SACRAMENTO, Calif .- President C. L. Phelps of Santa Barbara State College, supporting his recently announced policy of advocating the abolition of state colleges, refused an offer of \$500,000 made by the State Legislature here today. The money would have been used for additions to the Santa Barbara college and the landscaping of its grounds.

Committeemen were reported to have offered the money in cash, pleading in broken voices for its acceptance, but the Santa Barbara man stuck firmly to his principle.

In addition to refusing the half million dollar offer, Phelps is reported to be considering the return of some \$200,000 to the state's coffers, money which was to have been spent in the erection of a new science wing and new training school for the Santa Barbara


