## New System Simplifies Vet Money Vacations

A new method of granting leave to veterans attending college under the GI Bill which will expedite payment of subsistence checks and eliminate much paper work for the colleges and Veterans Administration, was announced today by VA officials.

Student veterans formerly earned leave at the rate of two and a half days a month during the school year. At the end of the school year the veteran student could apply his accrued leave to an extension of training status and receive subsistence allowance for it.

## AUTOMATIC CREDIT

Under the new system veterans, upon enrolling for the school year at accredited colleges, will automatically be credited with 15 days leave and VA will continue them on the subsistence rolls until 15 days after the end of the school year.

If the veteran desires to attend summer school he will be continued on the subsistence rolls without a break, provided there are no more than 15 days between terms.

Veterans who do not want the automatic 15 days leave, which is charged against their entitlement, must notify VA at least 30 days before the end of the school year or other period of enrollment.

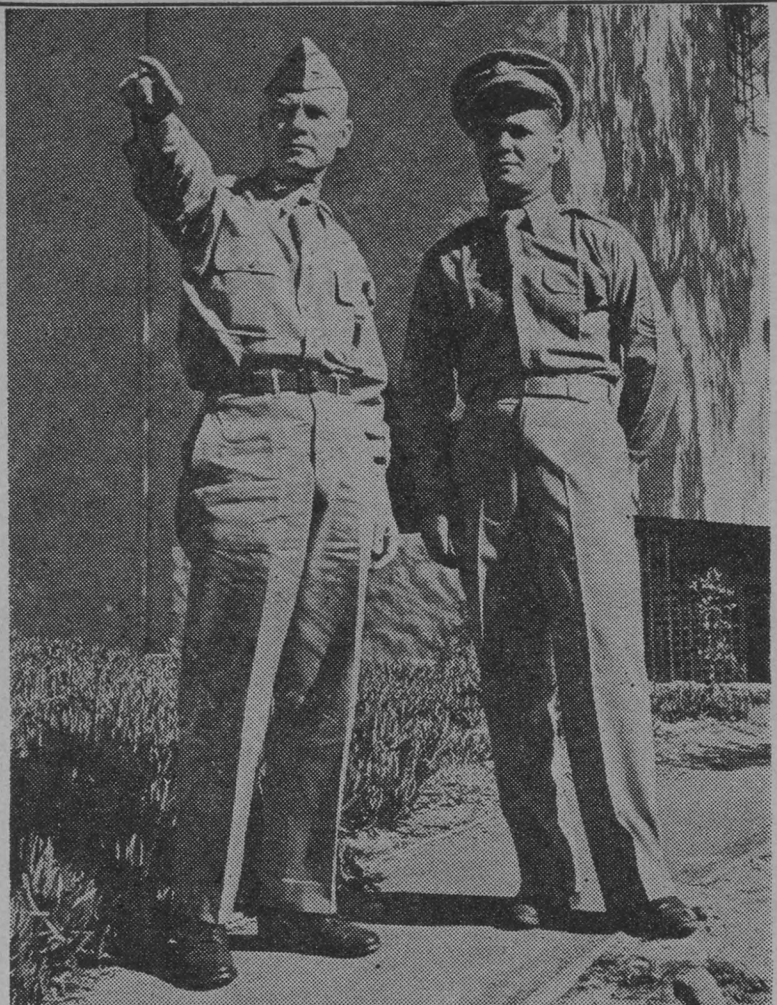

Photostat Gadget

Faced with a record fall enrollment, department heads breathed more easily with the installation of a Remington Rand Photostat machine on the campus last June.

It is estimated that the machine, when operating to full capacity, will turn out copies of the records of 1850 returning students in a period of two weeks, for rapid distribution to various depart-

ment heads. STUDENT TRANSCRIPTS

The use of the photostat machine will provide advisers with a birds-eye view of the student accomplishments, and will enable counselling to more effectively direct the students future course of study.

Transcripts of transferring students, previously a headache to faculty secretaries, will be more readily available through the photostat process.

