Chancellor Surprised by Reagan's Move

University administrators and student leaders expressed surprise at the Reagan administration's decision to move the federal government apparatus, currently located in Washington D.C., to the UCSB campus.

"Frankly I'm surprised," Chancellor Hubert "Ducky" Ruttenbach said yesterday. "But I think it will be a good thing for the university, bringing recogntion and prestige to UCSB. As far as I know we are the first U.C. campus to house any presidential administration.'

Ruttenbach said he had not yet meet with Reagan, but had spoken with the president's wife who had expressed an interest in the Wine and Food Institute soon to be located at UCSB's West Campus.

'Nancy said the idea for the institute was what had endeared UCSB to her. She thinks, as I do, that the advanced study of things like how to set the table properly for a dinner party, and the proper way to utilize a maid and butler at a semi-informal wine

and cheese get-together are important issues that simply have not been given the attention they deserve. I think the Reagans will add a much needed touch of class to this university."

A.S. President Larry Hanes expressed concern about how well the United States government could interact with the A.S. Leg Council. "Well, at the same time that I realize that many of the issues the guys in Washington are concerned with are important, you know, like nuclear war and things like that, I don't want important campus issues, like the swallows and other stuff, to not get the attention they deserve. Maybe we can work out a space sharing plan where the U.S. government uses the UCen facilities half the week and we do the other half."

Ruttenbach said he doesn't think that having the entire United States federal government situated on campus will adversely affect the conduct of university business or the students. "I don't think that having the entire United States federal government situated on campus will adversely affect the conduct of university business or the students," the chancellor explained.

'It is a non-issue," he said.

Asked if it might be beneficial for the president and the nation's elected officials to be so easily accessible to the students, making it possible for student protests over issues such as financial aid cuts to go directly to our representatives, Hanes said "Oh, well I hadn't really thought about that, but I guess that's a possibility, though, as I think I said earlier, I hadn't thought about that, really, I mean not yet anyway."

The president of the UCSB branch of College Republicans, Joseph O. Prep, said he was "absolutely ecstatic" about the proposed move. "I can't think of a better place for the Reagan administration to set up camp. Gosh, we have everything here to make them feel at home: sunshine, oil derricks, lots of sons and daughters of wealthy and conservative people living in sororities and fraternities."

Asked if he anticipated any negative backlash from less conservative members



of the student body, Prep said "Once our special Legion of Decency and Conservatism squad 'takes care' of the undesireable types i.e. Democrats, members of the Third World Coalition, the Black Student Union, El Congresso, the Women's Center, the Gay People's Union, People Against Nuclear Power, the Sierra Club, the Iranian Student Association, the Korean Student Association, the Pilipino Student Association, and all students who attended the rally for John Anderson last year, I think this campus and its students will welcome the president, the gracious and lovely first lady, and the American way of life - pure, white and wealthy - that this most decent couple stands for.

President of the UCSB Democratic Club Al Kneejerk was outraged over the proposed move. "I am outraged over the proposed move," Kneejerk said. "Why, with all those secret service men running around, just think how long the lines in the UCen are going to be. It will take half an hour to buy a burrito, and by the time you get to the front of the line, it all be cold anyway.'

Washington To **Be Moved To UCSB** Campus

Post Alcohol Editor In an announcement that caught the Santa Barbara press corps by surprise, Deputy Presidential Press Secretary Larry Speakes revealed last week that the Reagan administration has approved a plan to move the entire Washington, D.C. government apparatus to the UCSB campus.

Utilizing maps, slides and large scale artists' renditions, Speakes illustrated the architectural changes and adaptations that would be involved in the move, including conversion of Storke Tower into the Washington Monument, addition of the Capitol Dome to the upper level of the UCen, and reconstruction of the Pentagon Building on what is now the site of Campbell Hall.

Big Move

It came as no surprise when President Reagan announced his proposal to move the federal government and all relevant supporting apparatus to the UCSB campus. Such a move is consistent with Reagan's true character, which is that of a humble man, deeply concerned with the lives of those less fortunate than himself.

Although some of the more radical members of the UCSB community might maintain that Santa Barbara is, in reality, a haven for wealthy, elitist members of the capitalist money machine, we submit that such is not the case. Whining liberals, with their knee-jerk predictability, have no business criticizing the element that has made this country what it is today: a truly progressive nation, always supportive of the disadvantaged.

By moving his administration to UCSB, President Reagan will be able to maintain closer contact with students, panhandlers, professors, and other minority interest groups. Of special merit is the increased ease with which local lobbying groups, such as the Nuke the Whales Alliance, Preppie Preservation League, and Greeks for Peace will be able to bring their concerns to the attention of legislators.

Local merchants stand to benefit as well. Such low-status "greasy spoons" such as the Habit-Forming and the New York Hangover House will probably disappear, to be replaced by Isla Vista branches of Scandi's and the Polo Lounge. Though it may have to add a selection of imported delicacies (beluga caviar and Italian truffles being just two possibilities), I.V. Markup will undoubtedly see a great increase in patronage, as will Prudent's Village Store.

Perhaps the greatest side-benefit will be the potential for Associated Students officers to learn principles of truly efficient government, such as the Artful Dodge, Policy Reversal, and the Administration Two-Step, performed with such sophistication by Reagan and other federal officials.

We urge all students to acquaint themselves with the ramifications of the Big Move, primarily by studying government publications which explain them in great detail. Although cost projections are being kept confidential, there is no need to worry: Reagan and his advisors are all "upper crust" and, as we all know, the wealthy can afford to tell the truth.

Empty

During the course of his term, President Ronald Reagan has demonstrated a nasty habit of wasting space, symbolized most accurately by the empty area between his ears. But with his decision to move the White House from Washington, D.C. to UCSB, Reagan will be forced to face up to a situation that has plagued campus administrators for years; that is, the lack of adequate space. Secretary of the Interior James Watt's idea to install 25-30 oil drilling devices back-to-back in the Lagoon is an example of the kind of intelligent planning we at the Post like to see. In order to make his move a success Reagan will need to employ similar strategies. One incredible idea involves the fate of the poor, homeless MX missiles. Chancellor Hubert Ruttenbach suggests that Reagan will be happier if he can visit his beloved bombs daily, and therefore, rather than keep them in another state, should keep them within walking distance. Ruttenbach points out that the government wouldn't even have to build silos for the lethal arms, but could store them in the cavernous depths of Shambell Hall, Snotty Sneezeman Concert Hall, Slobertson Gymnasium, and the Prevents Center. We think this proposal is simply peachy keen, especially since it will give our Engineering majors a unique opportunity to see firsthand what all their years of study will lead to.
