Football Returns to UCSB; Will Begin Playing Next Year

UCSB Athletic Director Gary Cunningham made a stunning announcement this past week, declaring that Gaucho football will be resurrected on the fields of Harder Stadium beginning next season.

"We are ready to become the national power in NCAA football," Cunningham said. "We have the athletes, we have the fans, and sooner or later we'll have the money to finance this Gaucho Dream Team."


Even with all the criticism thrown Robinson's way, the new Gaucho coach sheds it like water off a duck's back.


