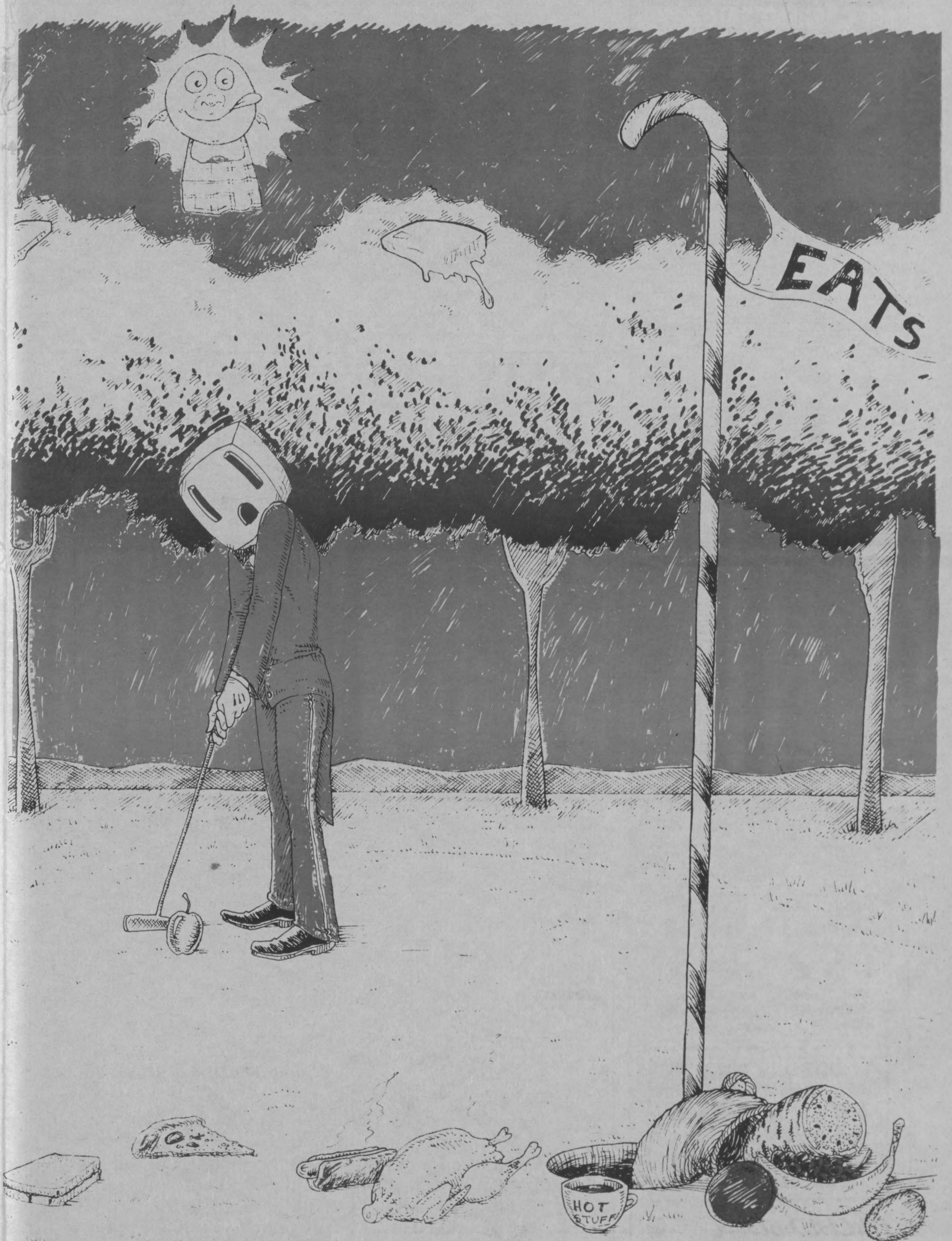

So this year the folks went all out and built a fancy spread — including three turkeys. But Holly, considering the starving children, isn't that a bit extravagant? Gentle reader, upon seeing the magnificent spread, I had the same concern. A group of Carpinteria essayists joined us and suggested we take advantage of the Castle's banquet menu, which caters to groups of six or more, but Haden and I had already decided on the shrimp/scallop special, which was served family style with soup, rice, egg rolls and my favorite — paper-wrapped chicken.

