Gauchos Take Two Matches to Remain Perfect at Home

■ SB beats Cal State Fullerton and UC Irvine over weekend

Home, sweet home! Despite being moved to Rob Gym for their weekend matches, the #16 Gauchos were still able to maintain their perfect record at home by defeating UC Irvine and Cal State Fullerton in straight sets.

UCSB (12-4 overall, 4-0 in the Big West and 9-0 at home) opted to move its games this weekend from the Events Center because the Los Angeles Clippers were holding practices at the Thunderdome.

But they had no trouble disposing of the Titans (8-6, 0-3) and the Anteaters (1-14, 0-4) in their new location as the squad took only 58 minutes to handle Fullerton and slightly more than an hour to beat Irvine.

After juggling personnel for the past three games,

Head Coach Kathy Gregory decided to stick with a set lineup this weekend and it payed off handsomely.

The Gauchos hit .375 and .619 against Fullerton

and Irvine respectively, compared to .000 and .143 for their opponents. They were also playing better defense, out-digging their foes by 10 in each game.

"I think we're getting back together," said sophomore middle blocker Katie Crawford. "It's going

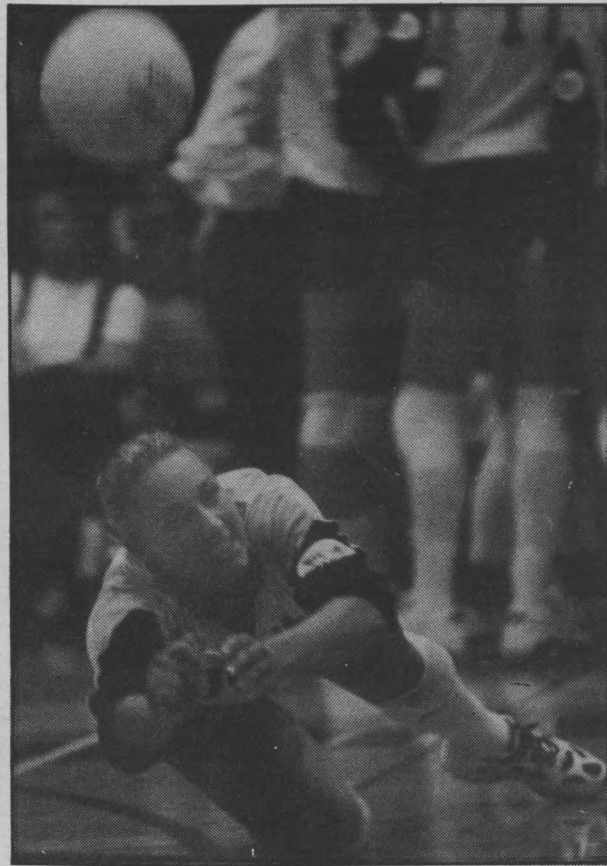
to be tough on the road. This was a good weekend to have. We needed to get a lineup together."

The Gauchos are set to take their act on the road against perennial conference powerhouses #5 Long Beach State and #18 University of the Pacific in one of the most crucial weeks of the season.

"We are getting better," said Gregory. "This lineup played well this weekend. I'll go with the same one next week. But I've got to give a lot of credit to Fullerton and Irvine, they made us work. Katie and Roberta played really well."

Crawford had a spectacular weekend.

In the Titan game on Friday, she single-handedly led the team with an astounding .818 hitting percentage, one kill shy of tying the school record held by Kim Keys. Crawford also had a



