I.V. Hopes To Attract Some Tourist Bucks

In a surprise move, the Isla Vista Corporation Committee scrapped cityhood plans in favor of making Isla Vista into a resort area that would attract wealthy jet-setters looking for relaxation and "the best organic cooking this side of Bakersfield," Corpco spokesman Madbut I'vegot-Millions said.

Club Med has already indicated an interest in the proposal, but Corpco will not commit themselves to Club Med until it has reviewed all possibilities, I'vegot-Millions said.

"There are several options open to us at this point," I'vegot-Millions explained. "Some of the committee members want to turn the place into a dude ranch, with horses and everything. Del Playa would be converted into a horse trail and Anisq' Oyo Park would become a corral where branding demonstrations would be held. Personally, I don't much care for the dude ranch idea. Isla Vista has a history of being innovative, and we weren't about to see our reputation die at the hands of these johnny-come-latelys."

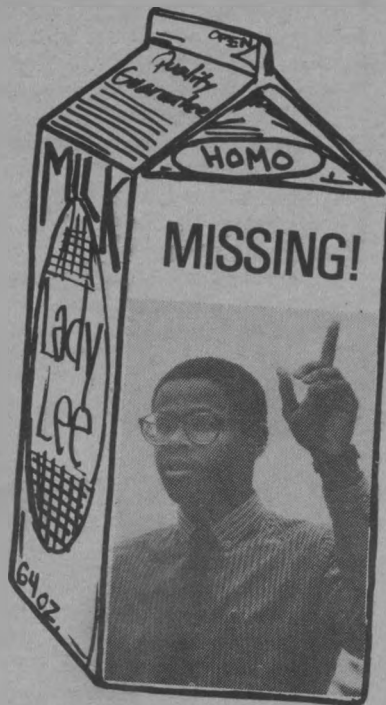
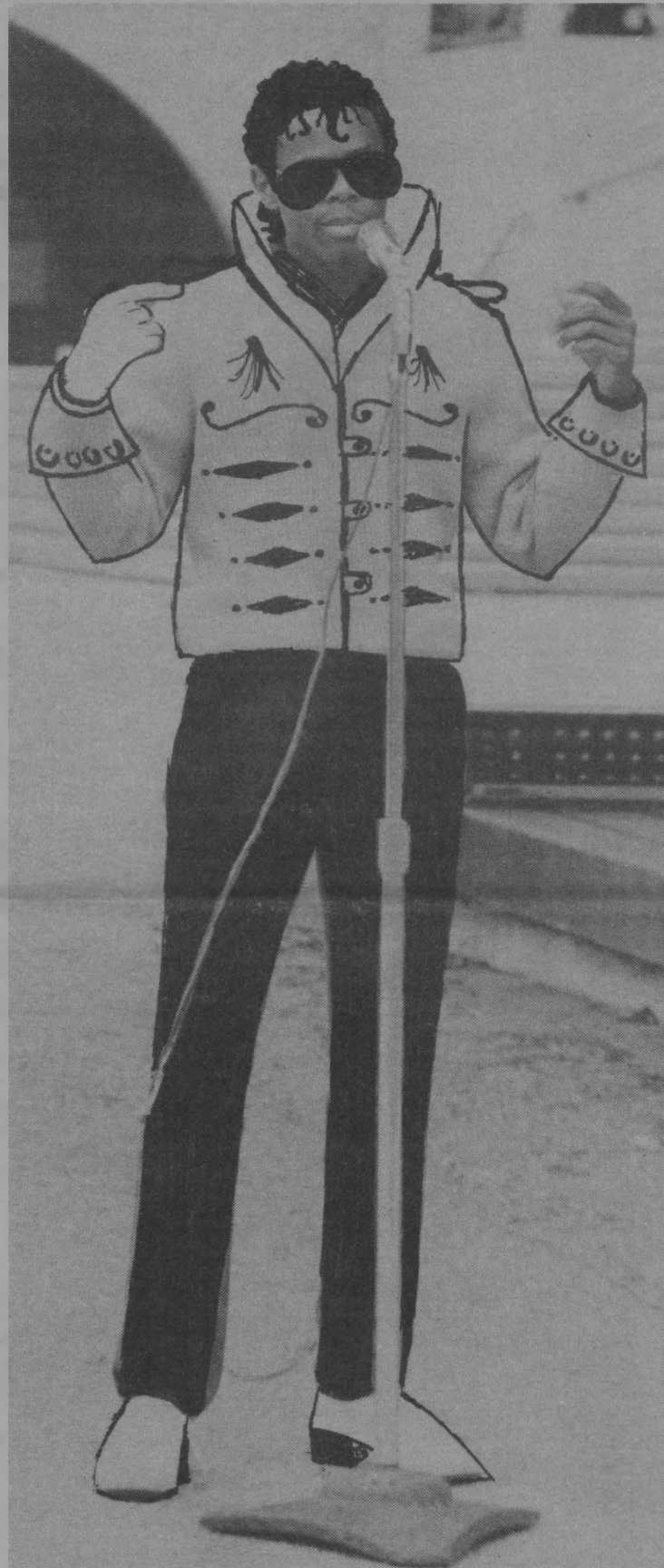
"Anything they can do, we can do better," she sang.

