



(Continued from p.2A) direction of movement; their populations can increase to enormous numbers if left undisturbed; they exude a distinct pungent odor; and they defecate upon all food and surfaces with which they come into contact.

To make matters worse, they reproduce like mad, just one pregnant female can drop up to six-

teen nymphs per pregnancy.
The mating ritual of the cockroach is fairly sick, but oddly enough is rather like that of humans When a male comes into contact with another cockroach, he investigates it with his antennae and if the other insect is a female, they commence rapid stroking of each

other's antennae. After groping and becoming stimulated, the properly male twitches the end of his abdomen several times, extends it, and then turns his terminal segments towards her. He then spreads his wings as an invitation to the female to partake of the manly juices which he secretes from dorsal glands. Once the female has positioned herself on his back and has commenced feasting, the male clasps onto her genitalia with his basal hook and pulls her into end-to-end mating position.

Though copulation occurs more readily in the dark, males can be stimulated in both dark and light. Cockroach sex can last anywhere from a few seconds, where no fertilization occurs, up to a full tiring hour. When the average one-year lifespan of the cockroach is taken into consideration, one hour is a fairly long time (that's about

three days to you and me). Once fertilization has occurred, there is a five-to-13-week maturation period until the nymphs are hatched. The female carries them around until a day or so before they are ready and then deposits the egg sac or keel in a warm safe place, like under your refrigerator.

The nymphs hatch out the following day as tiny, white roaches with big dark eyes. In just a few days, they take on the adult color and almost overnight there are about eight times as many roaches defecating in your kitchen.

Though seemingly impossible to get rid of, there are a few solutions to the cockroach dilemma, like roach motels and boric acid, but shoes and brooms still work best. Or you could just start naming them and keeping them as pets. Good


