Gauchos are entering the season with eight returning letter-winners and 10 players on the roster. Schielke and Alotis are enrolled for the Fall Quarter and both plan on continuing their education at UC Santa Barbara.