Con favors turning I.V. into a fantasy land modeled after the movie starring Euell Brenner, *Westworld*. "We'll call it Riotworld. You know, for all those latent yuppies who missed the good times 15 years ago and who are stuck wearing three-piece suits in high-rise office buildings. We'll provide them with long hair wigs, dirty jeans, and Molotov cocktails made with plastic bottles. We don't want to give them real glass because there's too much chance for someone to get hurt and lay a big lawsuit on us. That would be a real hummer."

Mindina Void, also a member of Corpco, is opposed to the Riotworld plan. "It's not that I think it's a bad idea, I just don't think it would work. Neal Beats It!

Rumors are spreading across campus that the mysteriously missing Assinine Students President A. WOL Neal, who dropped out of sight several weeks ago, has actually been stricken with a serious illness, causing him to take on the characteristics of Michael Jackson.

The alleged illness struck Neal last quarter and forced him into seclusion, which went unnoticed for two weeks because "he never did anything anyway," according to council members. His reclusive nature led to speculations last year that Neal, often called The Great Delegator, had died shortly after his election.

A nationwide search for Neal, which included posting his picture on grocery bags and milk cartons, has been postponed until the rumors over his illness are cleared up.

But those close to Neal claim he has taken to wearing dark sunglasses inside his office, speaking in a high voice, and wearing only one glove.

Neal's last public appearance was at the re-lighting of the eternal flame in January. He ap-

peared shaky and had to be helped to the microphone. Several times during his speech he became confused and lost, which led to the first speculations that the low-key president was seriously ill. Symptoms of his illness became apparent when Neal began doing the moon walk during his speech, but aides stopped him before he began singing "Billie Jean."

Since the ceremony, only his closest friends claim to have seen the Jackson lookalike.

An announcement concerning Neal's condition was expected last week when the campus radio station KGB began playing Top Ten music, which is usually a signal that a high-ranking student leader has died. But no statement was made and the radio station's actions were attributed to a demented disc jockey.

Neal's appearance at the eternal flame ceremony was one of the few events he attended last quarter. Besides his illness, Neal spent most of his time in an unpublicized and unsuccessful bid to become the next U.C. Student Regent. Council members hinted that Neal's defeat worsened his condition.

"When he found out he didn't get the position, he

New Chancellor Parties Down For University

In a surprise move last week, the University of California Board of Regents voted unanimously to relieve current UCSB Chancellor Robert A. Humpback of his duties and replace him with current Assinine Students Extremely Vice-President Big Jim Hickey.

"The regents felt that it was in the best interest of the university to replace Humpback," U.C. President Dave the Gardener said.

"We don't need another academic campus in the system, that's why we have Berkeley. What this U.C. system really needs is a fun campus, a place where we can send tired administrators and professors to relax and get away from real academic stuff. That is why we appointed Big Jim, we figured if anyone can put some life and party spirit back into that sodden atmosphere down there, he could."

