

R: Well, what about the REG FEES, or the—





## CANDIDATES FOR INTERNAL VICE PRESIDENT


### Tom Thurlow Internal Vice President


## Hassan Sabbah Internal Vice President


## Pattie Klein Rep-At-Large




bike light? Also considering the fact that I.V. does not have a 100% student population, I feel that we as students should not help fund the foot patrol in any way.

I would like to strengthen A.S. commitment to nondiscrimitory policies towards woman and minorities and establish better cooperation with CalPirg which would include supporting their projects to providing them with greater office space. I would also like to have the student bookboard expanded to handle a greater exchange of books.

# BALLOT MEASURES

- TEXT:**
- 1.** Be it resolved that an additional \$2 per undergraduate per quarter will be collected and allocated to the campus media. These additional funds will be allocated as follows: 20 cents to the *Daily Nexus*, 84 cents to the *La Cumbre*, and 96 cents to the A.S. Communications Personnel. This initiative will modify Article III, Section 4C of the A.S. Constitution.

**PRO:**

Attempting to improve the quality of communications available to the UCSB student, KCSB Radio (through communications personnel), the *Daily Nexus*, and the *La Cumbre* yearbook have united to ask the students to approve a \$2 increase in the student activities fee. The increased fee would provide the campus community with an ever-improving radio station, newspaper and yearbook.

All three organizations not only provide students with a communication and information network, but also act as an arena to test their talents and learn invaluable skills. The Storke Communications Building is the only location on campus offering students hands-on experience with radio equipment, typesetting terminals and other communications facilities.

An increase in the A.S. constitutional lock-in funds is necessary for these three organizations to continue upgrading their product.

1. The Nexus has always shown a profit and has the ability to generate its own funds through advertising.

- 2.** "Do you support the continued existence of the California Public Interest Group (CalPIRG) chapter at UCSB by changing the current method of collection to a refuseable/refundable fee? Each student would be assessed the \$3.00 per quarter fee. Each student may choose to refuse assessment through the registration process, or may seek a refund, if assessed, through CalPIRG."

**PRO:**

CalPIRG is the largest consumer and environmental protection organization in California, and is run and funded by students. By applying classroom skills to "real life" situations students are having a major impact on issues such as: protecting public health by identifying toxics in the community and holding down rising telephone rates.

Students involved in CalPIRG projects have consistently seen their work translated into action in the state legislature. Last spring, research into skyrocketing utility rates made 3rd page headlines in the *LA Times*, and led to a subsequent push for increased consumer representation at rate hike hearings. This year, student research into toxic materials in children's art supplies, led to the introduction of 2 pieces of legislation aimed at protecting school children and artists.

On campus, thousands of students benefit from the services CalPIRG provides. Services such as: providing renters credit information and forms, the bookboard, voter registration and producing price surveys.

CalPIRG is able to provide students with these opportunities, because students across the state have pooled their resources, by establishing a fee to fund their CalPIRG chapters. Unless we now establish a refuseable/refundable fee for CalPIRG, like the one used at other UC's, students at UCSB will not have the same opportunities offered at UCB, UCSC, UCLA, or UCSD, and will no longer benefit from CalPIRG on campus. VOTE YES TO KEEP CALPIRG AT UCSB!!!

**CON:**

CalPIRG should be funded by purely voluntary means; therefore a refuseable-refundable fee allows CalPIRG the advantage of people forgetting to check the box on their registration forms.

- 3.** Do you agree that there should be 3 Representatives for the six dorms on campus and a separate Representatives for the students living at Santa Ynez and Married Student Housing?

**PRO:**

Passage of this Constitutional Amendment will better represent the students of U.C.S.B., which in turn will offer the students a more effective student government. By breaking down the administration's definition of On-Campus, we will more effectively represent the students on main campus, and also those living at Santa Ynez and Family Student Housing.

**CON:**

By adding another Representative to Legislative council will only hinder the effective and efficient process of student government.
