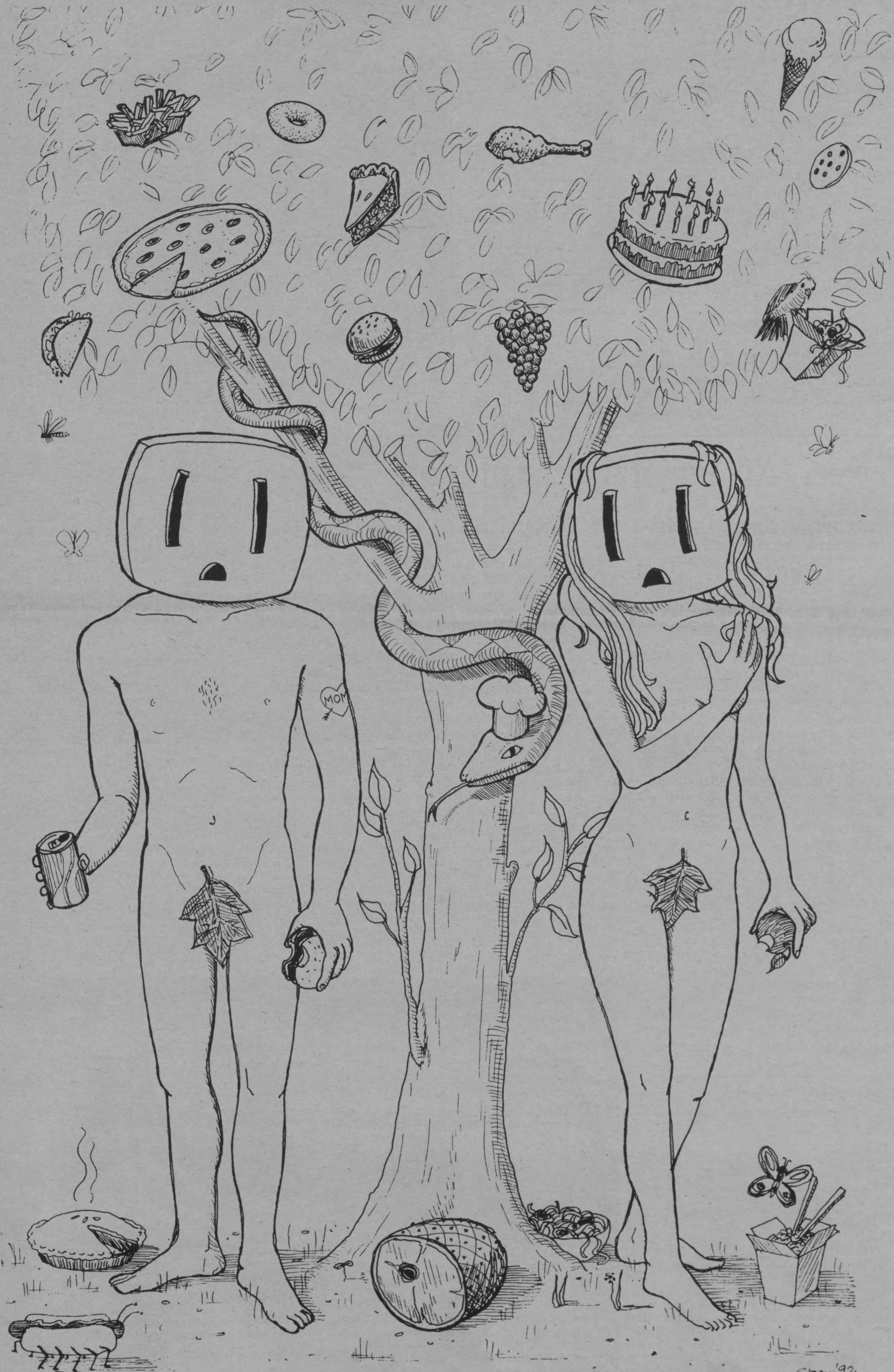