Former Chancellor Humpback met briefly with reporters, and although he would answer no questions, he did read the following prepared statement before leaving the seaside campus for the last time: "I am bitterly disappointed in the regents' decision, but it is my duty as an academician and servant of this university to accept it. I just wish they had informed me of their plans for the university when I was appointed, as I believe I could have done an exemplary job. After all, I never lost a jitterbug contest as an undergrad, and I still bet I can swallow as many goldfish as anybody."

The new chancellor wasted little time in assembling a new administration, and after a wild weekend of late-night strategy sessions, he emerged Sunday afternoon for a Goleta Beach press conference where he outlined his plans for the future of the university.

"Let me begin by saying I think this chancellor thing is going to be a lot of fun," the Burmy's-clad chancellor said as he reached for a cool one from a nearby ice chest. "This campus has more BTTP than any other campus I've ever seen." Hickey explained that BTTP is an acronym he created to stand for *Big Time Party Potential*, something he thinks can make UCSB the model party campus that all other universities will look up to.

"My predecessor did a lot to expand the curriculum at this place, and I'd like to continue that," Hickey emphasized. He explained that since U.C. Santa Barbara already has a hot reputation as a liberal arts school, that the new program would be an extension of this — a program Hickey calls "Living Arts."

"We call our program *Living Arts*, because it's an all-encompassing program of classes and activities designed to open up new party-life opportunities for the student population," Hickey ex-

God to Pull Plug: World Will End Monday

VATICAN CITY, Rome — Citing recent changes in the Federal budget and the rising tide of illicit sex, drugs, and rock'n'roll, God announced Sunday he will pull the plug on this universe "before the Reagan Administration screws it up any further."

Sources close to the White House quoted Reagan as saying, "Together with our western allies and the help of the Vatican, our considerable influence and moral suasion, we can, at the very least, decrease the threat of this occurrence."

God's unprecedented announcement was heard worldwide on all radio and television channels, and top U.S. defense experts tend to regard it as authentic, a Pentagon spokesman said.

World reaction, however, has been mixed. The United Nations postponed a hearing on the announcement until questions of Israel's

involvement in the African famine can be resolved. Soviet leaders claimed the announcement was "a Zionist Hoax."

SAN SALVADOR, El Salvador — It was announced today that the CIA has sold Central America to Hilton Hotels, Inc. Pierre Bourgeois, president of Hilton said in a press conference today. "The CIA is getting tired of managing the area and we think we could turn a bigger profit, so we made a deal," Bourgeois said. "We'll keep the troops down in Honduras for a couple of years, but basically, within a year, this place is going to be the biggest, and best tropical resort anybody has ever seen."

President Reagan, who was vacationing in Santa Barbara over the weekend, was pleased with the Hilton-CIA deal. "Nancy and I don't really have many friends in

Central America, so we could never vacation down there, but now, boy this is great. You know they have really nice weather down there," President Reagan said in a telephone interview.

Nicaraguan president Daniel Ortega was not pleased with the situation. "All I want to say is that we are all now working together in order to strengthen our nuclear capabilities," Ortega said.

"I don't understand why they don't like the idea," Reagan said. "It'll create lots of jobs and Hiltons are such pretty hotels, they have great interior decorators, as a matter of fact, Nancy and I were thinking of using a Hilton decorator to re-do the ranchouse. What was the question again?" President Reagan said.

Utah Secedes From Union

PROVO, Utah — Political leaders in Utah announced today that Utah will secede from the union. In a joint statement made by Oral Roberts and several members of the Osmond family it was declared that, unable to tolerate the decadence and lack of morality of every other state in America, Utah felt forced to become an independent nation.

"It's gonna be hard," Roberts said, "we're surrounded by sickies, we have gambling right next door in Nevada, Arizona, which is full of alcoholics, is near us and California is pretty close and that's full of every kind of sickie you can imagine. It'll be hard to keep 'em out of our beautiful little country, but we're gonna put up electrical fencing and guards with machine guns to protect our sweet little home," Roberts said.

NEW YORK, New York — The National Rifle Association has named Bernhard Goetz its Man of the Year for 1985. "Mr. Goetz stands for everything we do," Marvin Maniac, editor of the Rifle

Weekly said.

Goetz was not available for comment but a close friend said "We always knew Bernhard had it in him to be somebody and now he's gone and done it. We're very proud of him."

