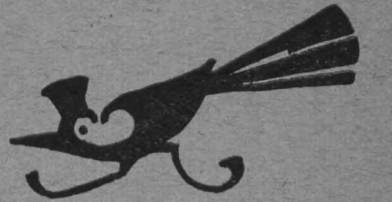

'HOMECOMING' APPROACHES

Roadrunners Keyed for Game

Cal-Tech Invasion Promises Many Thrills; Davis Says, 'Staters Are in Good Shape'

Coach Hal Davis' Santa Barbara state college Roadrunner footballers are preparing to meet the invasion of the stalwart men from Cal-Tech for the locals' Homecoming game of the year, a week from today on Pershing Field.

Both teams will be primed for their greatest efforts of the year in a clash that will undoubtedly go far toward deciding the final standings of the two elevens in the southern conference this season. The southern institution has yet to win a single encounter this year, having come out on the short end of the score against La Verne, Whittier, and Pomona.

Their best efforts this season came against the Sagehens from Claremont in their last tussle, holding the up-and-coming Nixon squad to a 6-3 score. Taking into consideration that the Pomona team brushed aside Santa Barbara by a two-touchdown margin, it stands to reason that if any team is to be made the underdog for the fray, it will most certainly not be Cal-Tech.

Another point that augures well for the southern team is the fact that Fox Stanton has brought his men around to the point where a victory is expected. Followers of the engineer squad point out the fact that it is not a habit for a Cal-Tech eleven to continue losing games, and they are out to romp all over the Roadrunners in this homecoming affair.

The Staters, on the other hand, can also advance a few arguments as to the probable favorable outcome of the game, for they contend that Coach Davis' Squad has not been in as good a condition since the locals took an unexpected victory from a highly rated San Diego team in both elevens, first try of the year. The followers of State can also point out (not with any pride, however) that a two game losing streak is about and should be terminated promptly, and if it is to be done at all, why not against what is on paper the weakest team in the conference?

Cal-Tech plays an exceptionally tough game this week against U.C.L.A., and, as a defeat at the hands of the Bruins is a foregone conclusion, it is certain that it will not soften their frame of mind when they run up against the northern Staters from Santa Barbara.

Barring injuries in their game this week, the southerners should invade Santa Barbara with their team intact. Santa Barbara still has its one and only Tuffy Treloar absent from its ranks, as well as an injury to Shirley Keith, who has been substituting for Captain Treloar in the latter's absence. Aside from these two major casualties, the Roadrunners are out to put up the battle of the season and try to advance their standing in the circuit by stopping the equally determined Cal-Tech school.
