
My doll was a little worried about parking when we arrived.

"No problemo," I responded, and swung around to the back entrance to a parking lot that could fit many, many cool-daddy Cadillacs. Too cool.


"Oh, Daddy-o," squealed my baby, "This place makes

"Yeah?! Well, we came to the right place. My sister and I used to eat here all the time.'

"Your sister and you ... Where the heck didn't you guys eat?"

"Like, what state?" Steff let me out of the sleeper hold when we got inside, which pleased the chaperon, who quickly showed us to a cozy little table in the corner. Steff's inquired. brown eyes were sparkling. perfect.



Fortunately, the China Castle is good.

Steff whispered.

"Sure. It's quite reasonable, really. And just look at this menu."

Steff looked. He seemed suitably impressed. He voiced words of awe. He

gazed approvingly. "Now try looking inside, Buddy Hackett."

I, of course, didn't need to look. Despite the astonishing array of dishes offered, ranging from seafood to poultry to pork to beef to vegetarian to gargantuan platters for an entire pla-toon of hungry diners, all prepared to culinary perfection (I'd tried most of them ... my sister's a big eater), I knew already what I wanted. I realized suddenly that I'd been wanting it for weeks.

"So that's what's been bothering me," I muttered. "Something I said?" Steff

"No, I've been needing The atmosphere was some Barbecued Pork with Chinese Snow Peas. Badly." "Can we afford this?" Suddenly, my mouth was

watering. I couldn't wait. But wait I would, and enjoyably, as the kindly waiter howered us with excellent hors d'oeuvres. First, crisp eggrolls. With sweet and sour sauce and hot mustard. Full of vegetable delights. Flaky crusts. They were quickly devoured. Then, won tons and foil-wrapped chicken. Chicken marinated in a subtle sauce, positively melting in my mouth. Steff let me have his, 'cause he was starting to worry about being able to finish his Lamb with Broccoli and Garlic Sauce (a special of the day). What with the won ton soup as well, it was looking like a full evening.

But when the fried dumplings came, affectionately known as potstickers, he lifted his self-imposed appetizer ban and downed three of the hefty treats, liberally applying the special and spicy soy sauce blend which accompanied these delightful delicacies.

gen-u-ine rice bowl. Steff's lamb was of a superior breed, prepared carefully and exquisitely. The garlic sauce was slightly tangy, perfectly spiced. It didn't even give him bad breath. It was that good.

We surprised ourselves by finishing most of the me-als. I warned Steff that he might have to run alongside on the way home. He responded with a knuckle. I mean, a chuckle.





Big Yellow House Party!

Just down the road, the B.Y.H. is a wonderful change of pace

These November days can be surprisingly beauti-ful. It is, like the stereotype, 72 degrees and sunny. In other words, prime weather for a mini road trip.

The destination was Summerland, and my dining companion asked where we were headed. I said, in all seriousness, "The Big Yellow House." She thought I meant the hospital, or some other institution.

"No, silly. I mean The Big Yellow House in Summerland. They serve real good food. Real California food. Real real-people food."

"By the way," my com-panion asked, "whatever happened to Skip Stevenson?"

Before we could answer we looked out the window at the blindingly beautiful coastline view. The Channel Islands hovered over the lazy-day haze. And we felt good about being Californians about to eat good food.

The Big Yellow House really is just that, a spacious ochre chateau originally built in 1884. Its original builder was also the founder of the hamlet of Summerland, and the building's second owner, a certain George F. Becker, made a mint on the local oil boom early in the century. Becker promptly invested in making the house the most elaborate manse in the area, with such flourishes as Aus-

tralian gumwood trim and elaborate fireplaces.

The proprietors of to-day's Big Yellow House took over in 1974, and they aren't as interested in making a mint as much as a good meal. Wholesome stick-to-your-ribs foods, like their fabled chili, are king in the Big Yellow House.

The fare is American, through and through. Meals like fried chicken, or oldfashioned pot roast, or a straight-up sirloin dinner are prepared the way you'd do it at home, or at least how you say you'd do it at home.

The portions are big and the food, while simple in appearance, is pulled off at the highest caliber. Take for example the House's potato broiled shredded chicken

skins appetizer. It's served with a mild salsa and, of course, *House* dressing. The danger with potato skins in general is that they can get soggy or even worse, too dang crispy, but the House got the balance right.

After that skins game, we were in the mood for good food.

We came for lunch, and lunch we got. My compan-ion had the House's Chinese Chicken Salad, which I'm told is one of their spe-cialties. I had the club sandwich, and in any other restaurant I'd say she made the wiser choice. But that club sandwich was as close to perfect as it gets.

The chicken salad had

breast in a bed of romaine lettuce, served with mandarin orange slices and a host of vegetables. But it came with a ginger dressing that gave it snap. The combina-

tion was magical. As we left, we couldn't help feeling good. Good ab-out living in Santa Barbara, good about a warm November day, and of course, we felt good about eating good food.