The winner of this prestigious award last year was Moh Omar Khadafi of Libya. The award will be presented to Goetz at a gala dinner and dance on May 1 of this year. John Hinkley Jr. (also a former recipient of the award) and Khadafi are both expected to attend.

WASHINGTON — A White House study released Sunday said President Reagan's popularity on college campuses has declined 10-fold since his re-election and that only 95 percent of students polled support his policies.

"We are now confronting a time in which the liberal media has influenced our nation's youth to near-disasterous levels," Reagan said.

The report also said fewer than 76 percent of the students polled favor repealing the two-term limit for presidents in order to allow Reagan a chance to run again in 1988. That's a decrease of 10 percent from a year ago.

"We are extremely hopeful Reagan will have the opportunity to run again," said John Right of Georgetown University's Students For RWR. "Perhaps then he'll be able to finish his story about driving down the California coast."

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Excess To Take Over

Regents Sell UCSB to Oil Firm

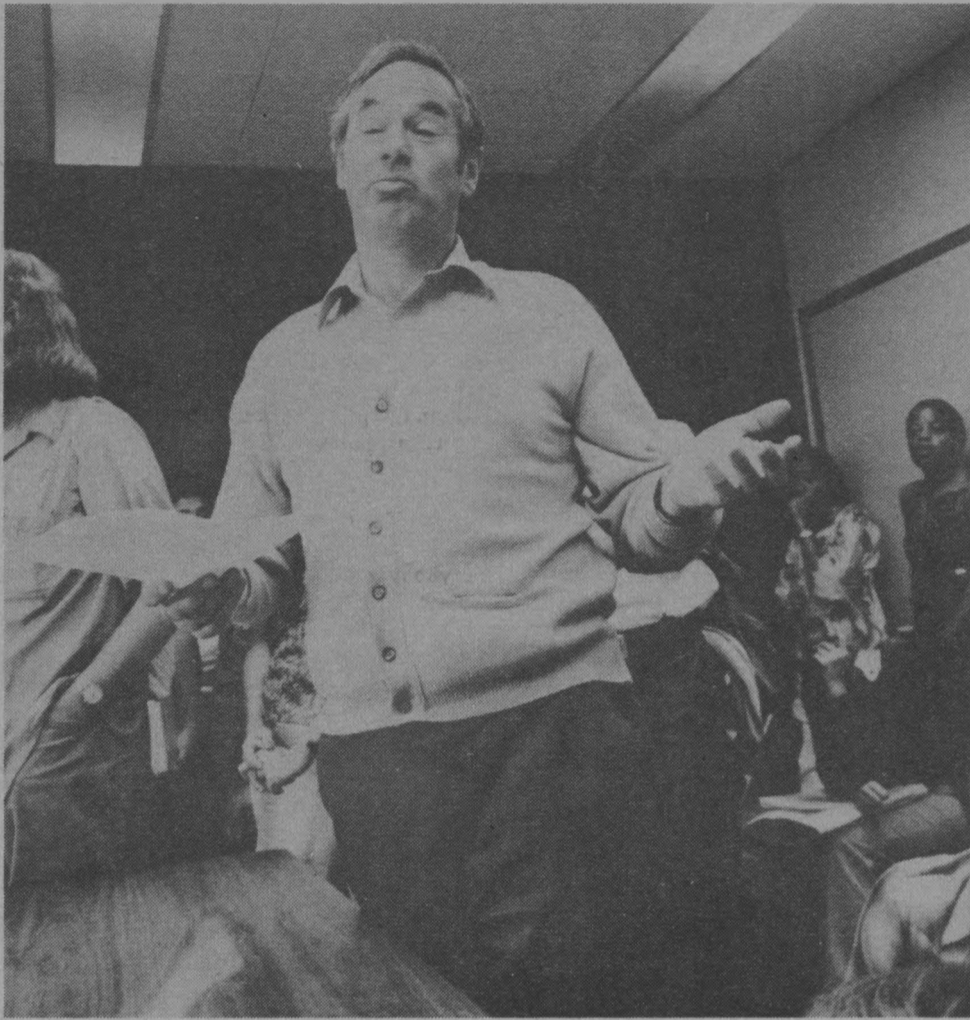
In a creative bid for new sources of additional funds, the University of California has sold UCSB to Excess Oil, Chancellor Humpback announced during a press conference Tuesday.