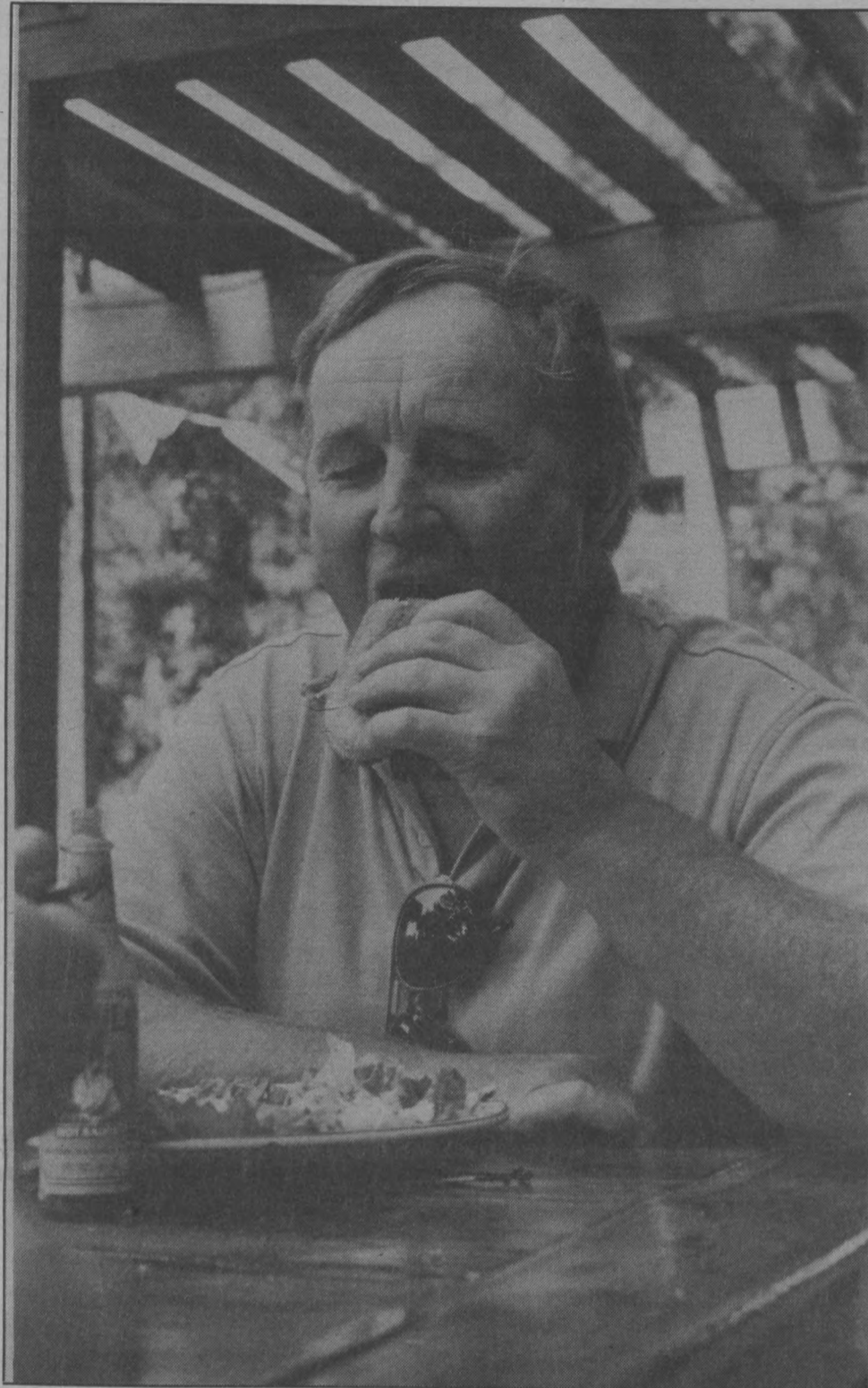

at these delectable dinner warm-ups.