But next time I'll be sure to plan ahead — and considering the delicacies served up at China Castle, there'll be plenty of "next times" to come!

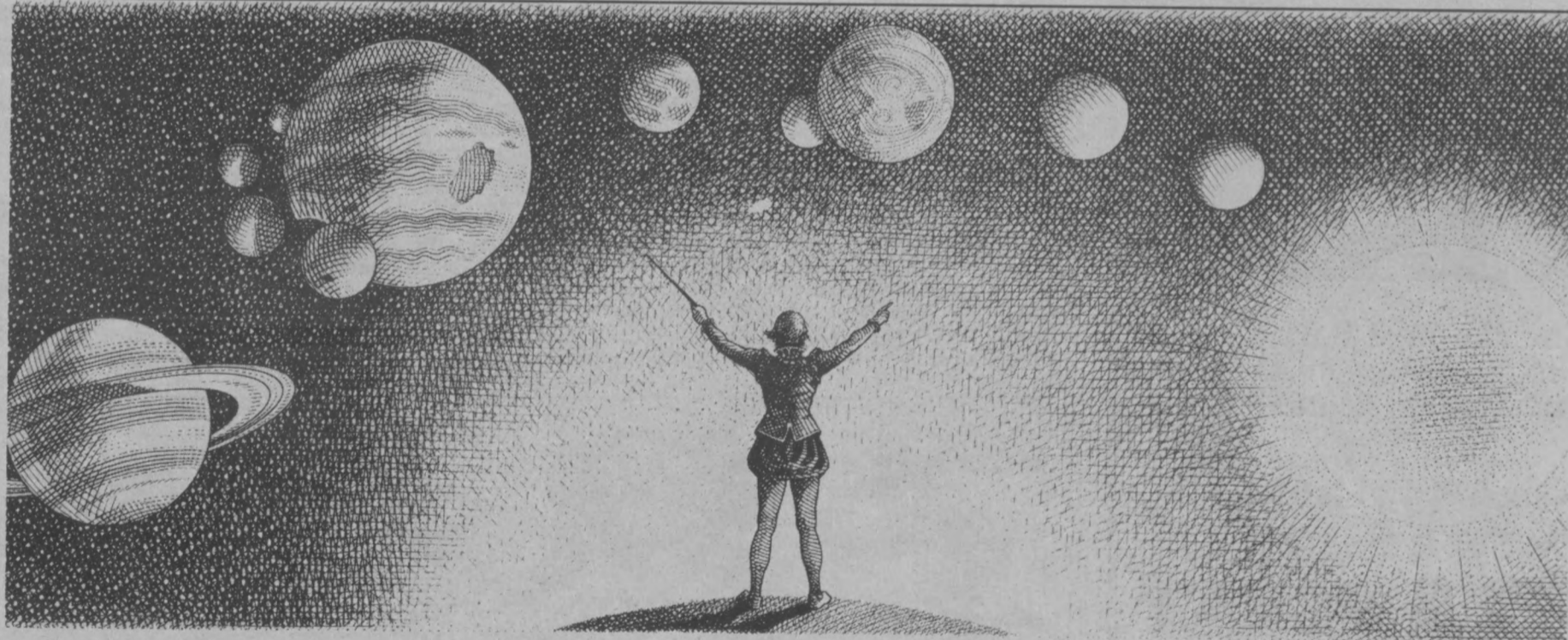
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# El Pollo Norteno: Super Mexican

El Pollo Norteno, some people argue, is reason enough for Isla Vista cityhood. Well, I don't know about that, but I must agree that they serve up some of the best food in town.

Their food is not that weird fluffy microwave food that some places in town try to pass off as "art food." No, El Pollo Norteno serves it up fresh, solid, uncompromising; a.k.a. *food*.

They've got that mesquite-grilled chicken and tri-tip, beans, great tortillas, salsa, you name it. When you go to El Pollo Norteno, they're not going to serve you up some gross thing you don't want. On the contrary, they'll give you a sizable portion of good stuff — I mean, that's *dinner*. Even in Spanish they call a meal at El Pollo Norteno *dinner*. They've even got a 99 cent beer special, with different imported and domestic beers, that will blow you down.

But all great restaurants must have myths. One that was told to me concerned four young Isla Vista residents and one Mr. Ellison Clark. It went like this:

Ellison Clark may very well be the nearest thing to a modern-day saint.

