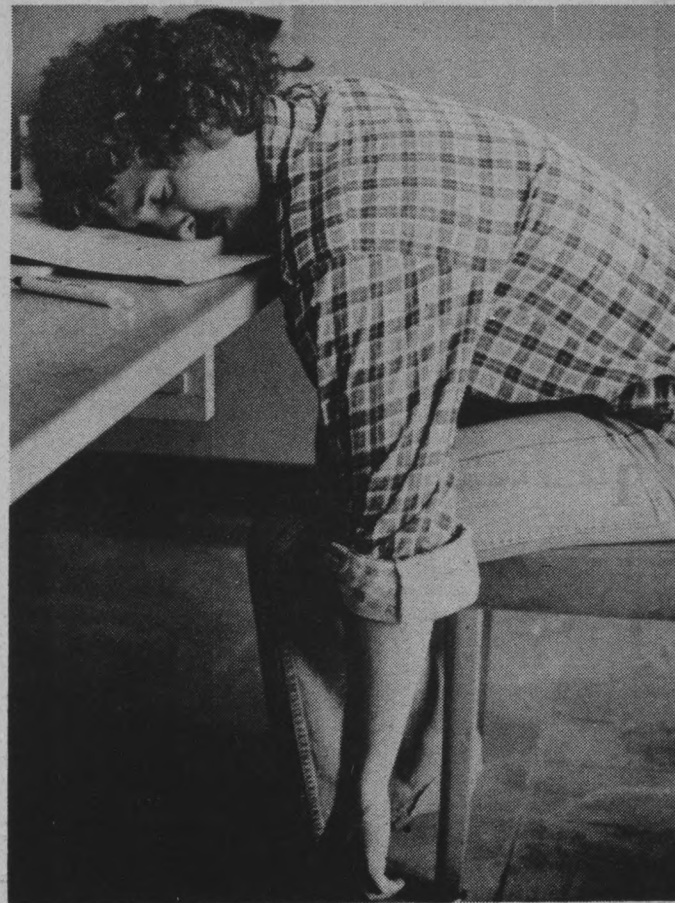

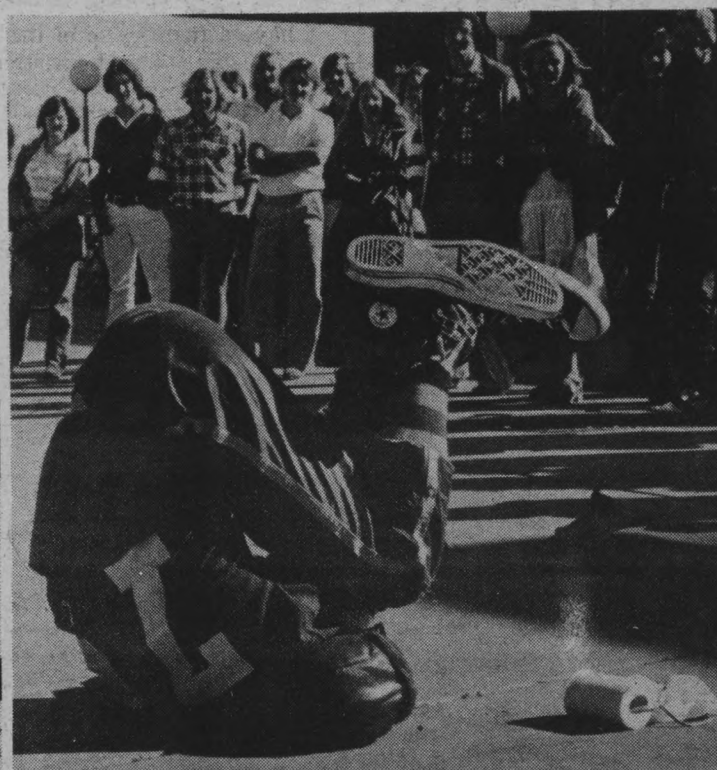

In the fourth paragraph it was stated, "Although the third baseman is as good as you'll find

in the tough I.M. circuit, the shortstop has an inherent ethnic disadvantage when squinting his already slanted eyes."

We are aware that this statement wasn't meant to be derogatory in nature; however, we see this as another form of naive racism which perpetuates negative stereotypes of Asians in America.

Therefore, we are asking for an apology in the Daily Nexus from

Richard Bornstein the sports editor and the Daily Nexus staff.

We hope in the future you, as well as others, will have become more sensitive to Asian American stereotypes as well as other ethnic groups on this campus and in this country.

We appreciate hearing your concerns in this matter. As you have noted, the remark was not intended in malice, but it does show carelessness and a lack of sensitivity to ethnic stereotypes. ## Simmering Attitude Has Boiled Over

Editor, Daily Nexus:

I am writing in reply to the authors of the letters in your June First issue protesting Mr. McElheney's earlier letter. I am also writing to all those who were as enraged as Ms. White and Mr. Norton at the suggestion that Humanities courses should be abolished, but who did not write.

When I read Mr. McElheney's letter I was delighted, but hold on, it wasn't for the reason you may think. It was very obvious to me that his letter was a satire, reminiscent of Swift's "A Modest Proposal." His letter has apparently had the same reaction that Swift's work did in eighteenth century England and

Ireland: rage, protest, and finally a horrified realization that the author's comments did strike at the heart of some very real attitudes around them.

McElheney's letter was a searing satire of those who share the "major in something practical so you can make big bucks" attitude. My only criticism is that he did not lay it on thick enough, he did not make his satire obvious enough. At first I found it hard to believe that so many people took it seriously, but then I realized that that fact itself shows the need for the Humanities courses, for it is in those classes that the student gains an appreciation for this kind of literary technique, just one of the aspects of literature that makes a mockery of those who say that studying things like literature has nothing to do with the real world, that it has no practical use.

It was McElheney's knowledge of this one literary technique that made people stand up in rage at an attitude that has been simmering below the academic surface for years.

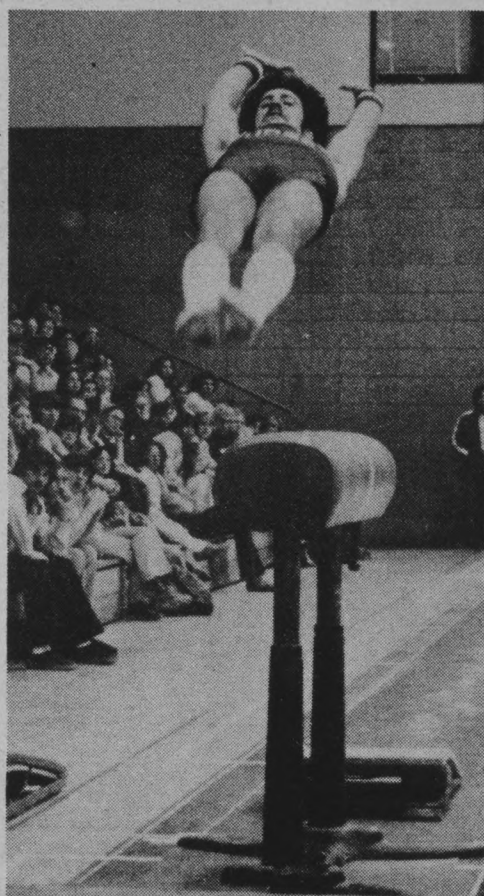