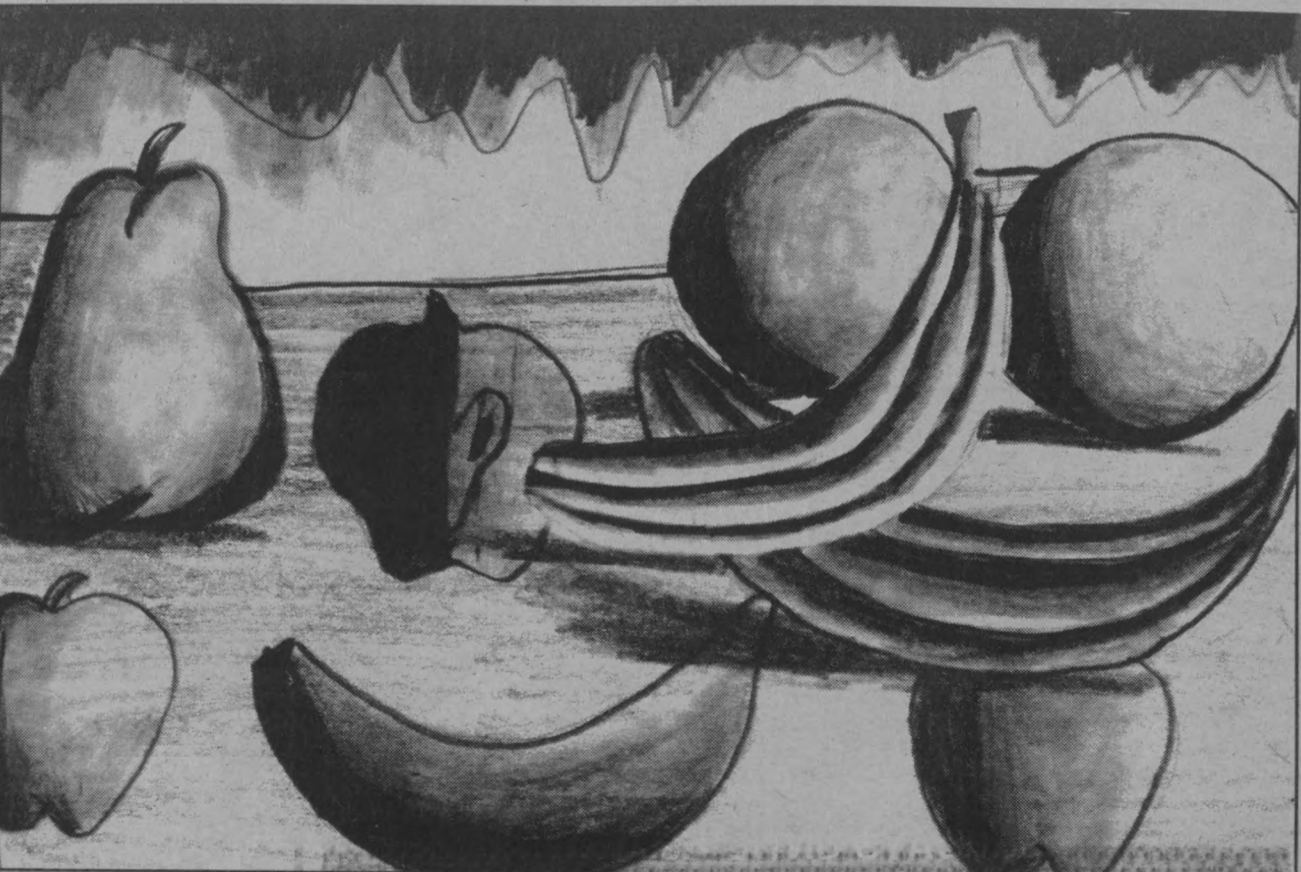

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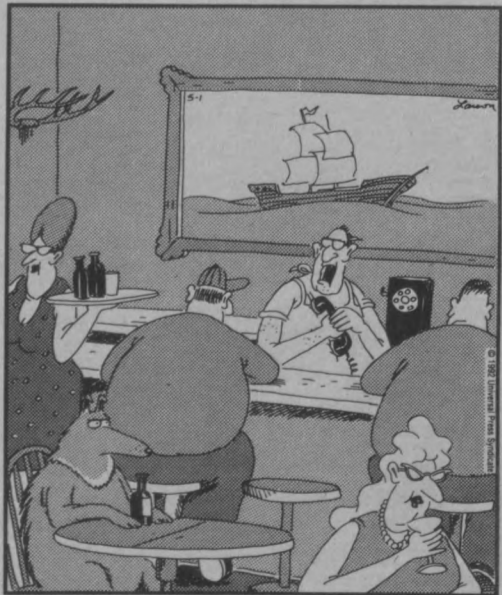

