How Sweet It Is! Gauchos Win Fourth Title

RENO, NV. - At first she lit the nets up, then she tore them down.

Senior point guard Stacy Clinesmith, playing for the final time on the Lawlor Events Center floor on the campus of the University of Nevada, led the #8 UCSB women's basketball team to its fourth straight Big West title in one of the best displays of offense in school history.

Clinesmith scored 36 points on 10-17 shooting (7-11 from three-point range and 9-10 from the free throw line) to lead UCSB to a 79-69 victory over Long Beach State in the final game of the Big Tournament Saturday afternoon.

"She must like this floor a lot," UCSB Head Coach Mark French said. "I haven't seen her go off like that since the 'miracle game' [a 95-88 overtime win vs. Nevada where Clinesmith scored 34]. I should expect that from a fellow blond person."

And, when all the dust settled from the rivalry between the two schools, Clinesmith was standing there as the Big West Tournament MVP. In the three games UCSB played, the Spokane, WA. native averaged 23 points per that it's over yet,"

game and 3.3 assists per game to garner the honors. And, when the traditional cutting of the nets ceremony happened, Clinesmith chopped the last piece and held up the twine. She promptly put the net around her neck and pointed to her teammates.

"It's pretty much a good cap to a good career - not Clinesmith said.

Clinesmith was referring to the Gauchos playing in the NCAA Tournament. Sunday afternoon, UCSB found out that it will host the first two rounds of the Tourney as the #4 seed in the West. The first game will be against Rice on Saturday in the Thunderdome at 9 p.m.

It wasn't all easy going though for Santa Barbara Saturday. Long Beach was in the thick of things in the first half — even holding a lead for three minutes — and then went on a 13-0 run in the second half to bring the game within nine. But, the bottle-blond point guard wouldn't let LBSU spoil her team's season, and when the going

got tough, she was there to light it up and take control back to UCSB's side.

"We didn't do a good job coming out and playing in first half," LBSU Head Coach Dallas Boychuk-Bolla said. "It's frustrating that we didn't play our best basketball, but also that's the #[8] team in the country and they came out and did a

In the first half, UCSB (30-3 overall, 18-0 in the Big West) jumped to a 6-0 lead, but LBSU (20-10, 14-4) caught up and took a 15-11 lead with 14:05 to play. That was when Clinesmith put on her Superwoman cape and hit a trey and then two layups in a span of two minutes to make it 19-17 in the Gauchos' favor. From there, UCSB never looked back, taking a 44-32 lead into the locker room.

UCSB then came charging out of the gates in round two and extended its lead to as much as 22 points, 54-32. Then, all of a sudden, the momentum shifted and the 49ers held UCSB scoreless for four minutes and 32 seconds to bring the game to 54-45. But, Clinesmith hit a pair of free throws and a threepointer to make it 59-45 with 10 minutes left, and the Gauchos set the game on cruise control from there. The win extended UCSB's nation long winning streak to 26 games and its Big West dominance now stands at 51 straight games.

Seniors Kristi Rohr and Tawnée Cooper, each also playing in their final Big West game, scored 11 and seven points respectively. Rohr also pulled down eight boards, and Cooper had four. Rohr and junior Erin Buescher were named to the All-Tournament





After winning 30 games (the most in school history), 26 straight games (the longest current streak in the nation) and 51 consecutive Big West games (my God), the #8 UCSB women's basketball team was rewarded with the #4 seed in the Western region of the NCAA Tournament.

Head Coach Mark French has built up this program from a pile of rubble to one of the cathedrals of women's basketball in the nation and it has now paid off. Now, all the Gauchos need to do is show the rest of the nation what Santa Barbara fans already know — they can win.

The Gauchos have been to the NCAA's the past four years and have not gotten further than the second round.


