UCSB Smacks NMSU, North Texas in 'Dome

The #4 UCSB women's volleyball team notched two Big West Conference wins last weekend in about the same amount of time it takes to watch a movie.

The Gauchos took care of Big West stepping stones New Mexico State and North Texas in straight games last Friday and Saturday nights in the Thunderdome. Santa Barbara raised its record to 18-2 overall and 7-1 in the Big West.

Santa Barbara sliced through the NMSU Roadrunners with razor-like sharpness and coldblooded ef-

now defeated the Roadrunners in 36 consecutive games dating back to 1991.

Junior Charlene Conley led the Gauchos in kills with 13 and hit at .474 clip despite playing with a cold that has run through the Santa Barbara roster like lice through a kindergarten class. Junior Roberta Gehlke finished the evening with 12 kills and a .545 hitting percentage as well as leading the team in digs with eight.

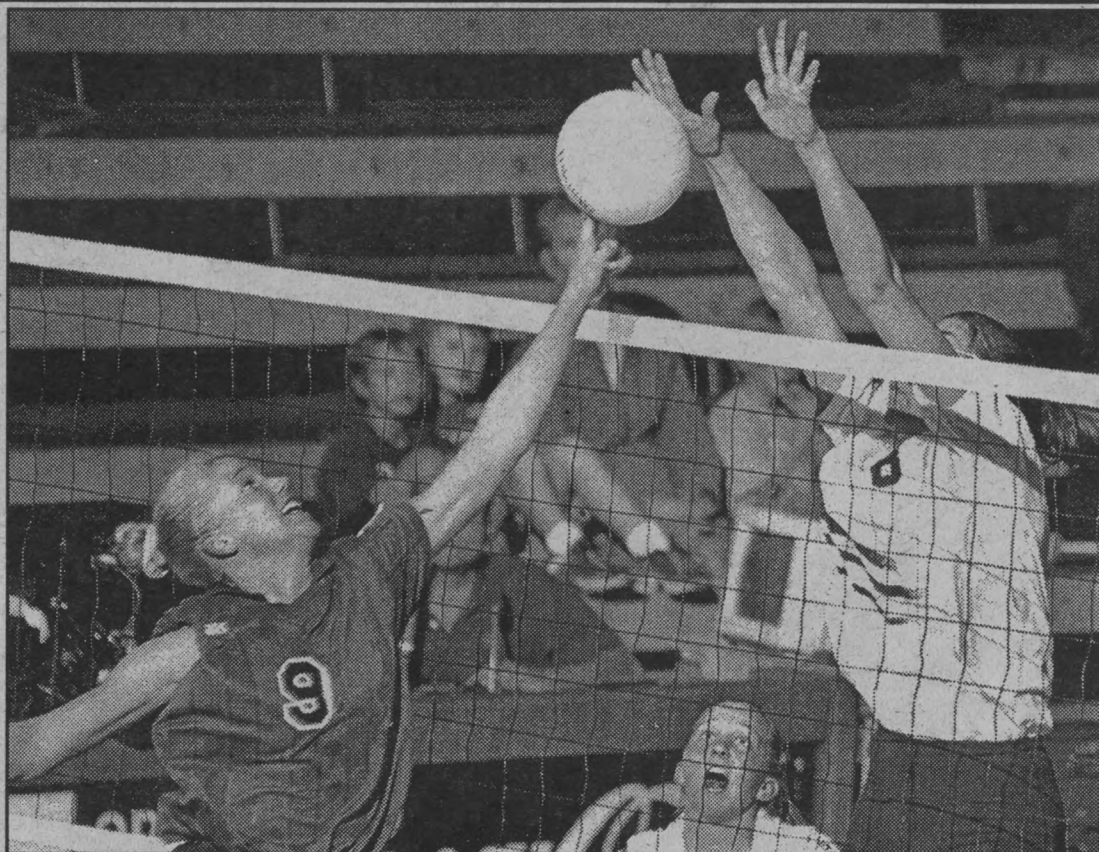
"Tonight we just didn't give New Mexico a chance to play," said UCSB Head Coach Kathy Gregory. "They didn't pass well and I tried to keep my outside hitters Roberta and Charlene happy."

Santa Barbara hit .461 as a team in the turkeyshoot as opposed to the measly .027 posted by the Roadrunners. In game one alone the Gauchos hit a colossal .706 as a team.

In last week's loss to UCLA, the Gauchos were staked to a 2-0 lead before faltering in the third, and eventually falling to defeat. However, UCSB was able to exorcise some of those demons in the game-three bageling of NMSU.

"It was sweet," said Conley. "We were thinking about it in the locker room; we had to play well in the third game and we did. We served tough and did well."

"We've always played bad in the third game," Gregory said. "I usually don't care about a 15-0, but

this time I told them to just go for it. [NMSU Head Coach Mike Jordan] was embarrassed but we've all been on the end of one of those."