"They'll pour tons of money into the marine science department, and I won't have to read all those confusing environmental impact reports anymore. It's off my back," Humpback said.

The University of California Regents made the decision to sell the Santa Barbara campus to the oil company in January, 1985, after months of haggling over price. "Selling the place was never a question of ethics, we just didn't want the bastards to think we could be had too easily," said U.C. President David the Gardener. The closing price for the oceanfront real estate was \$300 million. Excess declined to pay another \$2.5 million for the existing staff, saying they would prefer to bring in their own people.

The new management will be making some changes; Humpback will no longer be chancellor. His title is to be Assistant Chief Executive Officer. "My fence-sitting on offshore oil has finally paid off," Humpback exulted.

The Environmental Studies department will also undergo a retooling. Former Secretary of the Interior James Watt will chair the new department, assisted by Anne Gorsuch-Burford-Smithovich-Jones, who will teach E.S. 1001: Strip Mining for Fun and Profit. Sociology Professor Dickie Reacts has already resigned his position with the university in protest of the purchase. Reacts, who

is reputed to protest anything, said, "I'm really happy to have a new cause. It's been downhill ever since Reagan was re-elected. Anyone know of any job openings for aging activists?"

"We would have had to fire him anyway," Humpback said of Reacts' resignation. "He's a great guy, really, but he just wouldn't fit in." Excess has plans to in-

crease the Business-Economics Department's budget threefold, according to Vice Chancellor Red Burp, who desperately hopes to keep his job when Excess begins its purge. Economics Professor Rupert Crotch will be promoted to vice chancellor for community-corporate affairs.

The deal included all existing structures and the completion of Cinderella's

Castle II, to be built on the east side of campus.

The oil company takeover is in opposition to movement away from capitalism which has characterized the seaside campus in recent months. The possibility of Excess becoming a state-owned collective has been discussed by certain left-wing members of the staff and faculty, but the plan was dropped due to a lack of organization or momentum.

Dubious' co-workers are planning a party to commemorate her return. The main course is a fine dish of lapin, sauteed over a bed of carrots.



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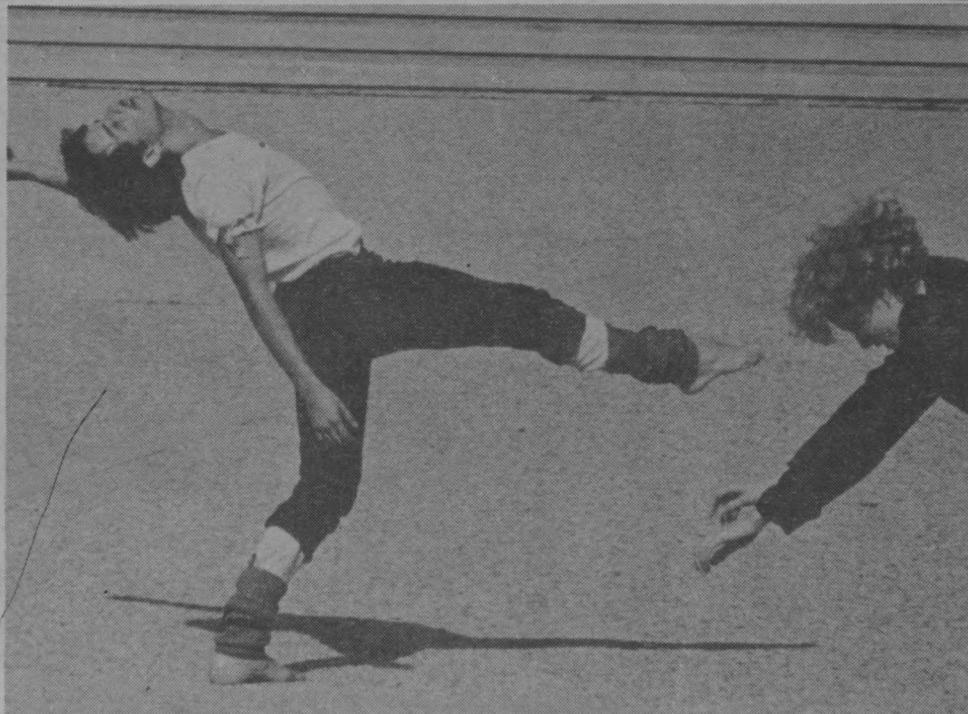
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**Police Station Destroyed

