Can Gauchos Topple Walls of Troy?

Stage Set For Super SC Series

Advancing into the most awesome and exciting series ever to be staged in the 49 year history of UCSB baseball, the Gauchos hope to conquer the impossible dream this weekend as they challenge the University of Southern California for the right to represent the West Coast in the College World Series next month in Omaha, Nebraska.

Few UCSB athletic events — if any at all — have ever assumed such classic proportions as this one, which pits the underdog Gauchos against the two-time defending national champion Trojans in a best-of-three series showdown which opens tomorrow afternoon at 2 p.m. on the Campus Diamond.

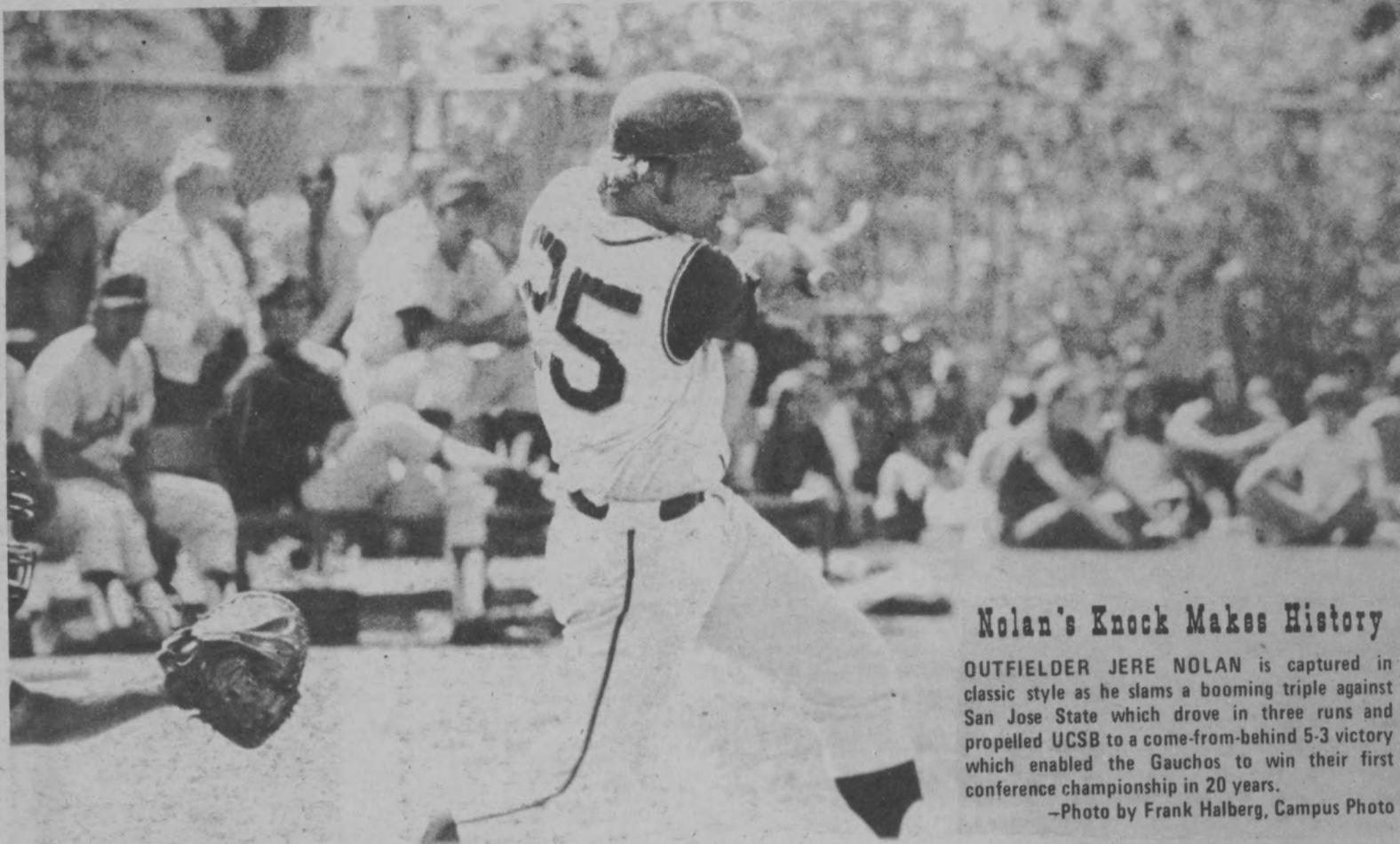
Play resumes again on Sunday at 1 p.m., and if needed, a third game will start after a 20 minute rest.