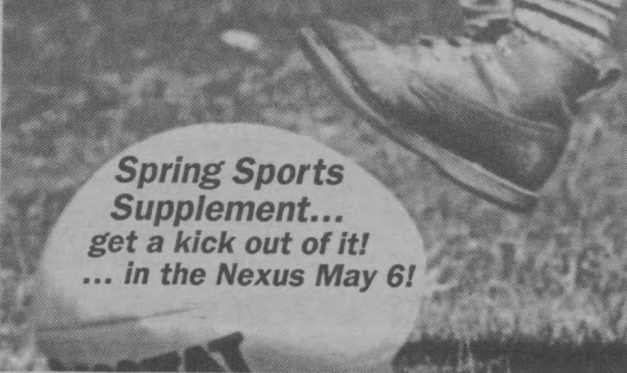

One of the best things to come out of California in the 1980s — "Choose Life" shirts and *Flashdance* notwithstanding — was California cuisine, a combination of light, delicious food and a healthy culinary pizzazz. Its popularity, on the rise nationwide, is an understandable reaction to the dark, weighty food that unjustly dominated our restaurants and kitchens of the middle 20th century.

Perhaps the most successful of the few California cuisine-themed chain restaurants is the California Pizza Kitchen. Started in 1985 by a couple of Beverly Hills lawyers, the California Pizza Kitchen has exploded with outlets all through the states — Nevadans even said "Welcome to Fabulous Las Vegas!" and put one in the Mirage Casino.

But Santa Barbara never lags far behind when an issue of trend is at hand. Our California Pizza Kitchen is located in our newest and plushest shopping center, El Paseo Nuevo, downtown.

One look at the California Pizza Kitchen and you get the basic idea of what's going on. It's a new restaurant idea, one that can't really be compared to any other, one that speaks to the cool-breeze-and-clean California ideal that we're so famous for but never really come through with.

The interior is bright and airy. Big-ceilinged and tiled in an expansive yellow-black-and-white motif, the California Pizza Kitchen has a truly unique look. This unique look goes hand in hand with the one-of-a-kind food fare they offer.

Every major culinary tradition is given a whirl on the old pizza dough. It doesn't matter whether it's old-fashioned American, fanciful Eastern, spicy Mexican, tangy Italian or some weird European deal — the California Pizza Kitchen has a big enough "slice" of so many different cultures, they could satisfy the "course" loads of the strictest ethnic food requirement.

All the pizzas come in "personal" portions, which is a relief and a delight. Can

you imagine going to a restaurant of this nature with three finicky friends and all of you agreeing on one pizza? With so many choices, let me tell you, it would be difficult indeed. An even better aspect of the single-serving pizza is that you can trade slices with the other people at your table — if you want, that is.

True to the "California" portion of their name, the California Pizza Kitchen is not without its '90s health sensibilities. They offer a number of meatless pizzas and even a couple of cheeseless pies. At the California Pizza Kitchen, you tend to eat right, in more ways than two.

But, you may be asking, is

pizza all they have? Is pizza just all they have? The answer, I may be responding, is no. They have some professional salads: fresh, crispy, tangy and potent. They have a selection of pasta dishes that would make most Italian restaurants blanch their broccoli linguini. I'm talking about — and here's where the innovation of the California

Pizza Kitchen comes into play again — some of the most daring and delicious taste combinations you have ever heard of and many you haven't.

Sure, you pay a little more than you might if you split a greasy home-delivered pie between your neighbors, but for an interesting date or a successful culinary diversion, it's certainly worth it.

