



it was the best glass of beer that I have ever had.



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The Slices are Big and the Beer Is Cheap at Giovanni's: N.'s Home Slice

Once upon a time, in the not so distant past, I was a freshman with a sour throat and a case of the munchies in the early evening on a fall night.

I was new to the small hamlet by the Natty keg and was unaware of many things: greek nonsense, student activists and most importantly Giovonni's. I have to admit that it was my roommate Mike who introduced me to the proprietor of munchies, to the proliferation of giant pizza slices, in short to the only pizza worth eating in I.V.: Giovanni's, or Gio's as it is known to the drunken masses. Mike, understanding my need to ingest large amounts of food at that instant, suggested that we order, as we were too lazy to actually walk anywhere, Giovanni's. He ordered a meatball sub and I, in my ignorance, ordered two slices of pepperoni pizza, unaware of the actual size of a Giovanni's slice. However, 25 minutes, \$4, and two slices later, I realized that dorm food was completely unnecessary when I could eat pizza at \$1.75 a slice.


So three years, two majors and one pregnancy scare later when I was offered the chance to write a restaurant review for one of my favorite jaunts, I quickly finished my beer and got to work. I am generally a slice-and-salad kind of guy, in part because it only costs \$3.70, but since this one was on the *Daily Nexus*, I splurged and got a large garlic chicken (\$14.95)

The pizza was exquisite and so was the beer. Giovanni's is equipped with Firestone, Coors and Coors Light, Bud and Bud Light, Sierra Nevada, Red Wolf, and Fosters on tap, not to mention Rolling Rock, Corona and Sam Adams in a bottle. I got a large pitcher of Sierra Nevada, only \$7 during happy hour from 7-9 p.m., and followed it with a monster cup of Firestone for \$3.50. With my research completed, my stomach full and my head spinning, I decided to wander from table to table in order to gauge the opinion of others.

What I found out was nobody could hear what I was asking, nor did they care, as it was 9 p.m. and time for Giovanni's weekly Rainforest Thursday concert. What I did discover, mostly from picking at leftovers from patrons who had already left, was that in addition to great pizza, Giovanni's also has the only calzone in town, an awesome selection of sandwiches and many large salads that self-conscious girls can order on first dates in place of food.

Giovanni's has free delivery from 11 a.m. until midnight seven days a week and a spaghetti special Wednesday that includes a large plate of spaghetti and garlic bread for \$2.99. So if you are an ignorant freshman or otherwise and haven't stopped by the largest I.V. eatery yet, hop to it and order a beer for me, and if you say Shaun sent you, you will receive absolutely nothing extra for free.







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

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
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
