# **Huffington Serves Time in UCSB Prison** After Puffing Tons; Wife Bails Him Out

Former Congressman Michael Huffington was arrested by campus police Friday after burning a citation for marijuana possession at a hemp legalization rally in Storke Plaza. He was released after his wife

paid lots of money.

Huffington, still on probation for offensive behavior following the November 1994 election, was cited minutes after lighting a marijuana cigarette and puffing on it in front of hundreds who had gathered in support of the con-

"Hey, it's a plant. How can they make a plant illegal?" Huffington said after the citation was issued. "Let's show them how we think of their laws ... well, come on every-body, spark up!" He then used the burning ticket to light another joint and was arrested. "We usually try to be pretty lenient at these things — free-dom of speech and all that — but this was flagrant and we

but this was flagrant and we had to do something," said campus Police Chief John MacPherson. "Dear God, he had a bong the size of a grain

Huffington said he stood by

his actions and would continue the fight for legalization of the green goodness.

# Chamberlin Wins Vote in 3rd District Election

■ Lame Duck Wallace Refuses to Give Up Seat

Santa Ynez rancher Willy Santa Ynez rancher Willy Chamberlin was declared Santa Barbara County 3rd District supervisor Sunday with 51.6 percent of the vote, but a recount and impassioned objections from political rivals are threatening his acquisition of the post.

Chamberlin will assume the seat in January, provided he prevails in a possible recount and current Supervisor Bill Wallace

current Supervisor Bill Wallace unchains himself from his desk in the county administration office.

"You can't make me leave!" Wallace cried hours after hearing the results. "I haven't served 19 years to watch that cattle man step in and pave over all my work — recount! Recount!"

Because Chamberlin's vote tally just exceeds the majority needed for outright victory, a recount could force a November run-off between the rancher and his closest contender, Gail Marshall, who garnered 24.7 percent

# **Chancellor Explodes With Uncharacteristic Emotions**

A peaceful student-faculty luncheon turned ugly Sunday when Chancellor Henry T. Yang launched into a unexpected tirade criticizing students, faculty

Yang, known for his carefully measured statements and caumeasured statements and cau-tion in addressing controversial issues, ripped Associated Stu-dents President Leo Treyzon as a "greedy opportunist" and de-nounced faculty members as "pencil-pushing, do-nothing leaches" leeches.'

"So everyone wants to come to another god-awful function and feel good about them-selves," said the embittered chancellor. "I am sick to helf of the students, faculty and staff of

this university. Faculty research? What — the platypus? Student interests? They'd be taking a step forward if they were interested in anything beyond beer and that show, um, Beavis and Asshead.

"Where are the perks of this job?" he asked as wife Dilling nodded approvingly. "The dental plan sucks, and every year you ship me to hellholes like Garden Grove and Fresno to recruit more spoiled brats. You know what, I am sick to hell of

every one of you."

Yang had particularly harsh criticism for student leaders in attendance, who he said were in government only to get their tuition paid free and pad their re-sumes. A visibly shaken Treyzon said he was taken aback by the

# Mobil Has New Hopes for Oil Rig Near Residence Hall

Still hoping for a chance to tap offshore oil reserves from a land-based site along the Isla Vista coastline, Mobil Oil Corp. unveiled a new project Friday, dubbed Spillview.

The project, similar to the re-cently scrapped Clearview development, would be located behind San Nicolas Residence Hall, near the campus lagoon, according to Shauna Clarke, Mobil public affairs adviser.

As with Clearview, the new project would use a 175-foot-tall drill rig to tap offshore oil reserves currently accessed by the company's Platform Holly, which would be dismantled if Spillview is approved.

Critics were quick to attack

Critics were quick to attack the project, calling it another at-tempt by developers to exploit the local environment.

"It looks like Clearview, it sounds like Clearview and it stinks like Clearview. This is just Clearview with a new name. I don't know what kind of shit Mobil's trying to pull, but it sounds like someone over there has been smoking too much crack," said recent graduate Brent Foster during a break from monitoring native grass disturbances.

Foster said plans are already set to bring Toad the Wet Sprocket on campus for a benefit show to raise opposition to Spillview.

Mobil concedes there are si-milarities between the two projects, but insists Spillview is a worthwhile pursuit, according

"We admit, it is an identical project, but we changed the name because of the negative connotations associated with

# Kato, Clinton Square Off in Campaign

LOS ANGELES (AP) President Clinton received a surprise challenge for the Democratic presidential nomination Monday when O.J. Simpson trial figure Brian "Kato" Kaelin announced his leap into the race.