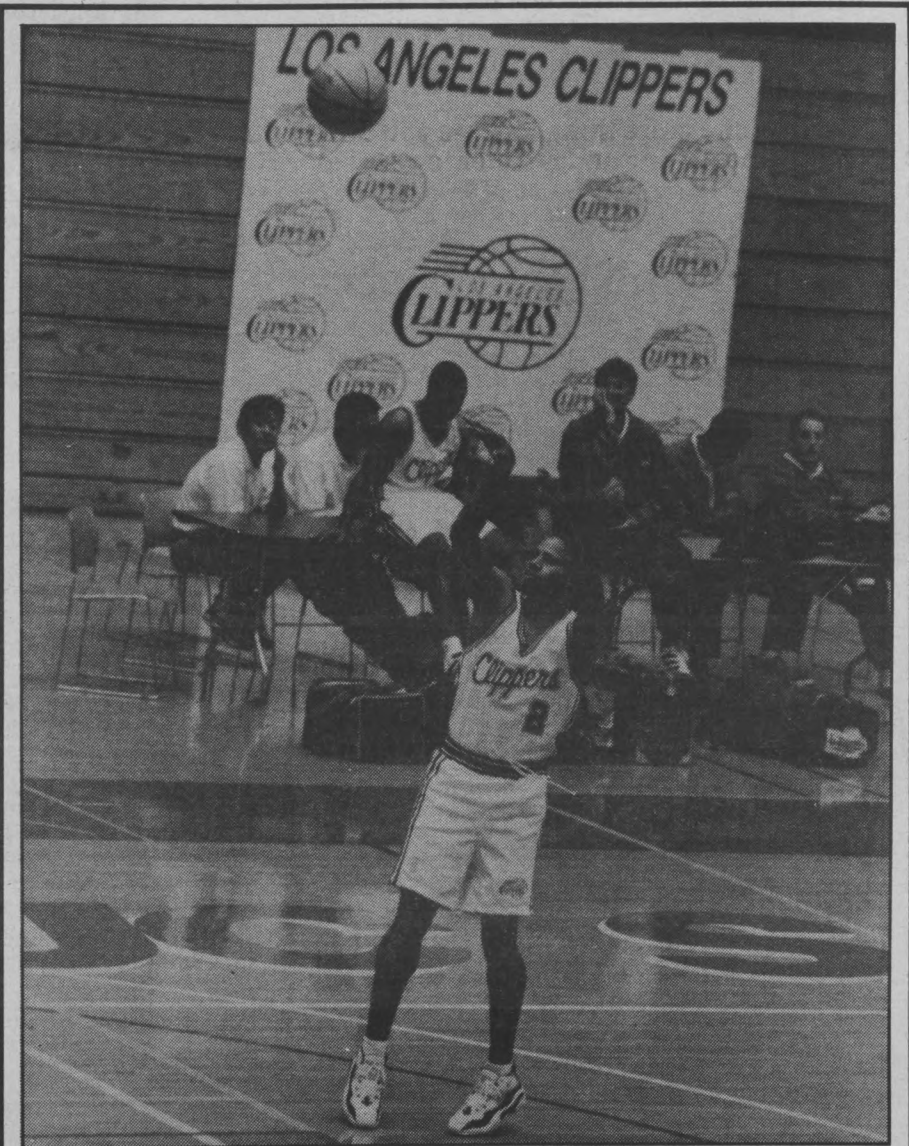

Men's Soccer Update

UCSB Loses a Pair of Key Conference Games

Two more.

That is what the loss column for the UCSB men's soccer team standings will show now that the weekend is over. Two is also the number of wins that Santa Barbara has this year — 11 games into the season.

The Gauchos dropped two at home, losing 1-0 to #10 UCLA on Friday and 2-1 against Cal State Northridge Sunday night.

UCSB's only goal of the weekend came off the foot of junior forward Danny Swaim in the first half of the Northridge loss, despite 22 shots-on-goal by Santa Barbara in the game.

"I'm speechless," UCSB junior forward Danny Mann said. "I left nothing out on the field tonight [against Northridge]. Every loss is tough but we needed to win this game to have a chance at the playoffs."

The Gauchos still have a chance at a playoff berth for only the second time in school history (the first was last year). But at 2-7-2, a chance is really all they have.

Only the top two teams from the Pacific Division of the Mountain Pacific Sports Federation are guaranteed to advance into postseason play. The Gauchos matches against the Bruins and the Matadors this weekend were the first that Santa Barbara played against divisional teams this year. So with an 0-2-0 record in league, Santa Barbara will be facing an uphill battle to make the playoffs as the season moves on.

"It's not going to get any easier," UCSB Assistant Coach Travis Harding said. "We need to play with more intensity like we did at SMU."

Harding is referring to UCSB's win against #6 Southern Methodist University Sept. 27. It was a win that gave the team more confidence, and Harding believes that it is not false confidence.

"We showed that we're capable of beating the #6 team in the nation," Harding said. "There is not a weak link on





In the Irvine game, Crawford again led the team with 12 kills at .588 efficiency. She also had three key solo blocks and one block assist as UCSB won 15-8, 15-8, 15-3.

"I played well this weekend," said Crawford. "I was very comfortable with this lineup, we need to keep it up for next week."

The lineup now features Crawford, Gehlke, Bown, sophomore Erin McCown, freshman Kathrine Maaseide and junior setter Maile Mortensen.

"It feels good to be back out there on the court," said Mortensen, who has been in and out of the lineup before this weekend. "We now need to focus on the team that we would be playing next week. Both teams this weekend were very scrappy and aggressive, it will help us step up for next week."
