The floors of the Thunderdome are spotless after a weekend of sweeps as the #9 UCSB women's volleyball team defeated Nevada in three games on Friday night and Utah State in three games on Saturday night.

The Gauchos (18-3 overall, 8-2 in the Big West Conference) jumped off to another quick start, defeating Nevada (13-7, 6-3) 15-2 in both games one and two on Friday. In game three the Wolfpack seemed to regroup and put up more of a fight, yet still fell to Santa Barbara 15-13 in the final game.

"We struggled with a few of our techniques," senior middle blocker Michelle Christ said of game three. "We got kind of sloppy and just let them back into the game.

Sophomore middle blocker Jutta Weissenborn led the way for Santa Barbara with 23 kills and 10 digs, and made only one error on 30 swings for a .733 hitting percentage. Senior outside hitter Roberta Gehlke pitched in with 10 kills and 14 digs. Sophomore setter Brooke Rundle also had 14 digs, and 65 assists as well. Christ chipped in with 13 kills as the Gauchos out-hit the Wolfpack .426 to .212 for the match.

On Saturday, Santa Barbara faced


Utah State and had results similar to the victory the previous night, sweeping the Aggies in three games. However, Santa Barbara's firepower dropped compared to the Nevada match, as it hit at only a .240 clip against the Aggies.


"Honestly, we didn't play our best," UCSB Head Coach Kathy Gregory said. "Our middles didn't get into the game until later on and then we made too many offensive errors."

In game one, Santa Barbara easily disposed of Utah in just over ten minutes in a 15-5 bloodletting, but was challenged by a recharged Aggie team in game two. Utah stayed within striking distance throughout the second frame, getting as close as 13-11, but just could not catch Santa Barbara, losing 11-15. In the final game, the Gauchos were ahead 11-5 before Utah called a timeout. However, the Aggies could not fight their way back into the game as they did in game two, and the Gauchos went on to a 15-5 win.

Santa Barbara was led by Gehlke, who posted 12 kills on the night. Senior outside hitter Charlene Conley and Christ had eight kills each.

"This was a good match," Conley said. "Now we're looking forward to this week's match with Cal Poly, since we haven't beaten them. So now we are going to prepare for a good match against them.'



Center Out With Stress Fracture


The UCSB women's basketball team encountered a setback this week when Gaucho center Nicole Greathouse injured her left foot. The 6'2" junior will be sidelined for four to six weeks with a stress fracture of the fifth metatarsal.

Despite losing a key component to his lineup, UCSB Head Coach Mark French was happy that the injury was detected before it became worse, and remains optimistic for his team.

"Obviously we are upset about losing Nicole for these upcoming weeks," he said. "But we are glad that we caught the problem early and we expect to have her back at full strength in six weeks. We are confident that our team will be able to compensate for the loss of such a valuable player."

However, the loss of Greathouse will be felt. The Ventura native averaged 7.5 points and 7.2 rebounds last season as she started in 29 of UCSB's 30 games.


