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

# Baltieri's: Great Italian Food and Atmosphere

When it comes down to it, we're all racists.


We bemoan, in lavishly condescending tones, the "plight" of whichever traditionally downtrodden group we're glad not to be a part of. We make a noisy point of talking about our '(Fill in the blank with nonwhite-male category)" friends. We even listen to whatever album David Byrne is involved with, so we can be exposed to "other cultures."

But ultimately, our "really I'm not racist" racism explodes to the forefront when we go to "ethnic" restaurants, expecting wallto-wall photographs of that ethnicity's heroes, pulsingly "indigenous" ethnic music, and hired help who have thick accents.

And then there's Baltieri's.

Located like the last bastion of moral sensibility on the grief-stricken downtown Goleta section of Hollister Blvd., Baltieri's promises nothing more than some pleasantly unpretentious pasta at a proper price.

When you walk into the tastefully-lit dining room, your senses aren't bombarded with add-waterhave-culture items. There are no annoying photos of Vito Antefuermo, no lilting

straight-outta-Sicily mandolins playing, no hosts surreptitiously named "Tony."

Instead there are red and white checkered tablecloths, smoothly beautiful paintings on the walls and an unblushing yet unforced air of romanticism. It's the perfect place to take a date who's more impressed with good conversation and belly-good food than tuxedos or elaborate corksniffing rituals.

The service at Baltieri's is

both friendly and unobtrusive, prompt and relaxed. It's almost as if food is a secondary consideration that is, until it's served. Dinner (which begins at 5 p.m. weeknights) begins with a nicely-wrapped basket of tender sourdough bread and all the butter rectangles you can eat. Like any Italian restaurant worth its sweat, there is an intricately woven eclectic mix of traditional pasta numbers — your ra-violi, spaghettis, rigatoni, lasagna — and seafood, all

positioned in the basic \$7-\$15 range.

Unlike many Italian eateries, Baltieri's seafood selection isn't a hastily thrown together afterthought consisting of yesterday's Goleta harbor leftovers. No, their fish is fresh, and prepared with the care of those who appreciate the difference between scampi and scallops. The Baltieri's Seafood Platter - obviously a showpiece dish — comes replete with chunky shrimps, gooey clams, sprightly calamari

and a host of other bottomdwelling delights, all meshed with Baltieri's trademark spaghetti noodles and a rich tomato sauce. It's the kind of plate one dreams of finishing but would never dare to.

The wine list is delightfully spare — why bother with needless selection haggling when you can get a damn good jigger of burgundy and be done with it? Which is in keeping with Baltieri's unstated mission: give the customers what

they want. Namely, some delicious Italian food and room to breathe at a reasonable price. If you're looking for waiters to tell you lies about the "homeland," if you're looking for "that one Venician dish my aunt told me about," or if you're looking for any signs of "authenticness," you're in the wrong place, bubby.

# Just Good Food Indeed — Soho is Fabulous

Soho is a good place for a heavy date that you don't want to seem heavy. It's low-key fancy, like there was a candle by the cash register, and the after-dinner mints were black instead of pink, yellow and white. If you wanted to dress up and impress someone, you wouldn't feel out of place in your nice duds, but at the same time, the hostess didn't look askance at my sister's dippy, polka-dotted sweatshirt. The decor is elegant, but not oppressively so. The waitresses and waiters aren't noticeably better dressed than most of the customers, and the general atmosphere is more festive that "elegant." Lunch at Soho felt like a special occasion, even though my date was my little sister.

We went there for lunch, expecting a Santa Barbara Mellow-Yuppie business-lunch crowd, but instead there were all kinds of folks there, and people seemed to be having fun. It was busy, but not frantic. We sat on the patio where the tables were closer together than inside, which made for convenient eavesdropping. At the table behind us one woman's daughter had just decided to change her whole life and go to graduate school in architecture.

"Isn't that wonderful?" she gushed. "I can hardly believe it. She has matured so much in the last year."

I couldn't see them without turning around and being obvious, but from listening I could tell it was two older women and a girl. Later an older man came and picked them up and I think he paid the bill. The whole lunch, including \$5 tip was about \$35, and well worth it - for those 35 bucks, we each got an appetizer, entree, and we shared a piece of chocolate cake and had coffee. And I had a glass of wine, my first legal drink. They didn't even card me.

Our waitress was businesslike and seemed to think that her main function was not to fawn over us, but to get us our food, answer our questions, and act as liaison between us and the

enough to laugh at my sister's little joke, which I might as well tell you now. Our chocolate cake was garnished with chocolate-covered coffee beans. "Coffee beans?!" my sister said,
"I thought they were
M&Ms. How gauche of
me." And the waitress laughed — we hope not just out of politeness.

Communication between the kitchen and customer is easy and frequent at Soho. The menu encourages substitutions. The waitress didn't mind going back to the kitchen with our questions, and she seemed to know something about food herself, which is always helpful. The menu at Soho changes every week: a sure sign of an interesting chef and an informed waitstaff.