Kaelin's decision to vie for the Democratic nomination comes as an unexpected nuance in a campaign which had previously been viewed as an one-man race to the 1996 campaign.

"I thought that, like, if Clinton was, like, trying to get the president job or something, I might as well go for it, you know what I mean?" Kaelin stated early Monday.

Speaking from his own personal tanning bed in Hollywood, Kato removed his ultraviolet shades long enough to enumerate his presidential qualifications.

"Hey, man, I was the vice treasurer of my high school surf club a few years back, at least until I started breaking into the

bank to get money to impress the babes," he said. "And hey, like, I can do the international relations thing. Tijuana and Cabo are my, like, second homes. Entienden, compadre dudes?"

Clinton initially expressed bemusement at the notion that a challenger such as Kaelin could however, faded upon learning that Kato had called him an "old cracker" and not only vowed to replace him in the White House, but to "snag that fox Hillary" referring to first lady Hill-ary Rodham Clinton, who, Kaelin proclaimed to reporters, "needs a real man, not some beached whale

"You know, I can't tell them apart," remarked GOP contender Bob Dole.

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# Berkeley Docs Make Der Fuhrer's Clone Reality

BERKELEY (AP) — Two University of California scientists believe their three-year efforts have finally paid off, and that they now have the resour-



ces to create a living, breathing Hitler clone.

Geneticists Emile Schaupphausen and Helmut van Bulow beamed at a press conference Friday as they unveiled their prototype for the clone.

"This is an accomplishment unmatched by any-thing since the 1940s," said van Bulow. "We are carrying out the kind of research that has always

been called for by the UC's master race ... I mean master plan."

Opponents to the program from across the academic spectrum have peppered the plan with criticisms, calling it "un-necessary" and "possibly the worst idea of all time."

"I'm not sure exactly what the purpose of a living, breathing Hitler clone would be," said Harvard biologist Lyndon Mamet. "But it would be unfair to pass judgment on the scientists' research before we see their results."

Adolf Hitler, leader of Germany's Third Reich, was arguably the most evil human being of all time. In his megalomaniacal quest for power, Hitler tore Europe apart and killed millions before committing suicide more than 50 years

ago.

The study continues a
Berkeley tradition of supporting what some call socially irredeemable re-search: Two Berkeley scientists wrote The Bell Curve, a book claiming blacks are stupider than whites, and a Berkeley professor is responsible for a theory that claims irresponsible use of hard drugs - predominantly by homosexuals — is the cause of AIDS.

Schaupphausen said he disagreed with academics and reporters at the press conference who suggested public enthusiasm may be low at the prospect of a new, 1990s Hitler.

"Fools, can't you see? This research is vital to the survival of the great white ... um, piles of paper that tended,"

for posterity," he said. The geneticists are developing the clone from samples discovered in the basement of failed Repu-blican presidential contender Pat Buchanan's Virginia home. Buchanan said he did not know what the dictator's cells were doing there, but wished the scientists luck on their efforts.

Buchanan's remarks immediately fueled Washington pundits' speculation that the columnist might select the clone as a running mate if he seeks an independent bid

for the presidency.
"Berkeley and Buchanan will restore America to the xenophobic, militiaobsessed nation our founding fathers in-tended," said a source will document our efforts close to the campaign.

# **Charles Calls Diana Royal** Faker in Their Sexual Life

LONDON (AP) -Never had it, never will. Or, at least, that's what Prince Charles is saying about his soon-to-be exwife, Diana.

The heir to England's royal throne told members of the press Saturday that



during the 11 years of living together as man and wife, Princess Diana never once experienced orgasm during sexual relations.

"She'd thrash and moan and groan and grab onto my ears," he told the shocked crowd of reporters, "but the entire time she was just pretending. A

man knows, you see.
"Now Camilla, there's a real woman," he continued, referring to longtime flame Camilla Parker-Bowles. "When we consummate our love, it's so genuine that we've drowned out Big Ben on occasion."

The princess, whose passionate extramarital affairs have been splashed across the covers of publications from Time magazine to the National Enquirer, expressed contempt for her husband's public revelations.

"All I have to say is, what kind of a man would brag to the public about being unable to satisfy his wife?" she stated. "Camilla can have him.

"And of course I grabbed onto his ears," she added. "They're far larger and more sexually stimulating than any of his other vital organs."

"Usage of overly complicated phraseology in the de-scription of the issue under discussion will additionally obfuscate the reading material, thus enhancing the perceived ex-pertise of the orator who is engaging in narration of the given verbiage."