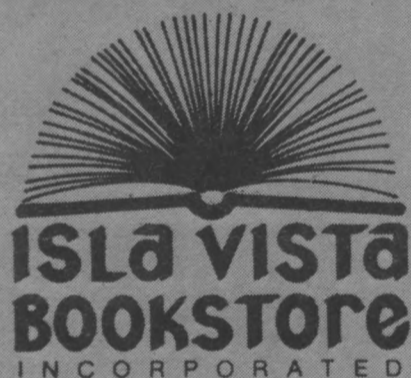
A police dispatcher and two CSOs were injured last night when the UCSB Police Department was blown up by suicide bomber Kanwe Bombay, later identified as a member of Students For A Piece Of The Action, a newly-formed campus terrorist group.

"I was talking on the pay phone just outside the building when a man walked in with a briefcase," physics student Adam Hindenberg said. "He yelled in broken English, 'I hev eh bump in dis beefcase en it iz guing to explode unless ur demandz are mit.' The desk officer started to laugh and wouldn't take the man seriously. I guess he

thought it was just another student upset by his grades. When the cop wouldn't stop laughing, he set off the briefcase and everything went flyin'," Hindenberg said.

Few police employees were in the station at 7:45 p.m. when the incident occurred. The dispatcher and the CSOs were blown through the roof and landed in an uncharted campus septic tank. The injured are being treated at Getoutoftha Valley Hospital for cuts and bruises.

Rescue workers arriving on the scene found the area submerged in building rubble and bicycle parts. "It was a mess, everything was blown to high hell. It's amazing the only person killed was that kid," Santa Barbara County Fire Captain



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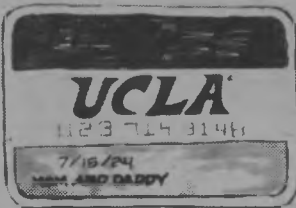

Responding to the sanctuary movement that is spreading across the country, UCLA has declared itself a sanctuary for Los Angeles Trend Monsters.

"Like ... like, it really seemed like a hip thing to do, ya na?" rhapsodized Tif Nichols, who organized the movement.

The monsters claim to need protection from department store managers who are threatening to strip the monsters of their Robinson's charge cards.

"No ... like oh my god ... I would just die without my plate, ya na?" Nichols said. The sanctuary will help monsters deal with problems such as bracelet burn, enlarged ego and Giorgio overdose.

UCSC

All men were banned from the U.C. Santa Cruz campus in a blitzkrieg-style coup by a UCSC women's rights group.

"We were just sick of those insensitive, chauvinistic filthy pigs. We just wanted them out of our sight," Meta Patterson, president of Wimmin For Wimmin, said. The feminist group has long struggled to remove men from the campus.

"Who needs them? Certainly not us," Patterson said.

More than 300 students, mostly men, were injured, although there were no fatalities. "We don't want to hurt anyone. We just want them out," Patterson said. The group plans to change the name of UCSC to U.C. Gertrude Stein.

Students have been warned to stop walking to school barefoot through cow manure until the situation is under control. "We're gonna lick this. Don't you fret," Health Center Official Slim Hick said.

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Crotch Finds New Position Abstains From Econ

Despite a strong student protest, UCSB Reaganomics Professor Robert Crotch has renounced his departmental position because of strong political and moral differences.

"I couldn't go on living a lie," said Crotch, who is famous on campus for his heckling of CIA hitman John Stockingsmell. "It was killing me."

"I'm just a liberal at heart," he said. "I only did it for the money, and now that I have it, I can move on to do what I always wanted to do."

