Two Wins Put Cap on Conference Play

GaUCHO Seniors Show Their Experience, Leading Attack

A pair of wins over the weekend marked the end of Big West play for the #9 UCSB women's volleyball team and the end of an era led by seniors Chrissy Boehle, Shirley Aboyme and Heather Collins. But this ending is actually just the beginning.

Despite the emotions the team expressed towards their graduating seniors, the season has just begun for the Gauchos. With their appearance at the Long Beach Invitational this coming weekend and the NCAA tournament quickly approaching, the UCSB spikers have a lot of work to do. Regardless of their upcoming matchups, Friday and Saturday were a time for the Gauchos to bid a fond farewell to their seniors.

On Friday night, UCSB defeated the University of Nevada-Reno Wolfpack in three games, 15-0, 15-9, 15-1. Their momentum continued Saturday night as the Gauchos ended New Mexico State's eight-game winning streak, 15-9, 15-8, 15-9. Fittingly, it was a night of senior domination.

"This is the kind of game I was hoping our seniors would have," UCSB Head Coach Kathy Gregory said. "Heather really started to hit, getting 17 kills tonight. Chrissy set

beautifully and Shirley pushed herself offensively. Plus, Tammy Stiner really isolated the middle tonight. New Mexico played well and forced us into some problems, but I felt that overall, we played well. I would just like to see Heather and Jennifer Stroffe play well in the same night. I think things look really good for us heading into the playoffs."

The Gauchos had their problems on Saturday, but with a little extra kick from the senior team captains, the team made the most of their situation.

"Overall I think we could have done much better," Collins explained. "There were some spurts when we were really low. Passing was bad and we weren't communicating, but we pushed ourselves and I think we had fun out there."

"I thought that we could have played a little better," Boehle said. "There were times when I thought that our emotions were a little down, but overall we've been working on specific things in practice and they really worked for us tonight."

Things definitely worked for the class of 1995. Aboyme had a strong night offensively with seven kills at .316, while making seven digs, three blocks and two service aces. Boehle had 47 assists, seven digs and a solo block, but, by far, the player of the game was

Heather Collins. Collins led the team with 17 kills at an amazing .552 hitting percentage and 15 digs on defense. She also made one block and one service ace.

"Actually, coming into the game, I wasn't feeling very good at all," Collins explained. "This week, I've been sick, and I think a lot of people were tired, coming back from Hawaii.

But once the game started, I think the adrenaline helped pump everyone up, even though there were some slow points. Hitting-wise, I just knew it was time to get into the game

and not so much bring my stats up, just to let myself know that I can hit. So the last two games, I felt like I did that."

Polo Season Ends With Tough Loss

Irvine Walks Away With Win After Big Comeback Attempt by Gauchos

In a way, it was a fitting conclusion to a frustrating season for the UCSB water polo team, as the Gauchos overcame a 4-0 deficit before losing in the final seconds to UC Irvine on a goal by Matt Maunz, 11-10. It marked the third win of the year for Irvine over Santa Barbara (14-14) and spoiled the GaUCHO finale for seven seniors.

Irvine (11-13) jumped to a quick 4-0 lead in the first 2½ minutes of the game on the strength of goals by Omar Amr, Maunz and a two-pointer by Kevin Kerber. After Kerber's score, UCSB coach Joe O'Brien called a time-out and, for the remainder of the first period and the beginning of the second, UCSB controlled the action.

