UCSD DEAN WILL END SUMMER LECTURE SERIES WITH TALK TUESDAY AFTERNOON

Dr. Sigurd Burckhardt, professor of German Literature and Dean of the College of Letters and Science at the San Diego campus of the university, will discuss "How Not To Murder Caesar" in South Hall Lecture Room at 4 o'clock this afternoon, Tuesday, July 21. The lecture is the final event in the Summer Lecture Series.

The author of 23 articles on English and American literature in scholarly and professional journals and magazines, Dean Burckhardt formerly was a member of the faculty at St. Mary's College and Ohio State University.

He has been at UCSD since last summer when he was one of the first faculty members to be appointed there.

Dr. Burckhardt received his bachelor of arts degree and the Master of Arts degree in English from the Berkeley campus and took his Ph.D. in German at Ohio State University.

PAGANINI QUARTET TO PRESENT CONCERT AT NOON IN CAMPBELL HALL MONDAY

The Paganini Quartet will play works by Beethoven and Debussy in a noon concert in Campbell Hall on Monday, July 27. Tickets for the performance may be purchased for \$1.25 in the Arts and Lectures Office, Campbell Hall.

Members of the Quartet are Henri Temianka, founder and violinist; Stefan Krayk, violinist and professor of music at UCSB; Lucien Laporte, cellist, and Albert Gillis, violist.

The ensemble, lauded by critics across the country for their concerts here and abroad, has been resident at UCSB for four years and will begin its fifth year here in the fall.

The quartet is named for the great virtuoso Nicolo Paganini who once owned the famed Stradivarius instruments the members use today.

In addition to the summer concert, the Paganinis annually present six Santa Barbara concerts during the year, as well as playing before numerous audiences on their annual winter tours.

TICKETS ARE AVAILABLE FOR SHAKESPEARE'S 'TWO GENTLEMEN OF VERONA' THIS WEEK

Tickets for the campus production of Shakespeare's "Two Gentlemen of Verona" are available now at the Arts and Lectures Office in Campbell Hall and downtown at the Lobero Theater.

Because the production will be staged on only three nights, Thursday, Friday and Saturday, July 23-25, advance ticket purchase is suggested.

The play, a charming and absurd early comedy by Shakespeare, is being directed by Dr. Stanley Glenn, associate professor of dramatic art. Costumes are by Jack Byers, and music by Dr. Roger Chapman, associate professor of music.

Students, faculty and townspeople are taking roles in the production, which is presented in commemoration of the 400th anniversary of Shakespeare's birth.

Special prices for opening night tickets are \$1 for students, \$1.50 for non-students. On Friday and Saturday evenings, admission is \$1 for students and \$2 for non-students.
