Santa Barbara's Weekend Doesn't Pan Out Vs. LBSU 49ers

The UCSB baseball team was sifted and panhandled this past weekend like bits of gold, while the Long Beach State 49ers were left saying, "Eureka!" as they found themselves winning two games from the Gauchos in a three-game series at Blair Field in Long Beach.

Santa Barbara (21-18 overall, 9-9 in the Big West) faced 49er ace Mike Gallo, who was 7-0 with a 1.95 ERA prior to this series on Friday. However, UCSB was able to overtake Long Beach (20-17, 10-7) in a 4-3 victory thanks to the strong pitching of its own ace, senior David Uris. Uris threw for eight innings and gave up only one earned run on just three hits, while walking two and whiffing six 49ers. Uris is now 5-4 on the year.

"Uris pitched as well as he has in any game for us," UCSB Head Coach Bob Brontsema said. "He's come up in many big games in the past, but this was definitely the biggest. As a team, we

Despite the win, the Gauchos lost senior first baseman Bryan LaCour to injury. LaCour, who leads the team with 48 RBIs, broke his hand while diving into first base after a bunt attempt.

With the loss of LaCour, fensive firepower and were shut out 7-0 by 49er pitcher Kasey Olenberger on Saturday. Olenberger (3-1) pitched a complete game, walked two and gave up only three hits against the Gauchos.

"It was a case of us running into a hot pitcher today," Brontsema said. "We hit some hard balls but couldn't find any holes."

Conversely, Santa Barbara starting junior pitcher Gabe Neboyia gave up four runs on seven hits in five innings of work. Bannon, Alderete, and sophomore third baseman Dave Molidor were the only Gauchos to reach base against Olenberger.

Long Beach's offense was fueled by third baseman Greg Dobbs, first baseman Jaeme Leal and right fielder Jeff Jones. Dobbs and Leal each finished 2-5 from the plate with two RBIs apiece. Jones went 2-3 with one

Gaucho Spikers Slain by Matadors

In a season marred by inconsistency, the UCSB men's volleyball team's most recent loss to Cal State Northridge last Friday night has the Gauchos looking to next year.

Santa Barbara (9-15 overall, 5-14 in the Mountain Pacific Sports Federation) lost to the Matadors in four games — 15-8, 13-15, 7-15, and 9-15 — to end its season in sixth place in the MPSF's Mountain Division. The Gauchos have not had much luck in four-game matches this year, suffering nine losses and only one win. UCSB concluded its season with a four-game losing streak.

Northridge entered the match losers of 13 in a row. giving Santa Barbara a solid opportunity to finish off the year on a positive note. However, Northridge

behind a blistering team hitting percentage of .462. UCSB managed 22 kills and only four hitting errors in the first game.

In game two the Gauchos were not as fortunate, as Northridge caught fire behind freshman outside hitter Eckhard Walter. Santa Barbara's hitting efficiency

Matadors increased their hitting percentage to .370.

"Our game broke down," freshman outside hitter Joaquin Acosta said. "We didn't have the same intensity after we won the first game. We weren't the same team after the first game. We made a lot of errors."

The Gauchos could not regain any momentum in game three, losing 15-7, as Northridge's hitting barrage continued to improve, which gave the Matadors a 2-1 game advantage. UCSB's attack worsened in game four, managing just 16 kills and 10 hitting errors on 42 swings, translating into a .143 hitting percentage and ultimately Santa Barbara's 15th loss of the season.

"Flat out, we didn't play well," UCSB Head Coach Ken Preston said. "In the third and fourth games we didn't block well. Our middle attack was poor. We



Santa Barbara had four players with 10 or more kills, led by junior outside hitter Kevin Collins' 38. Fellow junior outside hitter Rick Rauth led the team in digs with 11, and he added 12 kills to post a double-double. Junior middle blocker Luke Carlson had a good offensive night at the net, putting down 12 kills on 22 attempts, good enough for a team-leading .545 hitting percentage. However, UCSB had 15 service errors in the match, compared to watch."

the Matadors' total of nine. Northridge depended heavily on Walter, who was a force all night and tallied a staggering 41 kills - an average of just over 10 kills per game — while the rest of the Matadors had 40 combined. The only other Northridge player to have a double-digit kill total was junior middle blocker Adam Black, who had 11. Walter also hit .538, had two service aces and made five digs. Senior outside hitter Mark Lee had 20 digs to aid the Matadors' defensive efforts, which included four assisted blocks at

"[Northridge] wasn't that good; we just had problems getting motivated," said freshman outside hitter Andy Rivera, who had three kills on four attempts. "We didn't do anything well and we handed them the match. It was not a fun game to



Santa Barbara would score two more runs in the seventh, but could do little