Additional bleachers have been brought in to accommodate an expected over-flow crowd, including the traditional throng of Trojan followers due here from Los Angeles.

In accordance with NCAA policy, student tickets will be sold for \$1 with general admission seats on sale for \$2. The athletic ticket office in Robertson Gymnasium will be open until 5 p.m. today, tomorrow from 9-12 noon and a special campus diamond box office will be open on Sunday from 11 o'clock on.

UCSB coach Dave Gorrie, who piloted the Gauchos to their first conference pennant in 20 years, has announced that Mark French will open against the Trojans tomorrow with Rick Dierker tabbed for duty in Sunday's 1 p.m. game.

French (5-2), will be racing USC ace Greg Widman (13-2), whose only two losses of the year came at the hands of UCSB. Dierker (8-2) will go up against Randy Scarberry (10-3) on Sunday, but Gorrie made no announcement regarding a starting pitcher for the third game, "because we won't know who will be ready until then," the coach commented.

Against Santa Clara one week ago, a Bronco runner took off too soon from third on a sacrifice fly and was thrown out. Some blamed the loss of that critical run on the base coach, but don't believe it.

GaUCHO Bonanza! Five Dominate All-League

Five members of UCSB's 10th ranked baseball club were named to the All-Pacific Coast Athletic Association first team which was released today by conference commissioner Jess Hill.

Honored were outfielders Steve Ross (for the second year) and Paul Lee, infielder Tony Torres, catcher Dave Kuehn and pitcher Rick Dierker. First baseman Scott Brown and pitcher Mark French were named to the league's second unit.

Such Gaucho all-star domination was unprecedented, and head coach Dave Gorrie heralded the bonanza, "as a tremendous tribute not only to the individuals concerned, but to our entire team which has contributed so greatly to our success this year."

Gorrie, along with his PCAA coaching colleagues, selected the all-league teams earlier this week while attending a closed door meeting at the conference headquarters in Los Angeles.

"Our players selected should be proud that they were thought so highly of by the other

coaches," Gorrie commented. "All candidates are carefully judged and discussed thoroughly, and I was overjoyed with the results."

Ross, Lee and Dierker are all seniors, Kuehn is a sophomore and Torres is a freshman, "which is a significant honor for this young man," Gorrie remarked.

Lee was the league's second leading batter with a .397 average and the senior from San Rafael led the PCAA in runs batted in with 14.

Torres was the sixth ranked conference hitter (.371), and was named the all-league utility man for his fine play at both second and third base.

Ross was cited for his "all around excellence at both the plate and in the field" and the team captain's leadership was also acknowledged by the coaches, according to Gorrie.

Kuehn was rated as the finest defensive catcher in the league, while Dierker's PCAA record of 4-1 speaks for itself.

Swattin' Sven Ostrom, Pride of Sierra City

Sierra City near Lake Tahoe has great significance in California history as an important center for the old mining of the forty-niners. For the UCSB baseball team, Sierra City served a much more vital role — for it was there the Gauchos' "fourth outfielder," Sven Ostrom, was born and raised.

Attending Roseville High School near Sacramento, Ostrom excelled in football, basketball, baseball and track, earning many all-conference and MVP honors. The 6'1", 215 lb. senior's outstanding athletic record continued during his two years at Sierra Jr. College where his sports performances gained him all-league recognition in football and baseball, along with MVP first baseman laurels.