"Reading audiences look for familiar patterns, and not necessarily for the text within those patterns," said Dr. Beavis de-Butthead of This Sucks Medical Center in Wherever -the- Hell, Ill. "They tend to lend an almost reverent credence to the media source and often follow any instructions it issues."


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# Book Claims Gov. Wilson Shot JFK

Nihilist: Dr. Acuña, no one can question your conspiracy theorist credentials — for the last six years you have blamed the UC for an elaborate




A controversial new book claims this photo of tough ex-Marine Gov. Pete Wilson proves he shot JFK.

The Isla Vista Recreation and Park District finally came together behind a common goal —


taking over I.V.

The five IVRPD directors, who bitterly disagree on nearly every issue, united Sunday under a banner of pride, greed and ambition. They declared martial law in I.V. and captured the seaside town after a brief struggle.
"We whine and squab-

ble like 5-year-olds every meeting — and for what? A park district is small potatoes," said Brad Hufschmid, new secretary of state. "Now when we whine for hours, people have to care."

# British Beef Causes Campus Brain Deterioration

County health officials are blaming an outbreak of the so-called "mad cow disease" for a rash of illnesses that struck Francisco Torres residents last month.

The disease, formally known as bovine spongi-form encephalopathy, has made headlines across the globe since British health experts disclosed that 10

people have died from eating infected cows.

The malady kills victims over several years by tearing holes in their brain tissue, a symptom of the disease that slowed the investigation.

"We weren't sure whether the holes in the brains of some F.T. residents were caused by 'mad cow disease' or simply smoking an excess of clove cigarettes," said Santa Barbara County Health Inspector Alan Chovril.

"Apparently, a lot of the kids in there smoke them to cope with their dreary living environment."

Officials originally blamed an outbreak that had afflicted nearly 30 F.T. residents on food poison-ing from eating in the residence hall's cafeteria. But the discovery of tainted beef forced them to change their minds, according to Chovril.

"After investigating the apparent food poisoning incident last February, we

discovered a load of beef product hidden in F.T.'s basement," he said. "It turned out to be from Britain, which, as far as I'm concerned, means 'mad

In an attempt to cut costs and still provide satisfying meals, F.T.'s kitchen staff purchased British beef with slightly expired "sell by" dates, according to Francisco Torres General Manager Kent

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




Of course, some of you reading this may be bemoaning the potential loss of our town's most raging party block. But fear



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

phen Nakashima. While most of the dead regents expired from prolonged exposure to them-selves, recently found to be fatal by a team of UC Berkeley parasitologists, others died of unnatural causes, according to von Neufschwansteinberg.

"Vard Connerly vas found to haf a rare condition, globocardiotomyitis, vich left all his organs vor-king except his brain and heart," he said.

Johnson was the victim of a freak accident, when during a trip to Mexico to "get to know those nice Spanish people" last sum-mer, the extreme heat melted the plastic mechanism that supports her constant ebullient smile and turned her into a formless mass.

"Like a puddle she vas," von Neufschwansteinberg

Because most of the deceased had been dead for quite a few years, many of the bodies were in various states of decay when they came into the office Fri-day, said von Neufschwansteinberg's nurse,

"They were decomposing all over the place," he said. "Ears here, toes there — it was a mess."

While many of the regents have been unfazed by their deaths, Kolligian, who kicked the bucket

two years ago, believes the new revelation may impair his duties as a board member.

"This will seriously hurt my clout in getting unqualified students into UCLA,"

Bagley, who bought the farm shortly after he was appointed to the board by then-Gov. George Deuk-mejian, was pleased with the bad bill of health.

"This is great," he said.
"Now I'll have time to tour the country with my poodle show, the Bagley-Keene Act."

Atkinson, who himself has one foot in the grave, does not believe the deaths will affect the regents' performance.

"It's not such a big deal," he said. "They never really did anything worthwhile anyway. Look at [Board Chair] Burgener—you think he ever kept order? Psh! As if."

Von Neufschwansteinberg has given the dead regents the go-ahead to continue in their posts, despite their deadness. "Who de hell cares?" he said. Clark, who was actually

buried in 1982, was unavailable for comment.
Some of the living were

mildly startled by the news. "Wow," said Regent Meredith Khachigian, who is still breathing but whose oxygen supply to her brain is quite low. "And all these years I just thought Nakashima was napping.'

Living Regent Ralph C. Carmona was outraged by the deaths. But because Carmona is only an alumni rep, his opinion is irrelevant to any action before the board.

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