As I mentioned, the tables on the patio at Soho are ideally placed for eavesdropping. A pretty girl in a black sweater at the next table sunk her fork into a piece of chocolate cake and said, "This is positively sinful!" Sinful? Since when is pleasure a sin? I had the

months, and certainly the most sensual experience I've had recently, but I don't feel guilty. I feel happy. I think good food is a won-derful blessing. It cheers people up, especially if there's wine to go with it, and there is at Soho, for a price, and beer too, about 18

The motto on the front of the menu is, "There is no love more sincere than the love of food." The quote is not attributed to anyone, so I assume it's the invention of the owner/chef at Soho, Nancy Weiss. I'm always glad when the chef owns the restaurant, mainly because, for once, the artist is getting the profits, and also because it means all the touches are there. My appetizer was ratatouille, which was a peasant food originally, and not a particularly pretty dish, but it looked slick and interesting on a black plate, with triangular pieces of pita bread arranged around it in a star pattern. It was garnished with crumbled feta cheese, a spring of fresh dill and a fresh pansy, yes, a

posed to eat it?" I said.
"No, I don't think so," said my sister, "look there's a little rose in my feta-dill sauce." But I did eat it, because I'll eat anything, and it was pretty good. It tasted like a pansy, but then what do you expect? I ate her rose too. My sister had baked garlic with the creamy-fetadill sauce, and that was delicious: sweet, pungent, very slightly bitter, soft garlic, spread on fresh dill bread. My ratatouille was superb, and that's a terrific compliment coming from me, because I happen to make the best ratatouille in the world, and I expected to be disappointed, but hoped, as I always do, that my favorite food in the world will be as


good as I want it to be. It was, and it was different from mine, sweeter, more tomatoes and yellow squash, and they used sweet red bell peppers where I usually use green. I asked the waitress to get the scoop on it from the kitchen and she told me: eggplant, romatomatoes, sweet red peppers, onions, shallots, zucchini, yellow squash, pars-ley, basil, oregano, salt, pepper. Ummmm.

When I ld a friend of mine that I had this gig reviewing Soho, she said, "Oh, I've heard that place is very innovative," and I thought, "oh, no, that means they won't salt anything, and the tiny portions will be artistically on neon plates, and they won't have any ketchup, and they'll play new-age background music with subliminal messages to make you vote no-growth and spend a lot." So I was pleasantly surprised by Soho, where the food truly is "innovative," but, when you eat, it doesn't scream "innovation! Aren't I imaginative!" It just tastes good.

# Shanghai North Has Wonderful Chinese Food

Tea is an intrinsic part of the dining experience in China. With this in mind I can usually gauge whether or not a Chinese restaurant is up to par by the amount of time it takes to get some tea after being seated.

My friend Wade MacDa-niels and I went out for some Chinese the other night, and not more than 30 seconds had elapsed after we slipped into our booth before a hostess in a long, slinky Chinese-style tube dress arrived with a hot, steaming pot of the brew. After indulging in a few cups of tea, we ordered a couple of Tsingtao beers, a Chinese brew which goes too well with Asian food, and looked over the menu. It was to be quite a challenge, as there were a ton of things to choose from. An expansive menu (no, I did not say expensive!) is another criterion I rank Chinese restaurants by, and Shanghai North is going to cook you just about anything your heart desires.

There are a lot of theories on what constitutes a proper Chinese meal. Some prefer to have an appetizer first, while others want soup, and the oddballs out there like both. It's universal to follow the first course with at least one main dish per person, agreeing in advance on the choices which everyone will eat.

These entrees are then placed in the middle of the table and served to everyone who's in on that sitting. And hey — don't forget to have it all with rice, fried or steamed, depending on personal preferences; once

Many of the other patrons were using chopsticks, but I've yet to figure out how to get the soup to stay on the sticks. OK, I know, the chopsticks are for the wontons and veggies and stuff, and you're just supposed to pick up the bowl and slurp the broth down, but I had on some snappy duds and didn't want to risk it. Wade is just too dang California cool to use chopsticks anyway, so we responded to our server's offer of chopsticks with a crisp "No," opting instead for Western cutlery again group consensus through the meal.

The soup itself, the hot and sour variety, (\$4.75 for two), is a spicy mixture of shredded pork, bamboo shoots, Chinese mushrooms and bean curd with a few egg drops thrown in for good measure. Using spoons, we enjoyed it heartily.

We eschewed an appetizer, although Shanghai North offers many to choose from. These include egg rolls (\$3.55), paper wrapped chicken (\$3.95), and my personal favorite, an assortment of appetizers on a tray with a small flame in the middle, ready for at-thetable roasting, the infamous "pu-pu" tray!

It was a good thing we passed on the appetizers, because our two main course dishes left us bloated and wondering, "How did we eat the whole darn

Shrimp with Lobster Sauce is one of my all-time favorites, and I was more than satisfied with the version Shanghai North has designed. While the sauce is not overbearing on the flavor of the prawns, it is discernible nonetheless, with just the right touch of vegetables thrown into the dish for contrast (not for the Contras!).

Our second dish, Garlic Chicken with sliced peppers, was, well, garlicky, and that's just what I like when a dish has the word

garlic in the name. The sauce was heavier in this one, as it should have been, enabling us to mix in all the rice brought to the table after we'd munched down all the shrimp and chicken.

There are a number of Family Dinner Specials, served to two or more people, and they range in price from \$8.25 to \$19.95 per person, so if you want to try a bit of everything this is certainly the way to go. As you'd figure, the more you pay the more you get, and whatever way you go, all points lead north — Shanghai North, that is!





The pre-meal sourdough bread is warm and wonderful, with the ability to download serious portions of but-


