
I am very active and "up to date" on issues that affect U.C.S.B. students on and off campus.

#### **Environmental Affairs** Board (EAB) Recycling

**Program:** Do you support continued funding of seventy-five cents (\$0.75) per AS/UCSB Membership per quarter for the EAB Recycling Program?

PRO: Since its' inception, the A.S. Recycling Program has proven itself to be one of the most valuable student groups on campus. In the past two years, this lockin has created employment for 5 student workers and offered internships as well. We have established a comprehensive recycling program including recycling over 30,000 pounds of material in a nine month period. The program has made it necessary to remove garbage dumpsters and replace them with recycling dumpsters. All in all, UCSB has gone from a 'throw away' campus to a recycling campus.

The most exciting part about A.S Recycling is yet to come. A year ago we secured a grant to purchase recycling stations for campus. Since then we have designed and are

As it is right now, there is no set deadline to appoint such needed officer, and this permits the officer in charge of such appointment to ignore the constitutional mandate of having a parliamentarian in every Legislative Council meeting. Moreover, the absence of a parliamentarian in the meetings allows inaccurate and sometime biased in-

awaiting the arrival of 60 new recycling stations for the campus. These stations are made of recycled plastic, metal and fiberglass. These stations will be spread throughout the campus and are sure to increase the amount of recyclable material recovered. We have also purchased new custodial carts, hanging paper pitches for office trash cans and indoor recycling receptacles to meet our next goal of reaching inside the buildings where large amount of paper products are discarded.