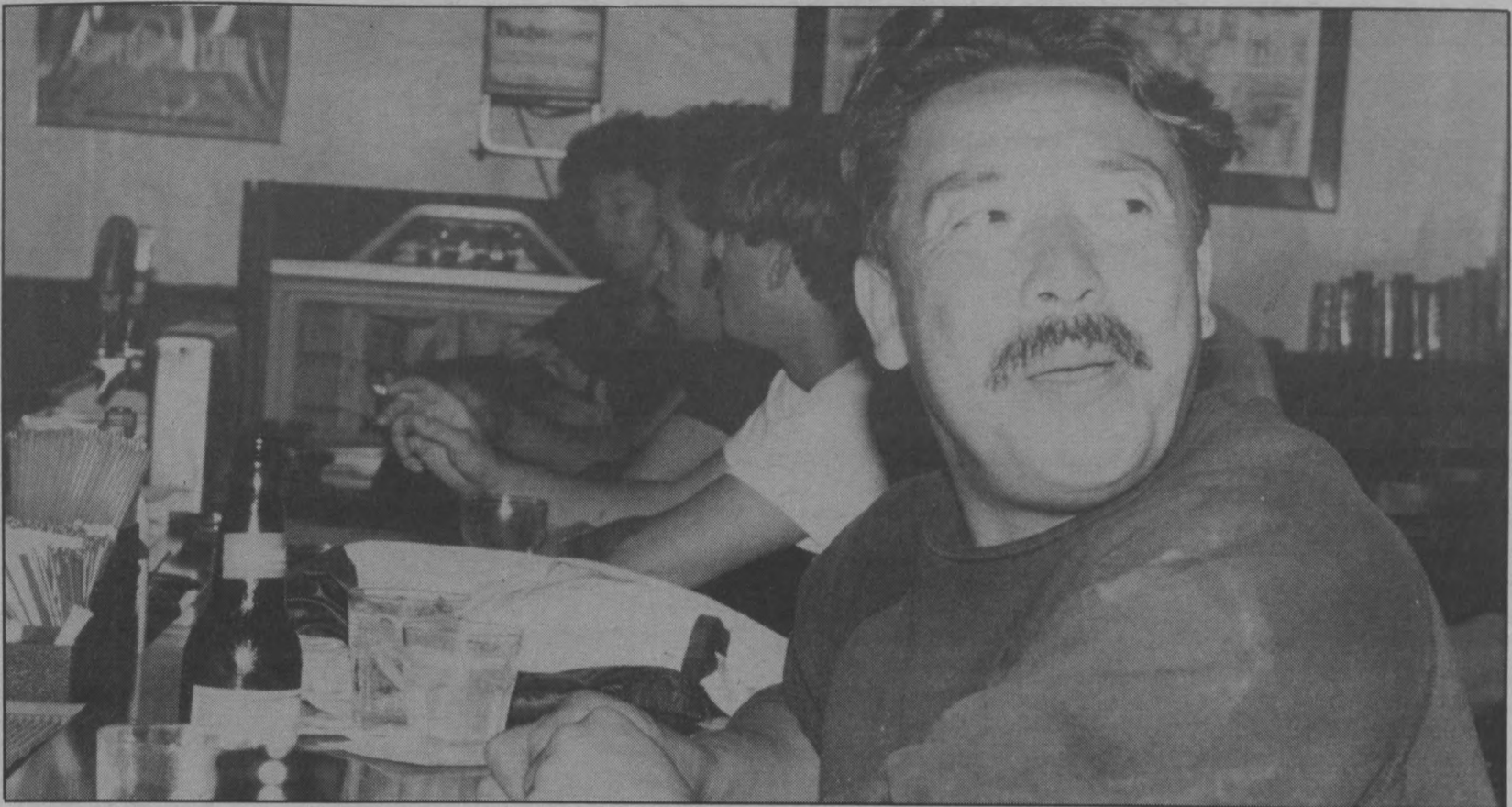
"I coulda been a suspender," Steff would slur.

This is why we have places like Monty's over on Hollister in Goleta. It's a good bar, a kind alternative to I.V. party-crashing and a fun place to spend an evening.