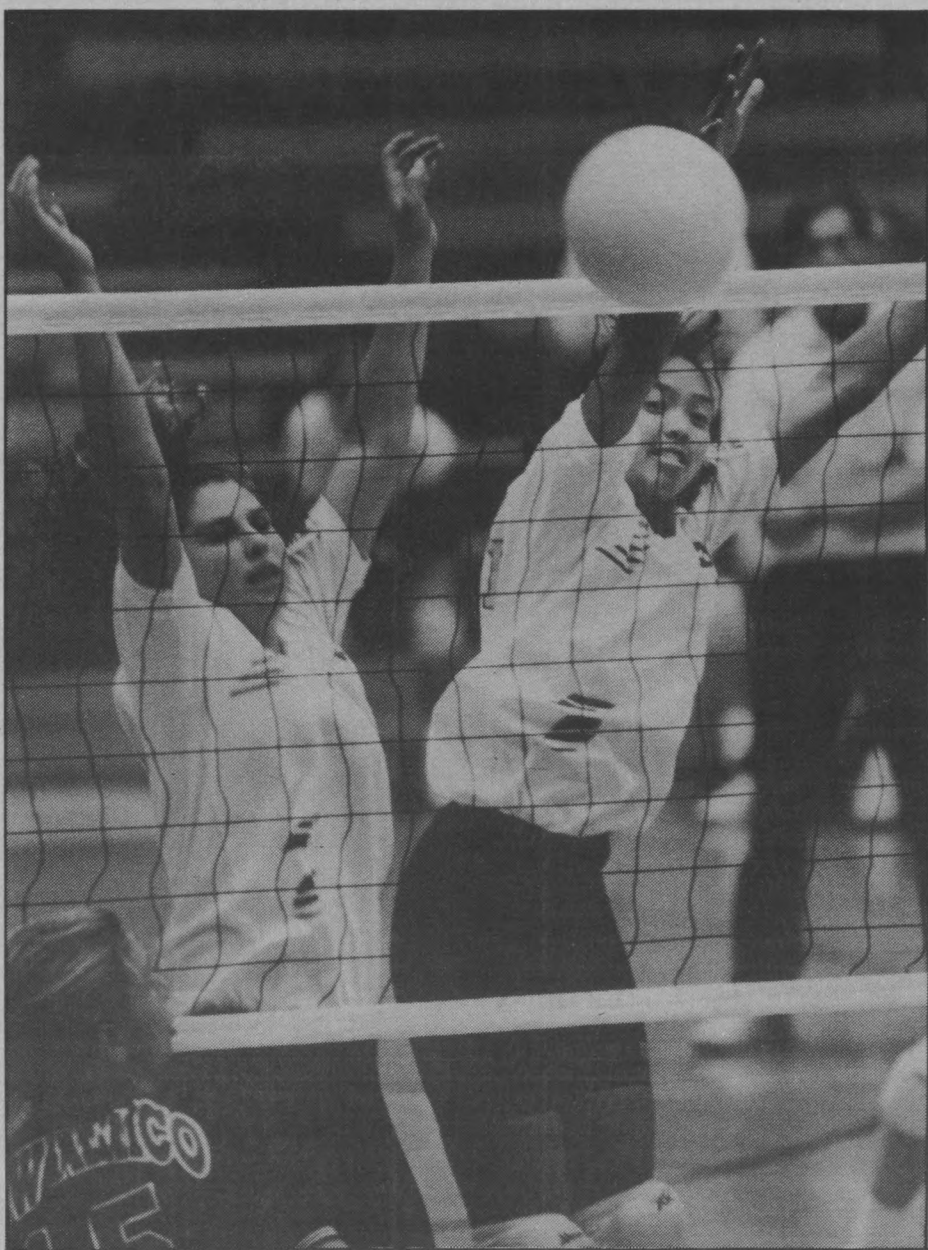
Senior driver Nikola Ivanovic was the first to find the net and get UCSB on the board. After another Irvine mark, the Gauchos tallied the last three goals of the first quarter as Doug Wierenga, Colum Lavelle and Ivanovic did the honors to trim the Anteater advantage to one, 5-4, at the end of the first period.

Wierenga gave UCSB their first lead with a two-pointer at the 5:03 mark of the second, 6-5. The game of

Two of next year's seniors also had a good evening. Kim Keys added 12 kills (.357) to the team total. She made 13 digs and five block assists. Stiner had one of her best nights of the season, pounding out 16 kills at .560 and making two solo and three assisted blocks.

"As a team we played well," Aboyme commented. "We had a little trouble getting it together. I think that that might have been because of the emotion level out there. It was hard to admit that this was going to be my last regular-season game. Everyone wanted to play so hard for the seniors that we tensed up a little. In the end we had strong play from everybody, but we could have played better. But overall, we played a great match and beat them in three."

Now that the goodbyes are over, if only temporarily, the Gauchos have one important thing to think about. The leadership the

seniors showed was the best it has been all year, but in order to have a successful weekend at Long Beach and a successful postseason, their leadership is going to have to be even stronger.

"Heather and Shirley really stepped up their play, which makes me look a lot better," Boehle explained. "I feel really fortunate that we could do that. Unlike last season, we are peaking now and not in the middle of the season. We're just really going to work hard. We have two big matches next weekend and want to play the best we can."

"With such a strong night from the seniors, I think it could motivate us into the postseason," Collins said. "After last week's practice that didn't go so well, we know that we need to push ourselves this week, and going into the tournament at Long Beach, even though people haven't really seen these teams, I think they could give us a really good game. We need to be able to push ourselves and play like we are getting ready for the playoffs."

streaks continued as the Anteaters scored three consecutive goals of their own to take an 8-6 lead into halftime.

A goal by UCI sophomore driver Craig Watson increased the Irvine advantage to three goals, but

then it was the Gauchos' turn to go on a run. Kevin Eggert scored first, followed soon by Lavelle on a penalty shot, to complete the third-quarter scoring.

Lavelle opened the fourth quarter with a goal to tie the game before Eggert struck again to give UCSB their final lead of the game, 10-9, with 4:38 remaining.

Unfortunately for the

Gauchos, the final turn of momentum belonged to the visitors as Ofer Horn tied the match before Maunz won it with 10 seconds left.

O'Brien called a timeout to set up a final play, but it was to no avail as the Gauchos were left with their third tight defeat in five home games and their first .500 finish in 10 years.
