On January 15, 1908 at Howard University, Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Incorporated became the first Greek-lettered organization established by and for Black women. Ethel Hedgeman Lyle, along with 15 illustrious women created a legacy that has continued to impact the lives of college trained women. Since its incorporation in 1913, Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Incorporated remains true to the motto "supreme in service to all mankind."

Nu Nu Chapter was established at the University of California, Santa Barbara on June 20, 1980. The ladies of Nu Nu Chapter continuously strive toward uplifting the campus and surrounding community.

Last year Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Incorporated won the Student Organization of the Year, Undergraduate Chapter Achievement award, Community Service Award, Certificate of Appreciation and Most Active Organization here at UCSB. Some of the chapter's community service projects have been: Susan G. Komen Breast Cancer Foundation, Sickle Cell Anemia Foundation, the American Red Cross and Black Graduation Committee. We also express a commitment to community service by volunteering and/or sponsoring the following activities: Friendship Manor Volunteers, I.V. Teen Center tutoring, Nordstrom inventory volunteers, Mother's Day Carnation delivery, Thanksgiving Day baskets, clothing drives, Garth Fagan Dance Company raffle and Breast Cancer Awareness Week.

Now, 126 years later, we the sisters of Sigma Kappa here at UCSB also find ourselves dedicated to the same ideals. We are all students striving for academic excellence, helping each other along the way; we study together and acknowledge achievement and effort in school. Each year we look forward to our annual Disco Inferno, Prohibition and Violet Ball Formal date parties as well as many other social events such as TGs, Happy Hours and Exchanges with fraternities. We have several philanthropies in which we participate; Maine Sea Coast Mission toy drive, Inherit the Earth beach clean-ups, and we have Sing-A-Longs at Friendship Manor. Not only do we support other Greek philanthropy events by showing our athletic prowess on the playing field, but we also put on two events each year, Sigma Kappa Singled Out and Burrito Bash to raise money for Alzheimer's research. Each year these are two events eagerly anticipated by all Greeks, as well as the rest of the campus. On October of 1993, the seven founders of Sigma Kappa Chi formally established an Asian American Interest Sorority at the University of California, Santa Barbara. The seven discovered that the Asian American population of the UCSB campus was growing rapidly and that an organization to fulfill the needs of Asian American women was needed. These ladies shared a common desire to unify the women on campus and began the process of establishing a sorority.

With much enthusiasm and dedication, the founding mothers of Sigma Kappa Chi learned the meaning of sisterhood, respect and everlasting friendship. Their intent for the sorority was to provide everlasting sisterhood, cultural awareness in the community, and the pursuit of academic excellence. Today Sigma Kappa Chi continues these traditions.

Sigma Kappa Chi engages in both sisterhood activities as well as social. Such sisterhood activities include pledge/active retreats, monthly potucks and fun trips throughout the year, for example, one to Knottscarry Farm around Halloween. Social events include interacting with fraternities, other sororities and other campus organizations. Sigma Kappa Chi offers the chance for others to get to know the girls through a program called the "Sun Buddy Program." Through this program those who join get paired up with one member of the sorority. This gives others a chance to build friendships with the sorority. In addition, throughout the year they plan activities in which they hang out with their "Sun Buddy" as well as the sorority as a whole.

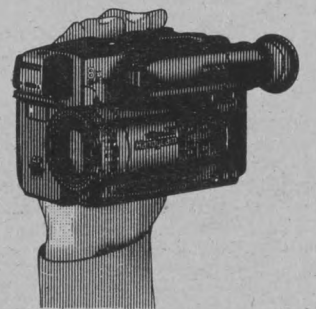

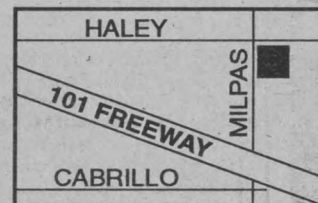