Santa Barbara followed the NMSU thrashing with an encore presentation against the University of North Texas Mean Green on Saturday. While the Gauchos won in three games, the performance was not nearly as convincing as the flattening of the Roadrunners.

The Gauchos knocked off the Mean Green 15-8, 15-4, 15-11 but hit only .214 as a team. Santa Barbara, who played without Conley Saturday, made up for the lack

of hitting with solid serving. The Gauchos tallied eight service aces. Gehlke dusted off her devastating jumpserve for the first time this season and notched three aces while seniors Erin McCown and Tania Yamashita each had a pair. Gehlke led the team with 11 kills and 11 digs.

Santa Barbara skipped its pre-game practice Saturday and played unevenly vs. North Texas.

"Sure we won in three, but we weren't focused out there," Gregory said of the 98-minute match. "That's a good lesson to learn — that we're good but we're not that

good. I'm disappointed that [UNT] played with more intensity than we did, and I will do something about that."

Despite the lackluster play of UCSB against North Texas, Gregory was able to stick to her game plan and give her freshmen a chance to play against the conference doormats.

"I think we'll be much more confident," freshman defensive specialist Desiree Rook said. "Everyone will have more experience and be able to play under pressure."

Gauchos Tap the Rockies With 1-0 Victory

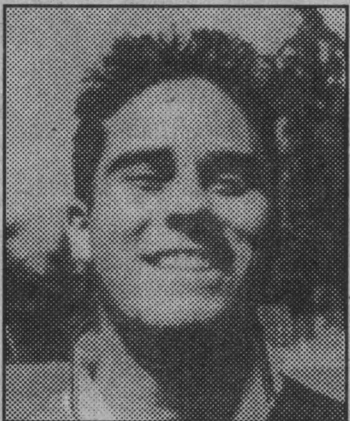
The UCSB men's soccer team knows all too well the feeling of being shut out. After being blanked six times this year, the Gauchos got a taste of the flip side Sunday as they earned their second shutout win of the season. Santa Barbara turned in a solid performance defensively against the University of Denver and was rewarded with a 1-0 victory at UCSB's Harder Stadium.

The Gauchos (2-11 overall, 0-2 in the Mountain Pacific Sports Federation) got off to a good start when senior Mark Mangiola passed to senior Aron Wellman who then broke away from the defense and scored the only goal of the match in the 21st minute of action.

"Mangiola just played a great ball through and I was able to catch the keeper," said Wellman, who has scored four goals in the team's

last five games. "He came out and it looked like it went around him for a goal."

The Gauchos played without

the services of Reza Zamani for much of the game after the senior midfielder suffered a bruised knee in a collision with Denver goalie Richard Sletvold late in the first half. Zamani received a red card for the collision and will miss Santa Barbara's next game because of the

infraction.

"I'm gonna be fine," Zamani said of his injury. "They just looked at it right now and said it was just a bruise. We banged knees and it's just bruised up. We'll check it out tomorrow."

Zamani continued about the play on which he picked up a red card. "It looked like it was a through ball and then the keeper was coming out right at me. It looked like a 50/50 ball and I guess he got it but I thought he fumbled it. It was just a collision and normally the goalie gets the benefit of the doubt."

The Gauchos have been on the short end of the stick many times this year, but the team still knows that any victory can help a losing skid.

"It feels a million times better than losing," UCSB Head Coach Mark Arya said. "I think today we came out and we stuck with it for 90 minutes and got the early goal. The guys are coming off a couple of tough weeks and this is the best medicine we can get right now."

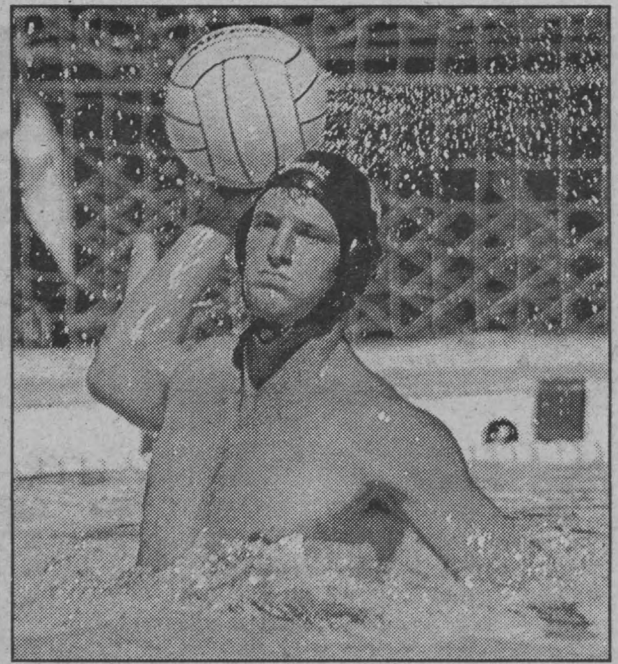
Polo Update