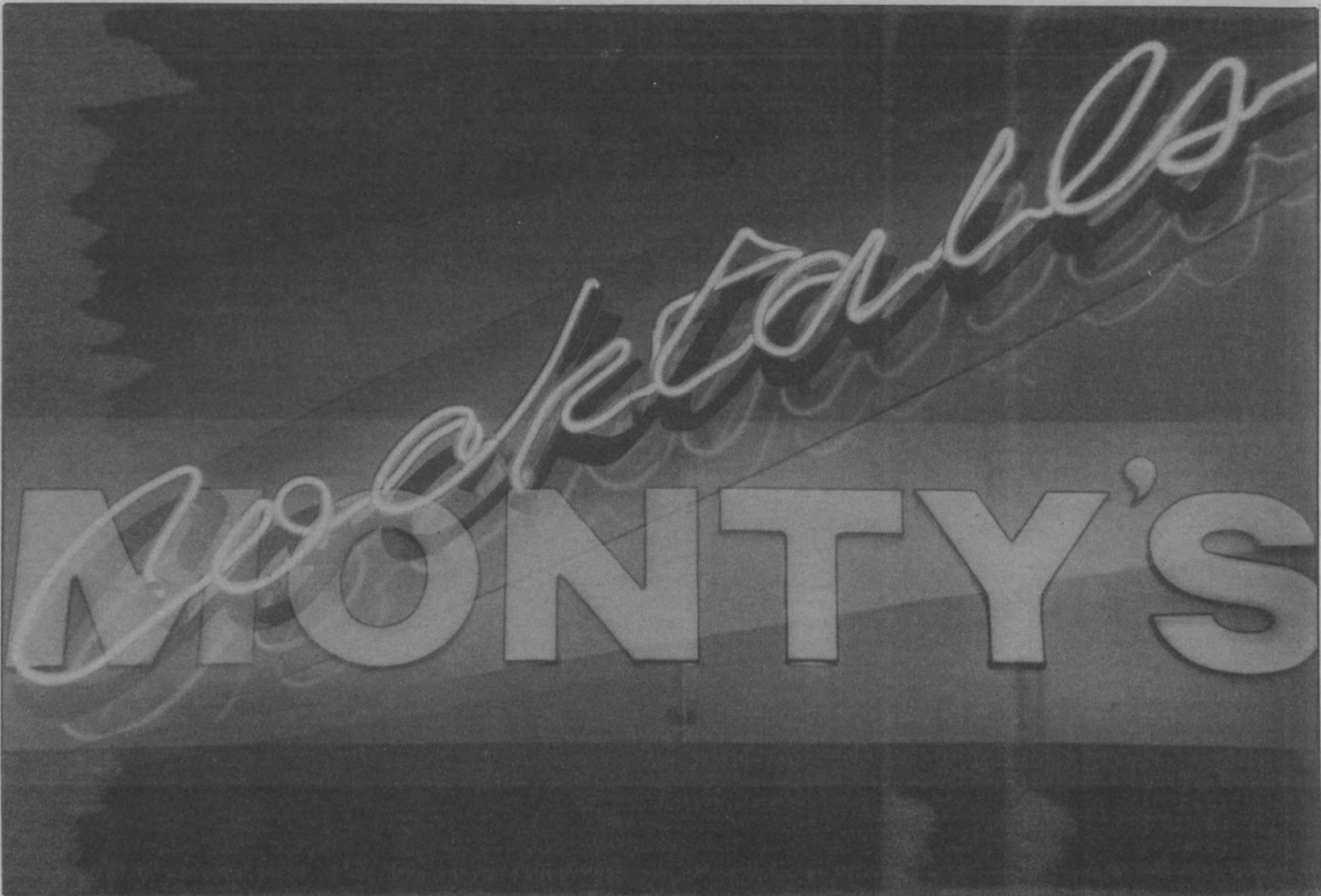

Money is no object at Monty's — the prices are so fair, you just can't object!

I would bet, and I don't think I'm going out on a limb here, that some of Monty's drink specials are the best buys in town, bar none.

Though Alex's may be famous for its Happy Hour, Mexican food lovers would be doing themselves a great