There were four Marx brothers, four travellers down the yellow brick road, four presidents since Lyndon Baines Johnson and Vietnam, four streets meeting at almost every intersection with a stoplight. Again and again history presents evidence that — whereas three is said to be a "crowd"

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—assemblies of four tend to set their sights high, aiming toward and achieving either amazing feats of comedy, the revelation of God as an impostor, the undertaking of a fruitless, devastating and undeclared "war" or spectacular automobile crashes under the blinking mechanical eyes of a traffic light.

Ellison Clark once walked the streets of Isla Vista, just as you and I do today. This is not his story, but a simple allusion to him. This is the story of four young men who set out simply to eat, but discovered something more.

One evening, Ashley, Sinister X, Valence and Billy Malicious strode into El Pollo Norteno — home of the 99-cent bottled beer — and ordered their usual, the combo plate, which offers a large portion of chicken cooked to juicy, spicy perfection and an equal portion

of tender delicious beef, accompanied by rice, a side order of beans, and enough of Isla Vista's smoothest blend of salsa to complement but not overwhelm the meal.

Having ordered, the four gentlemen moved to the back room where they found four of the 1980s' greatest contributions to the video craze. With five minutes to spare, they each positioned themselves before their favorite machine and proceeded to play. Soon, they finished their games. ...

As the four men sat down at their table, an elderly man in a brown three-piece suit walked in and proceeded to seat himself among them.

"Good food you got comin'," he told them. "Best I.V. can offer, I've always said. Old Elliot still can't resist it. Yes, old Elliot's said to frequent this place evenings. He finds it a consoling spot due to its longstanding

reputation for the most delectable and down-to-earth dining in the area. It's kind of fascinating seeing his figure still haunting this place — that is, it's fascinating knowing his story.

"He must be a regular hero to guys like you, what after he stormed the Bank of America single-handedly, walked into campus and across the lagoon. Savin' those people's lives too, all 45 of them.

The four couldn't remember a better meal, which they ate by combining the chicken, beef, beans, rice and salsa in the four complementary tor-

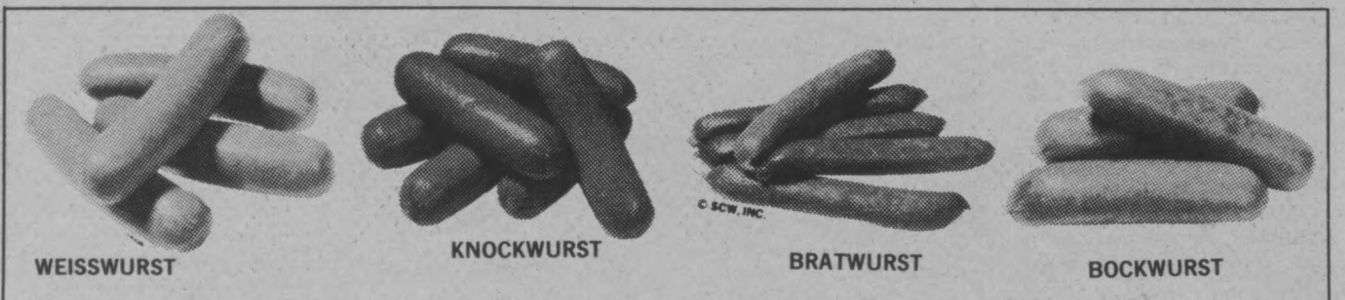
tillas. A single El Pollo Norteno combo plate more than filled them, yet left them wanting more soon.

When we got our food, Max was aghast. His chicken was so lean and tender, all he could say was, "NO FAT CHICKS." I

