A Skater's Paradise has been in the Santa Barbara skateboard biz for almost 17 years and its prime location on the 500 block of State Street means it won't be going away any time soon. A Skater's Paradise features complete skateboards made with Powell blanks and graphic decks for under \$100. In addition to all your hardware needs, A Skater's Paradise carries shoes, clothing and other apparel.

Bring your parents and buy them a set of



Rollerblades. A Skater's Paradise's helpful staff focuses a lot of attention on customer service compared to the board shops run by punk kids with a chip on their shoulder. A Skater's Paradise sells more short boards than long boards but keeps a big skateboard showcase featuring dozens and dozens of wheels for all terrain one may encounter.

# Church of Skatan

The fiendishly named Church of Skatan in downtown Santa Barbara is owned by hardware giant Shorty's (based out of Carpenteria) and is geared exclusively toward skateboarders and skateboarding. Carlos, a three-year member of the Church says, "We're a hundred percent skateboard shop. No Rollerblades, bikes, scooters or any other cheesy stuff."

The Church of Skatan opened eight years ago after being named by its owner Tony. It always has a sale on shoes. And dozens of styles are permanently on the clearance rack. It also has hundreds of name-brand styles by over 11 major-name brands. The Church of Skatan also sells long boards and — considering its proxim-ity to the nearby skateboard park — knee, wrist and elbow pads and helmets starting at \$15.99.

Complete decks feature full graphics starting at \$150.00 and the Church of Skatan does not sell blank decks. The Church believes blanks flood the market and prevent large companies from making a profit on graphic decks.





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(Ed note: Blanks are often a 1/3 of the price of a graphic deck while remaining as durable. Perfect for the poor-ass college skater.)

# **Surf Country**

Just down the road on Calle Real, Surf Country has called Goleta "home" for over five years. The shop focuses on both surfboards and skateboards with a healthy dose of clothing and apparel for both lifestyles. Surf Country carries short boards and long boards for both concrete and saltwater. Outfit for the ocean with Surf Country's wide selection of Rip Curl and Body Glove full and spring suits (starting at \$120.00). Or protect your dermis from road rash with skate clothing by ZERO, Shorty's, Element, Independent and 15 others.

Surfboards range from 5 feet to 10 feet while complete decks start at \$89.00, and blanks are \$29.99, without grip. Its close location in Goleta makes Surf Country doubly cool.

# Jiu-Jitsu, Aikido, and Paragon Academy **Muay Thai Action in S.B.** 963-8540

Paragon Jiu-Jitsu Academy has been training men and

women in the self-defense martial art for over two years. Classes start at \$90 per month for twelve classes and classes are offered every day in the morning and afternoon. Jiu-Jitsu assistant instructor Jeff Glover said the martial art has been steadily gaining popularity after repeated wins by jiu-jitsu fighters in the Ultimate Fighting Championships.

The reason for this is more than 90 percent of fights go to the ground and jiu-jitsu's similarity to wrestling relies on this fact. Students of jiu-jitsu will learn not

of his life.

Back in the early 70s the founder of what is now the national Muay Thai Kickboxing Association showed Ron Johnson the future. Back then Ron was into fullcontact karate (for which he's a third degree black belt) but muay thai promised less rules and simpler, harder hits. Ron became the first kickboxer in Santa Barbara. and Thailand's 1,000-year-old martial art found new roots in Santa Barbara.

In addition to training actors for fight scenes and other work, Ron has been teaching boxing, kickboxing and muay thai for 32 years. He pauses our phone call to say goodbye to one of his students Christopher Woods of "Back to the Future" fame. Ron says muay thai is

Bill and Geraldine have trained Santa Barbarans for more than 16 years, instructing men and women ages 2 to 65. Anyone is welcome to come in for two free classes and for \$175 you can attend Aikido of Santa Barbara for 3 months. There are three one-

hour classes taught six days per week, and with membership you can come to as many as you like.

In addition to being an excellent way to stay in shape, aikido focuses on the innate self-defense mechanisms unique to everyone. Psychologically, aikido trains the mind to uncover these defense mechanisms. In short knowing how to defend perfectly - the goal of aikido requires first knowing one's own built-in defenses perfectly. Bill says the goal of Aikido of Santa Barbara is to help people uncover their hidden self-

defenses - something that changes all other aspects of life when fully accomplished

Aikido is more aerobic than tai chi and is done with a partner. There is no worldwide aikido competition; Bill says the competition "is inside yourself, not outside."



an opponent off his feet but also a whole slew of holds, submissions, and moves that will completely immobilize any would-be attacker. Jeff said the women's self-defense classes on Tuesdays are growing every week, as

Instructor Ricardo Miller is a 14-year jiu-jitsu veteran with a certified black belt and gives private lessons for \$80 per lesson. His greatest success story is 62-year-old man who came in weighing 220 pounds. After one year of classes twice a week, the man weighed 150 pounds with a six-pack to boot. He said he was in the best shape

to karate what tackle football is to flag football. Where karate focuses on speed, muay thai is a brutal full-body. workout that focuses on large body movements such as roundhouses and crosses, which break an opponent in one blow. Most advanced students do not drill at fullstrength, lest they break the legs or rupture the organs of their sparring partner.

Newcomers can get a free semi-private first lesson and are encouraged to stay for the first full lesson. Training classes three times per week cost \$68 per month, and Ron offers a student discount because of the high volume of students who train. Anyone who sticks around for a few months is virtually guaranteed a sixpack of steel and thighs tougher than a brick.

"Our 'Wildcat' iced teas. Can I say that? We all used to work there."