During his years in the Reaganomics Department teaching introductory courses in *Why Reagan is God, and Being Wealthy Is More Important Than Social Values*, Crotch was beset with emotional turmoil and torment. "It was hard playing the righteous conservative. I had to forgo my socialist ideals for money. I sold out. But now that's all over. I'm better now. I've turned in Uncle Miltie's manifesto for Karl Marx, and I feel like a new man."

Students have responded with sadness and anger to the discovery of Crotch's true ideology, but applauded his motives. "It will be a shame to lose such an outstanding defender of the right," Derrick Driller of the College Pubdrinkers said. "We hate to see him go. He was an idol for many of us capitalists. He talked money, he talked conservatism, and at least he made a lot of money doing it, before he went public. Though he feels bad about the way he lived, we approve. It's just like David Bowie when he announced he was straight. I guess his heart is just elsewhere."

Not all College Pubdrinkers were as forgiving as Driller, however. Janine Nastydaddy said, "He's a wimp. One day he was with us, mocking that CIA weasel, explaining why we women deserve less money; the next he's out there arguing for equal rights. He goes to England for a quarter, comes back, and the next thing we know he's guilty about the Stockingsmell deal. How rude," she said.

Crotch has made plans to join the



Sociology and Religious Studies departments, because he feels the journey he took beyond his ideology has qualified him for just about anything. It is rumored that he will teach Impacted Religions of Vietnam with Professor Feather Inmycap. "I'm really looking forward to joining a liberal do-gooder department, where I can tell students to be cynical. It took a lot of effort to be a die-hard conservative. At night I would deluge my brain with old movies of Ron and Nancy, or read the *Washington Times* for ideas to lecture about. Now I can renew my subscription to *Pravda* and *Mother Jones*."

According to Crotch, he only mocked Stockingsmell because the other professors were getting suspicious. "Because I didn't join in their liberal defamation as much, they thought I was a little odd," he said. "For a while they put it off as part of my English upbringing, but after a while I had to prove myself. It tore me apart, because John (Stockingsmell) and I are old friends. In fact, on my next sabbatical, he and I may do the lecture circuit together."

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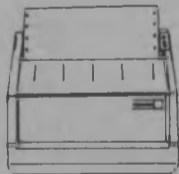


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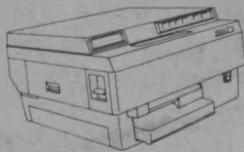
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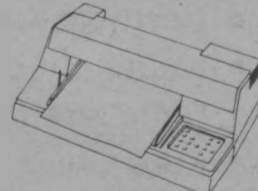
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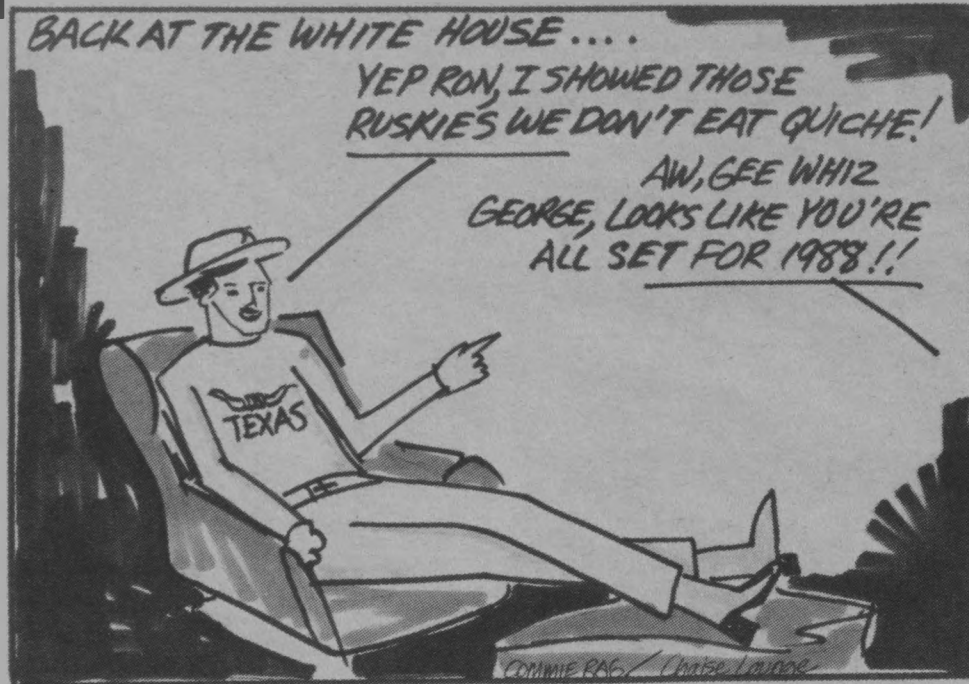