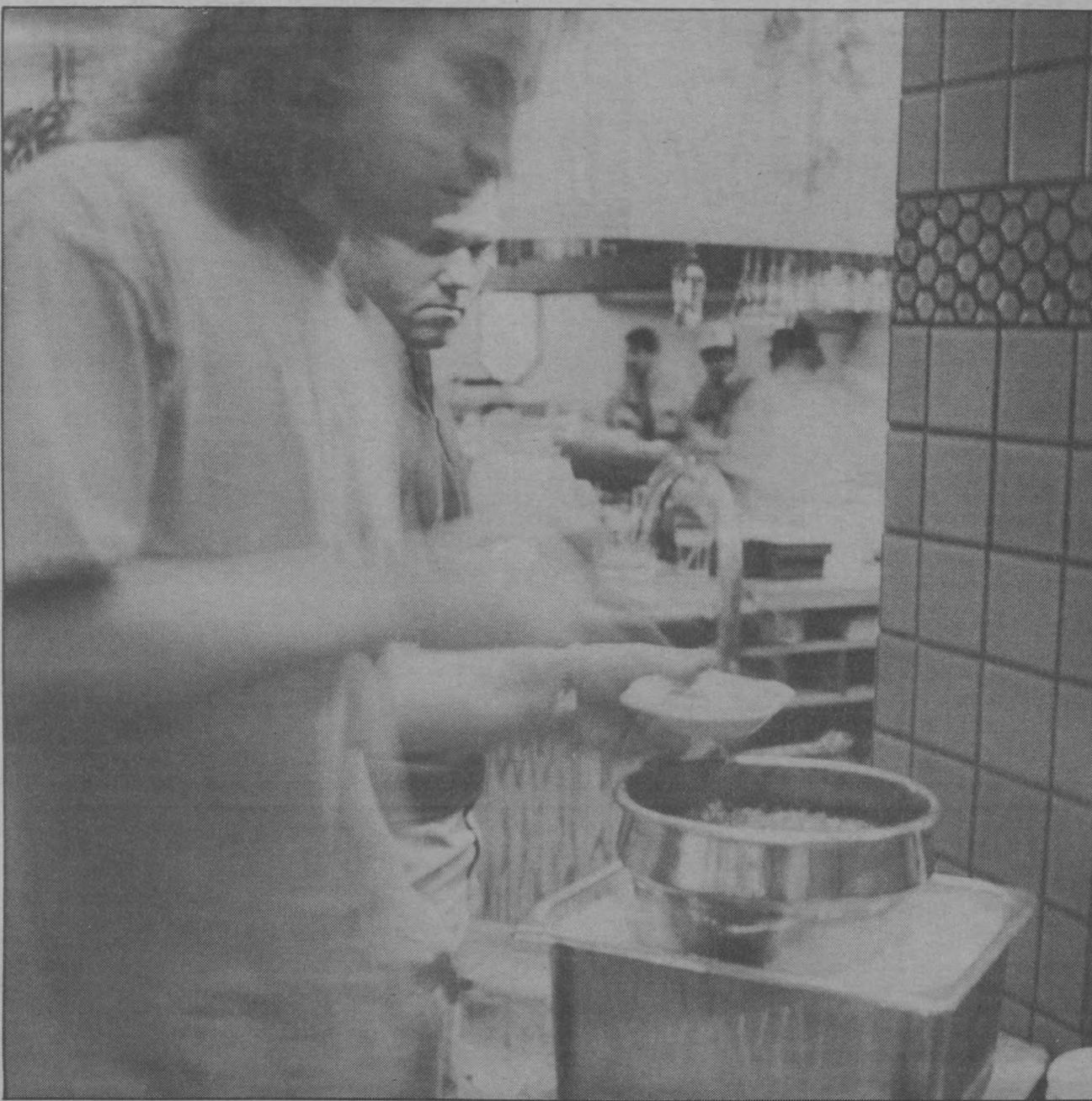
disservice if they did not return for dinner proper. The tortilla-making machine so cleverly placed in plain view of all diners just screams, "Authentic!" And when patrons finally get a bite of those fresh, hot tortillas it is clear that Alex's is not just for Happy Hour any more.

My dining experience has made me a believer. As I nursed my second glass of ice tea (the servers were amazingly attentive; my glass was never empty), I noticed the antics of two small children around the tortilla machine. They were running around it, reveling in the contraption's scientific wonderment. Or perhaps they, too, noticed that it resembled the Everlasting Gobstopper machine from that Willy Wonka film. And the product tasted just as good.

The tortillas go with anything, though it's difficult to find room for all that food after finishing four baskets of chips and salsa. (I guess I didn't need that last one.) I just didn't expect the skillet of sizzling fajitas to be so filling. When I finally wiped my skillet clean, I had that warm feeling of gluttony in my stomach. But it was good. It was Alex's.