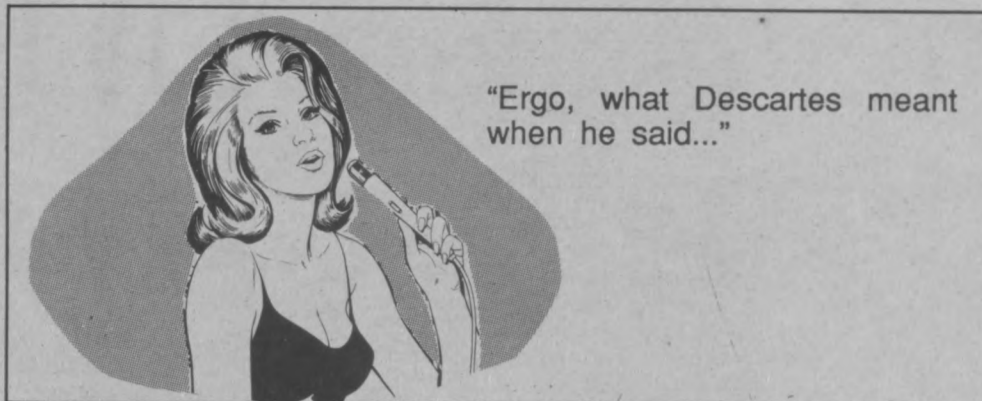

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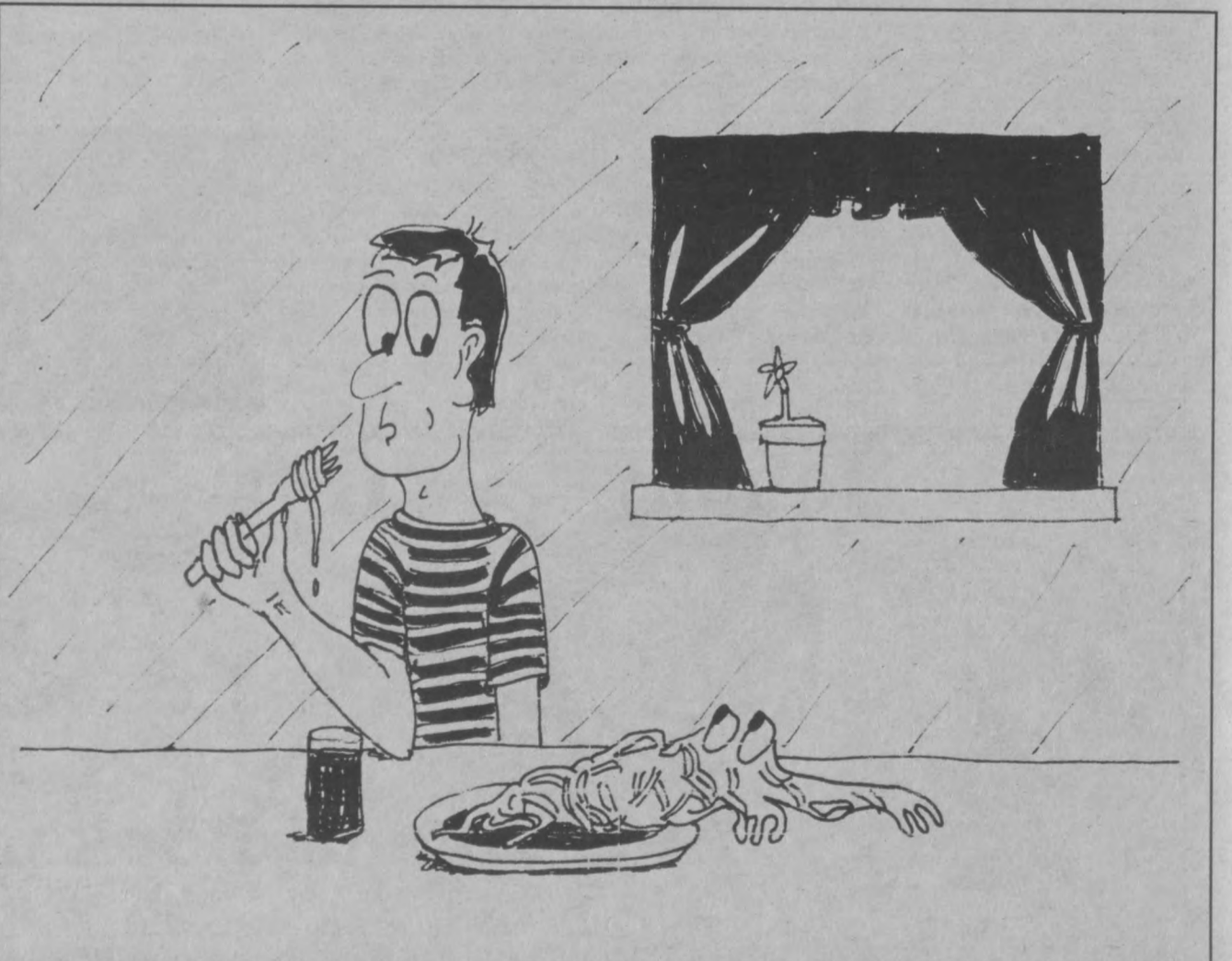
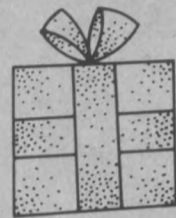

But as I was saying, I was leaving from I.V., so my first question to the friendly people in the AirBus office was whether or not they could pick me up close to home. Turns out all of their airport buses originate, and terminate, in front of I.V.'s own Dave's Market, in the very heart of this town of ours.