Bikes And Boards Put Two UCSB Clubs On Probation

Both the men's basketball and baseball teams have been placed on probation for three years due to an "illegal use of school funds for recruiting," UCSB Athletic Director Ken Brochure said at a press conference held Thursday night in the Campus Events Center.

The shocking report was a result of a year-long study completed by the NCAA Rules Committee. The probation leaves the two Gaucho squads ineligible for post-season tournaments.

Fink explained that the NCAA first became suspicious early last July, when Rimm was spotted on two different occasions riding through two Southern California areas on a new bicycle. Hanging from the bike was a sign which read: "Do you play basketball? Have no place to go to college? 6'5" or over? If you answered yes to two of these questions,

"Enough is enough," Fink said at the news conference. "These schools must be made examples of. Once this type of thing is stopped completely, college athletics will be restored back to the way it used to be — when competing was the only thing that mattered, and not money, or winning for that matter."

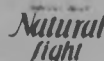

Roy Desoto said, adding he rescued Hindenberg, who was thrown into a nearby ivy field by the blast.

In a phone call to the *Nexus: Commie Rag*, a spokesperson for the campus political action group Students For A Piece Of The Action, formerly Students For Peace, claimed responsibility for the bombing. The caller said the group was tired of promoting peace.

"We're tired of all of this peace shit, it doesn't give us enough publicity. Terrorism is where we can really make a name for ourselves. No one will remember our 'live and let die-in', but everyone remembers when the students burned down the Bank of America. Now this, they will remember," the caller said.

Dancing through a crowd of campus and police administrators, piece activist and capitalist Mikhail Smithovich voiced the group's new demands. "We want more of everything, more A.S. funding, a member of our group to be appointed to the leg council, more trailer space, and a training ground near the Military Science building to help prepare our commandos. We also want fresh guacamole served in the cafeteria — that's not much to ask for," Smithovich pleaded. He vowed the bombings would

continue unless the demands are met.

"You can't market peace, but you can market terrorism," said Gandhi Greenstein, member of the piece group. "We may not be able to change the world, but we sure can have a fun time trying."

In an attempt to educate students on campus, the group made a deal with UCSB's Future Enterprisers to print business cards for \$5 per hundred. "We hope to rent a helicopter and drop them over the campus. They will have our group's name and our new slogan, 'Democracy: the American Way'," said Smithovich. He later admitted the College Pubdrinkers helped with the slogan.

The Future Enterprisers were not worried about their affiliation with the peace-turned-terrorist organization. "Third World countries have been turning tremendous profits by assisting terrorists. It's about time we capitalized on this opportunity. I mean, the United States has been doing it for years," Enterpriser President Courting Money said.

"I see this as a new alliance, where money and terrorism go hand in hand. Students For A Piece Of The Action will get what it wants and we will get what we want. We will seek power later," Money said.

Hickey plans to overturn a decision last year that banned kegs from the on-campus dorms, and instead institute a program that will place fully-stocked and staffed bars in all of the on-

campus dining commons.

"I think our students work hard during the day, and they get pretty thirsty sitting in the sun, so I think it's only right that they be able to relax with a cocktail before beginning the evening's activities," Hickman said.

Hickman outlined the final part of his alcohol awareness program, the establishment of beer and liquor concessions at all UCSB Gauchos baseball games.

"I think it's un-American to force people to watch baseball without a brew in hand," Hickey explained. "Every baseball stadium in the country sells beer or other alcoholic beverages to its fans, so why should we be any different? If we are going to be a big-time athletic power, we have to start acting like one."

Hickey ended the press conference abruptly after aides informed him that there was a problem with the construction of his in-office hot tub.

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