I couldn't help but notice what other diners were eating while I was working on my fajitas. I saw a tostada so big I was shocked to learn that it wasn't described as "Grande" on the menu. So modest, these folks at Alex's. The enchiladas were equally impressive, and I couldn't help but stare at the layers of shredded beef stuffed inside with no regard for livestock conservation.

Of course, the menu runs the gamut of Mexican food,

from burritos to combination plates, appropriately called *combinaciones*. Everything at Alex's has that authentic touch, and it all

makes for tasty dining. Even if it isn't your birthday, the folks at Alex's make your day seem special. Perhaps they realize that everyday is

somebody's birthday, and they're just trying to do their part. When mine finally rolls around, it will be *feliz cumpleaños* indeed.

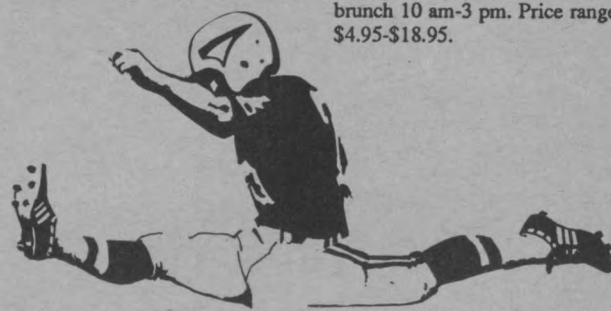

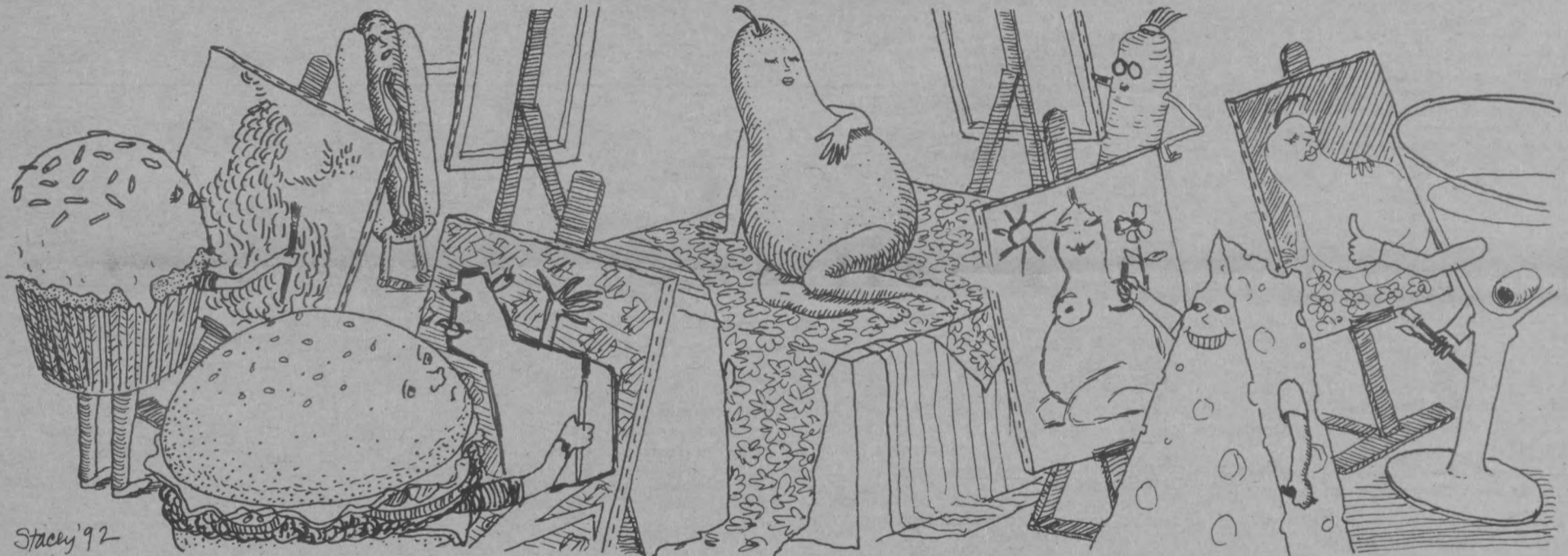