Choosing Santa Barbara on the recommendation of high school coach, John Frodahl, who also played under head coach Dave Gorrie, "Niner" has been an essential member of the Gaucho squad.

Statistically, Ostrom's overall record seems fair — but his .274 mark includes three homeruns and seven doubles (second highest of the team) and he shares title for most triples with Paul Lee at four apiece.

What is most significant however is the history major's .444 league batting

average which describes his real importance to this year's championship club — that of the clutch hitter. In slugging percentage he is second only to Lee (.550) with a .526 total.

"Some people have the ability to come off the bench and do well; and the thing about Sven is when he isn't playing he's still working at it — he's always prepared to play," observed Gorrie.

"I enjoy coming in on a clutch situation," explained Ostrom, "I feel the pressure to perform makes me concentrate much better."

Dynamic Duo Make Great Gaucho Fans

A mutual love of sports discovered a decade ago sparked a life-long friendship — and blessed Gaucho baseball with two of its greatest and most dedicated fans.

John Philip Womble III and Lefty Nied have been ardent UCSB supporters for the past four years. So faithful has their attendance been that a game just wouldn't seem the same without Phil's constant wild shouts of encouragement from the stands or Lefty's sharp wit keeping everyone on their toes.

Phil, UCSB's official baseball historian, is a ten year member of Hillside House, a cerebral palsy center located in Santa Barbara. Although affected with this disorder of the central nervous system which has confined him to a wheelchair and caused a speech handicap, Phil's alert mind and inflectional sense of humor far overrule any physical defects.

Lefty, born in 1899, has a past chock full of amazing, exciting experiences including being a barnstorming airplane daredevil. After serving in World War I, Nied began playing semi-pro ball for the Detroit Fire Department, "Long before any of these guys were even born" he observed. A pitcher at first, he ended his diamond career at first base after pitching his arm out in a game in a fit of temper.

The Nields met Phil through his mother in 1962 while they were managing the San Roque Motel, where Mrs. Womble stayed one time during a visit.

Phil's duty as historian consists of gathering and compiling all articles concerning the team and their games printed in the Santa Barbara News-Press. This is a painstaking time-consuming task involving clipping each article out of the newspaper and pasting it into a scrapbook type notebook.

Baseball has always been Phil's first sports love since he was 13 when his father, Admiral John Philip Womble Jr., taught him the game on the blackboard.

Immediate praise for this year's championship squad was voiced by both of them. "It's a great credit for the Gauchos to be having such a fine baseball year," expounded Phil. "They've got a wonderful team — they just don't quit — somebody always comes through," Lefty concurred.

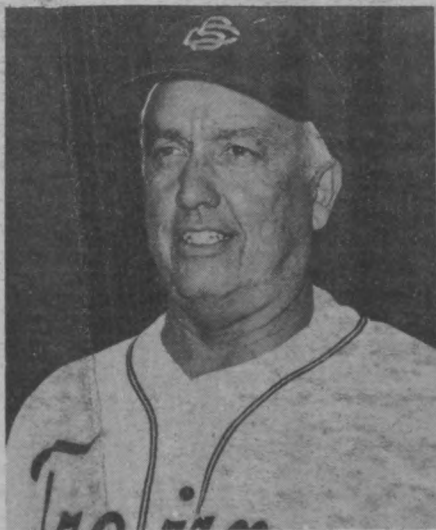
With fans like Lefty and Phil, it's not hard to see why.

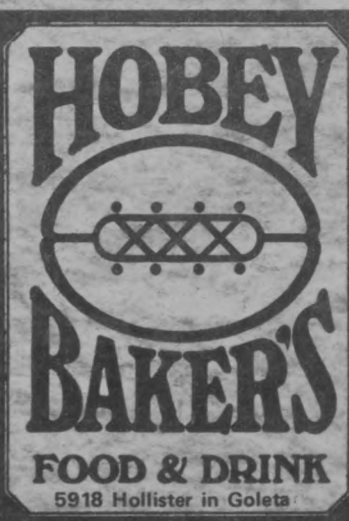