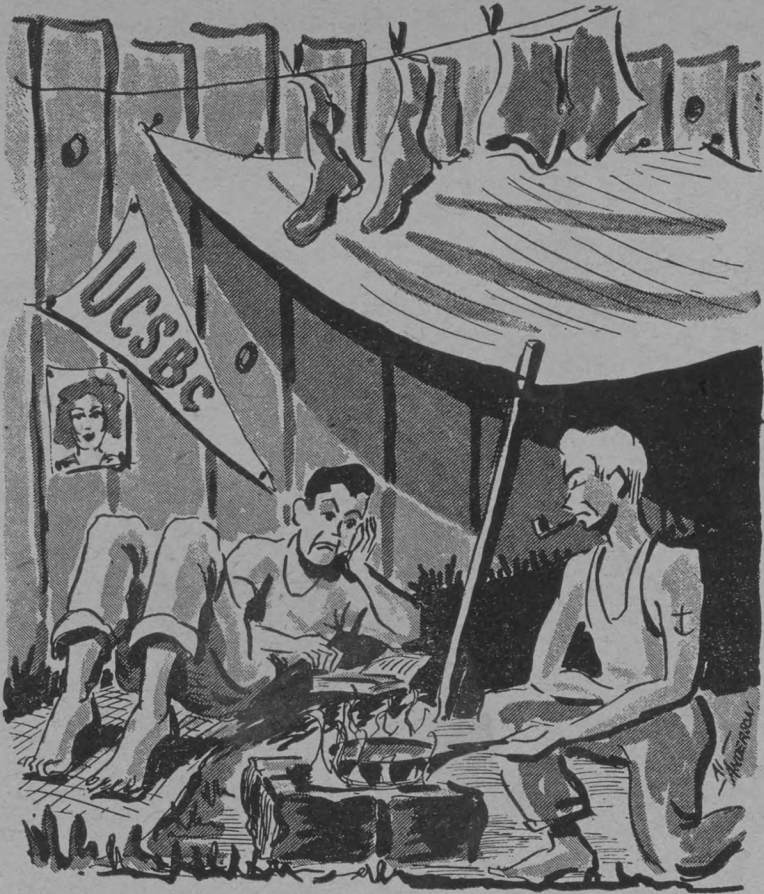

Veteran Rent Hikes By Agreement Only

Officials of rent control offices report that students who return to the rooms they occupied last year may be asked by their landlords for an increase in the rate of rent up to 15 per cent more than was charged before. The student need not pay any increase in rent, if he does not desire to do so.

If the student is agreeable to an increase in rent (of not more than 15 per cent) over what the landlord charged for the same room last year, then the landlord must give the student rent a lease which will insure occupancy at no additional increase and the lease must extend at least until December 31, 1948.

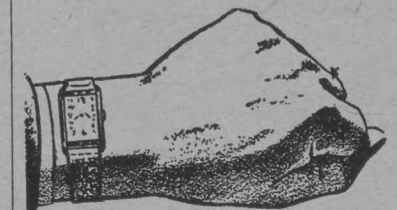

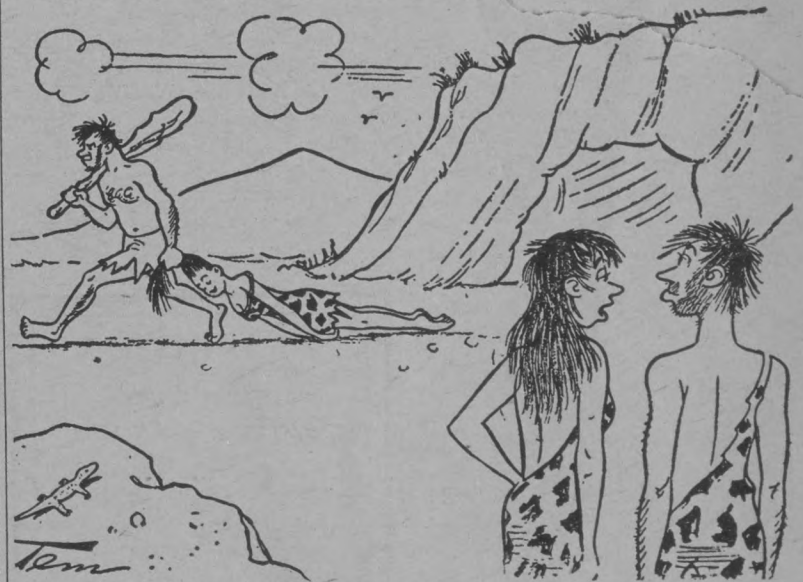