It seems college students travel a lot, so the AirBus has a steady stream of clientele leaving from I.V. Now I don't know too much about supply and demand, but they seem to have a good thing going on.

Since I had such an early flight it was suggested that I take the first bus of the morning, leaving at the ghastly hour of 3:45 a.m. I wasn't too happy about that, but it turned out not to be such a bad thing after all.

I loaded my luggage — well, actually the driver loaded my luggage — onto the bus, and we were off. Af-

ter embarking from Dave's, the AirBus conductor/driver made stops at the Hampton Inn on Calle Real in Goleta, the Sheraton on Cabrillo, in downtown Santa Barbara, and finally next to the Baker's Square in Carpinteria, and I somehow managed to sleep through all of it.

I woke up in Carpinteria, just before we set off on the 101 for LAX. The driver was passing out candy for the passengers, and telling us that our seats *reclined*. "Well how about that, they do recline!" I thought to myself, slinking further back in the now-comfortable chair and deeper into sleep.

If I can be perfectly frank, I am not an excellent driver. My friends will disagree, out of friendship — "Go on Charles Gomer, you're an excellent driver," — but, truth be known, my driving stinks. I'd rather have teeth pulled and shellacked than battle L.A. traffic, let alone do this battle in the early a.m. hours. So the AirBus did me an even greater service — I didn't have to drive.

Finally, let's talk economics. I was going to do a two-week tour of Burundi, and that means 13 or 14

days in the back country, not to mention 13 or 14 days in LAX's infamous long-term parking lot. At \$7 a day.

Go ahead, do the math. We're talking \$90 or \$100, not counting gas, wear and tear on the auto, oil, traffic stress, etc. Versus the AirBus: \$52 round-trip if you pay at least 24 hours in advance, or \$28 one-way.

I was in a tiff of course, with only 12 hours to go until flight time. They told me the round-trip would cost \$57 instead, or only \$33 for the one-way trip, but either way you slice it, it still beat the hell out of the parking and gas fees.

**End Note:** The Burundi trip was a blast, but all of my film turned out underexposed and the vaccines didn't work. I got my luggage at 10:50 p.m., ran outside, barely caught the last AirBus (11 p.m.) and made it back to Santa Barbara in one piece. What a trip!

The prices were cool, too — real low. The whole bill

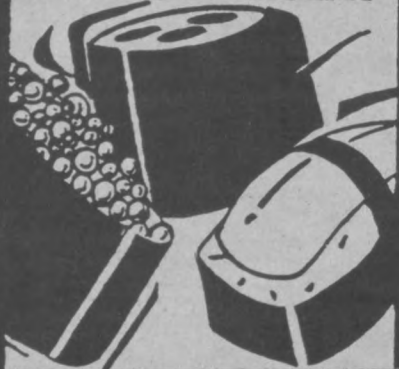

They've got fantasy. They've got Conan books, the Gor series by John Norman, lots of books with wild, colored pen and ink covers. In short, they've got all the fantasy stand-bys. And there's science fiction galore.

But it's the comic books that solidified Andromeda's place in my heart. I remember being a 12-year-old kid — if I'm honest I was still doing this at the age of 17 — and running to my neighborhood fantasy bookshop every Friday when the new comics would come in.

I'd check out the Byrne art in the "Fantastic Four," pour over the adventures of those crazy DC mutant kids in "The New Teen Titans," and I never missed the "X-

Men." These days, Frank Miller and his graphic novels seem to be all the rage, and yes, Andromeda certainly has their fair share of those. Comics might not be the store's key emphasis, but it's certainly a reason to check the place out... for old time's sake, of course.

I'm told browsing is perfectly acceptable at Andromeda, and take my word for it, there's a lot of good stuff there to check out.

So what are you waiting for? Go get some books. You are a college student now. And, if you forgot, well, the new "Spiderman" will be there on Friday.
