And, believe you me, there is a thick variety of eateries competing for your masti-cation dollar. We have everything from traditional American fare to some of the most outlandish renegade cuisine that I have ever had the pleasure to notice. I think you'll agree.

This is one of the ways that we, here in America -

love it, purple mountains majesty, sweet land of liberty - keep up high quality. If your product is not nooked in the toppish notch, your business will not survive economic storms and brief-butpowerful fads. You need to outshine with class, serve with quality, win trust with affordability and never forget that the satisfaction of your patrons is your ultimate success.

This is why Paradise Cafe gets my vote for great restaurant. Simply put, it combines all the positive aspects of America and is a superior restaurant. Let's break it down.


The Paradise Cafe excels in the area of diversity. I'm not talking about a jumbled sense of variety, where you end up with a disjointed menu of burritos and Waldorf salad, here. That is, the Paradise Cafe doesn't have an Italian food section and an American food section and a Chinese food section and all that like you see at some restaurants that try to be diverse. Instead, the Paradise Cafe has combined the best elements of a great number of food styles into one cohesive unit. Nothing seems out of place or thrown in as an afterthought.

Now, originality. Some say the overriding theme of the Paradise Cafe is "California Cuisine," but I'd be surprised if that were actually the case. True, the dishes have a healthconscious, non-heavyhanded tone and there are a lot of chicken and oak-

as well as a number of vegetarian tour de forces. But wouldn't confine the Paradise Cafe to such a label. While their pasta dishes are beyond reproach in tangy, good-for-you, ribsticking, non-strictly-Italian and general tastiness terms (traditionally a sign of a successful California Cuisine restaurant), their hamburger makes no bones about giving you a thick, hot, cheese-dripping "in-of-body" experience. The black bean soup is better than any I've tasted and the salads are different than standard coffee shop iceberg lettuce fare, but not conspicuously so. You see, the Paradise Cafe is not about getting your attention cheaply with exotic lettuce, or about fitting in to some nationally obscure but locally hip restaurant trend. It is my belief that the Paradise Cafe serves "Paradise Cafe Cuisine." In this way, the Paradise Cafe stands on its own. They have truly created an original menu, overall.

And the atmosphere and service are different than what you might have become accustomed to in the '90s. The restaurant is quiet and stylish without overwhelming you with an overbearing sense of stagnant tradition or sensory inactivity. The restaurant itself, along with the truly considerate and affable waitpeople, give the pat-ron the feeling that he or she is having a positive, actual experience. No humbug hostess or inattentive







For Authentic Goodness, Head to Acapulco! You Won't Sulk, No!

Oh, it's been years since I've breathed the scent of authentic Mexican food not since I was back in good ole Nuevo Mexico where the heat is dry and everyone wears Wranglers, where the tumbleweeds are bigger than Texas, where the chile is hot enough to clear W.C. Fields' sinuses, where the license plates say "New Mexico, USA" and where the state flower is actually a cactus. But as soon as I walked into Acapulco's restaurant, I knew I was home.

I was invited in by both the Southwestern atmosphere and the amiable hostess who offered to seat me either on the large outdoor patio or inside the spacious dining area. When I see peach and teal decor like this, I know it's going to be authentic. The only thing that kept me from stopping at their full wet-bar for a few frosty margaritas was the thought of the tantalizing food awaiting me.

Little did I know, however, that I had arrived just in time to catch the Early Bird special when all the entrees are half price. The crazy thing is they do this five days a week: Monday through Friday between 4 and 5 p.m.! This was even better than home!

After a couple of bowls of homemade tortilla chips and delectable salsa, I was ready to order. However, I was a bit hesitant to jump right into the hot stuff and decided to whet my palate by starting with an appetizer of "burro - chicken wings wings with a mild yet remarkably

tasty sauce. These "bur-' unlike their donkey ros,' namesake, certainly weren't slow to prime me for the flavors of the old country.

At this point, I felt confident enough to handle the real Mexican cuisine I had grown up on — the cilantro, the guacamole, the roasted chili. Fortunately, my cravings were satisfied by an enormous platter of chicken fajitas complete with refried beans, Spanish rice and pico de gallo. The chicken was smothered with sweet onions, bell peppers and topped with a piquant sauce (that means spicy to you non-natives). There was enough food to make three or four hearty fajitas.

And even though I was amply satisfied, I just couldn't resist having the traditional Mexican de-

ssert — flan, a light custard with a caramel topping. It's sweet but not too rich or filling, a perfect dessert to follow that enormous meal. Next time I might go crazy and try the apple chimi because that's a great name for a dessert and also because it's a fried burrito with a cinnamonapple filling topped with ice cream and whipped cream. I don't know what sounds better — the name or what's inside of it.

Although I knew exactly what I wanted to eat that night, my novice-authentic-Mexican-foodeating friends will be happy to try out Aca-pulco's buffet where they can sample the many traditional dishes they have to offer including tacos, enchiladas and burritos. who work at Acapulco's would be happy to offer any suggestions if they are too overwhelmed by the number of tempting choices.

In the end, my pride was somewhat wounded by the fact that I just couldn't finish the mountain of food that they doled out so generously. But being the hospitable Southwesterners that they are, they packed it up for me, a dream come true for a New Mexican — being able to take a little piece of home back home.


When we left, Ohio had just come in, and the Arkansas governor had it wrapped up with 286 electors.
