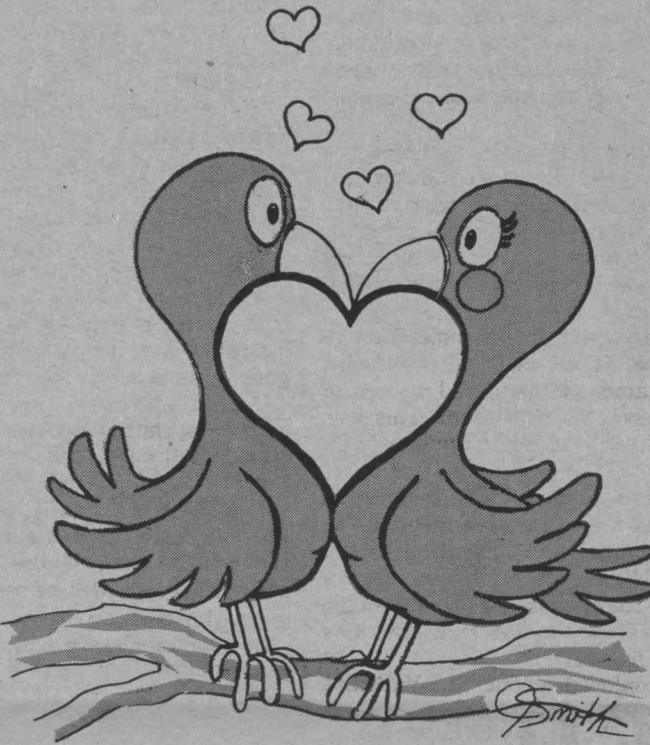

Is Valentine's Day Really That Sweet?

Then, two young gentlemen, known as Luperci, smeared the blood of the freshly dead animals upon their foreheads, only to wipe it off with wool that had been dipped in milk.

Straps, called februa, were cut from the animal hide and represented Juno's cloak. The two Luperci then ran down the mountain into nearby villages, striking every woman they saw with these straps. The Roman women often went out of their way in hopes of getting whipped by one of the young men, as it was supposed to make them fertile in the coming year. (Isn't that special?)

Later, that quaint ritual was replaced by another Roman festival, also called Lupercalia. At this celebration, the men would draw by chance the names of the unwed women in their village and exchange presents with them. This was known as the Lottery of Cupid. (Interestingly, Cupid is Latin for "desire".)

When Christianity spread through the Empire, the church wanted to give the pagan festival a Christian meaning, so local pastors substituted the women's names for the names of saints. They called the "new" holiday St. Valentine's Day, a decision having less to do with the saint himself than with the fact that the day already designated to honor St. Valentine fell one day before the Roman festival.

Sources are somewhat confused about St. Valentine

himself, since there appears to have been two men so named. The man most often identified with the holiday was a priest from Rome who was beaten with clubs and then beheaded. The majority of his remains are still preserved at the Church of St. Praxedes in Rome. (That could make for interesting sight-seeing, but, then, the travel section isn't until next week.)

St. Valentine himself is responsible for the very first valentine card. (I'm sure all of us who look into empty mailboxes on Feb. 14 would like to thank mister Valentine for starting this lovely tradition!) It is said that he left a farewell note to his jailer's daughter, who had befriended him, and signed it "from your Valentine". (Aww...Isn't that cute?)

But even a holiday originating with inauspicious beginnings as these tends to accumulate several romantic and provocative traditions. For those of us planning to spend this romantic holiday alone in front of the television watching *Love Boat* reruns and gorging ourselves with chocolates (sent, of course, by Mom), there is still hope. They say that if you stand by your window, beginning at dawn, the first member of the opposite sex that you see will be your valentine.

If you already have your eye on a few cuties and can't decide between them, you can try writing their names on small bits of paper and hiding them in lumps of clay. If you drop these into water, the first name to rise to the top will be that of your true valentine.

Another desperate measure to try starts by boiling an egg, replacing the yolk with salt, and then eating the entire thing — shell and all — before going to bed. Make sure not to speak or drink afterwards to avoid ruining the effect. (If you can figure out how this will attract a valentine, let me know. I guess it's just a little over my head.)

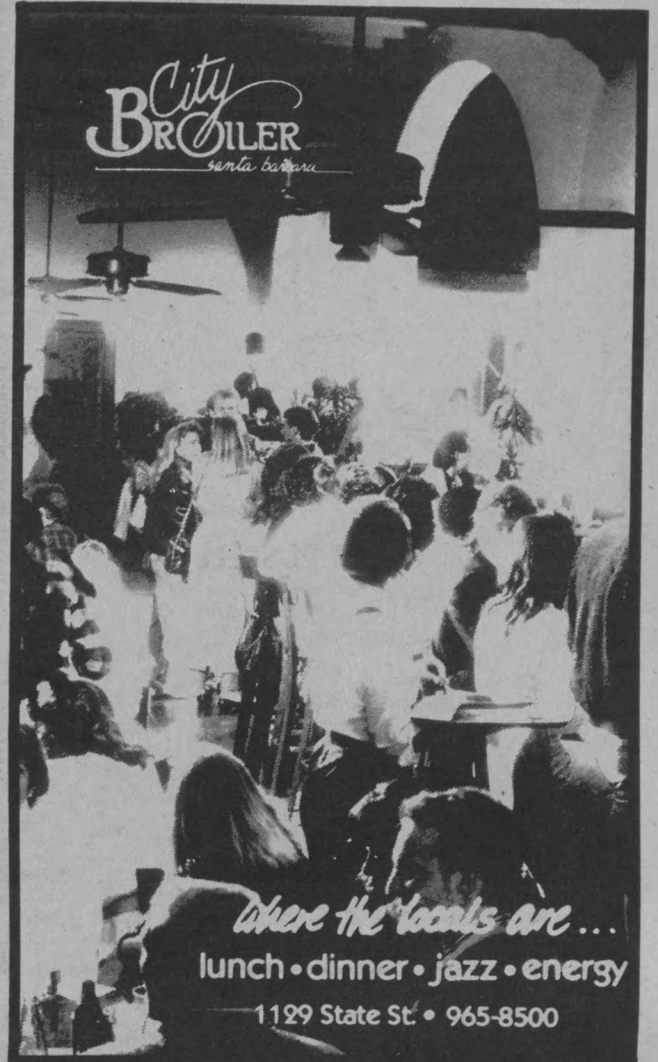
