Gauchos Sweep Long Beach, Set to Face UCLA Thursday Squad Advances to Second Round of MPSF Playoffs

The Long Beach State men's volleyball team learned an important lesson Saturday in the first round of the Mountain Pacific Sports Federation playoffs: Confidence can only get you so far.

The #6 Gauchos swept the 49ers at the Pyramid, 15-8, 15-5, 15-11, amid numerous boastings from LBSU players throughout the match and a lofty prediction from the team's head coach prior to the match.

"They were pumped up from the start," said UCSB junior outside hitter Mitch McCoy. "They were saying some stuff that really shouldn't be put in the

newspaper. Some of them

were getting personal."
The 49ers Head Coach Ray Ratelle made a statement to one newspaper that his team would win because it was playing bet-

ter and because it had better players at every position.


"That comment kind of made me mad," McCoy said. "They don't have better players playing at every

That was made obvious Saturday night when Santa Barbara controlled the entire match, save a brief stretch in game three when UCSB found itself down 10-7.

"We called a timeout and all got together and we said that we had to turn this up," McCoy said. "We couldn't give them the game because that would put them back in the

Santa Barbara won that game 15-11 to clinch the sweep, which was particularly satisfying for the Gauchos, who were still carrying memories of their three-game loss to the 49ers in mid-March.

That win may have given LBSU a false confidence heading into Saturday's match.

"You never know." UCSB Head Coach Ken Preston said. "That can happen when you crush a team in the regular season. You think that it's possible to do it again. But I don't

antly humbled afterward.

Baseball Gets Three-Game Sweep, Pounds Out 39 Runs vs. Hornets

The UCSB baseball team accomplished what it could not do for the last

three weeks — sweep a three-game series. The Gauchos (21-22 overall, 11-10 in the Big West) beat the Sacramento State Hornets 15-6 Sunday. UCSB also took the first two games of the series, 15-5 and 9-7, respectively.

"We finally got [a sweep]," said Santa Barbara Head Coach Bob Brontsema. "We've been getting better and better. Getting the sweep is the final piece of the

In the squad's last three series, UCSB was able to win the first two games but failed to get the sweep. But this week on Senior Day, the team made sure it wasn't going to happen again.

"It was an emotional day," Brontsema said. "Not everyone had an allergy today, there were some tears out there.

The Gaucho offense certainly wasn't going to be sick Sunday. Led by junior shortstop Michael Young, UCSB jumped ahead early against the Hornets (13-31, 5-16), scoring nine runs in the third inning. The lead was 11-1 by the end of the offensive explosion, and Santa Barbara cruised the rest of the way. All seniors got to play a role in the game.

"We definitely wanted to make a good one for the seniors," said Young, who went 3-5 with five RBIs. "It's a great win

Young has been on fire as of late, hitting a home run in each of the three games this weekend. He now leads the Gauchos

"Nothing has really changed for me," Young said. "Even when I was slumping, I knew I could do it. You just have to keep swinging the bat. It's just the right time of

the season for me to step up a notch."
Young is now hitting at a .374 clip overall with 43 RBIs. He also leads the squad with a .465 on-base percentage

Senior first baseman David Willis, sophomore catcher Justin Lehr and sophomore third baseman Justin Gemoll each contributed two hits Sunday.

Junior right-hander Seth Bean gutted out six innings to earn his first victory since Feb. 4.

"I felt like I had my stuff and it was working," Bean said. "It's been frustrating in the middle of the year for me, but our pitching staff has played really well."

Bean struck out 11 batters while giving up 12 hits and one walk. He pitched a total of six innings before giving way to senior Jorvic Salazar.

Salazar tossed three strong innings of scoreless ball to earn his first save of the

The good overall pitching performance Sunday follows two other superb outings by Gaucho pitchers this weekend.

Friday, senior Bryan Noyes pitched a
