

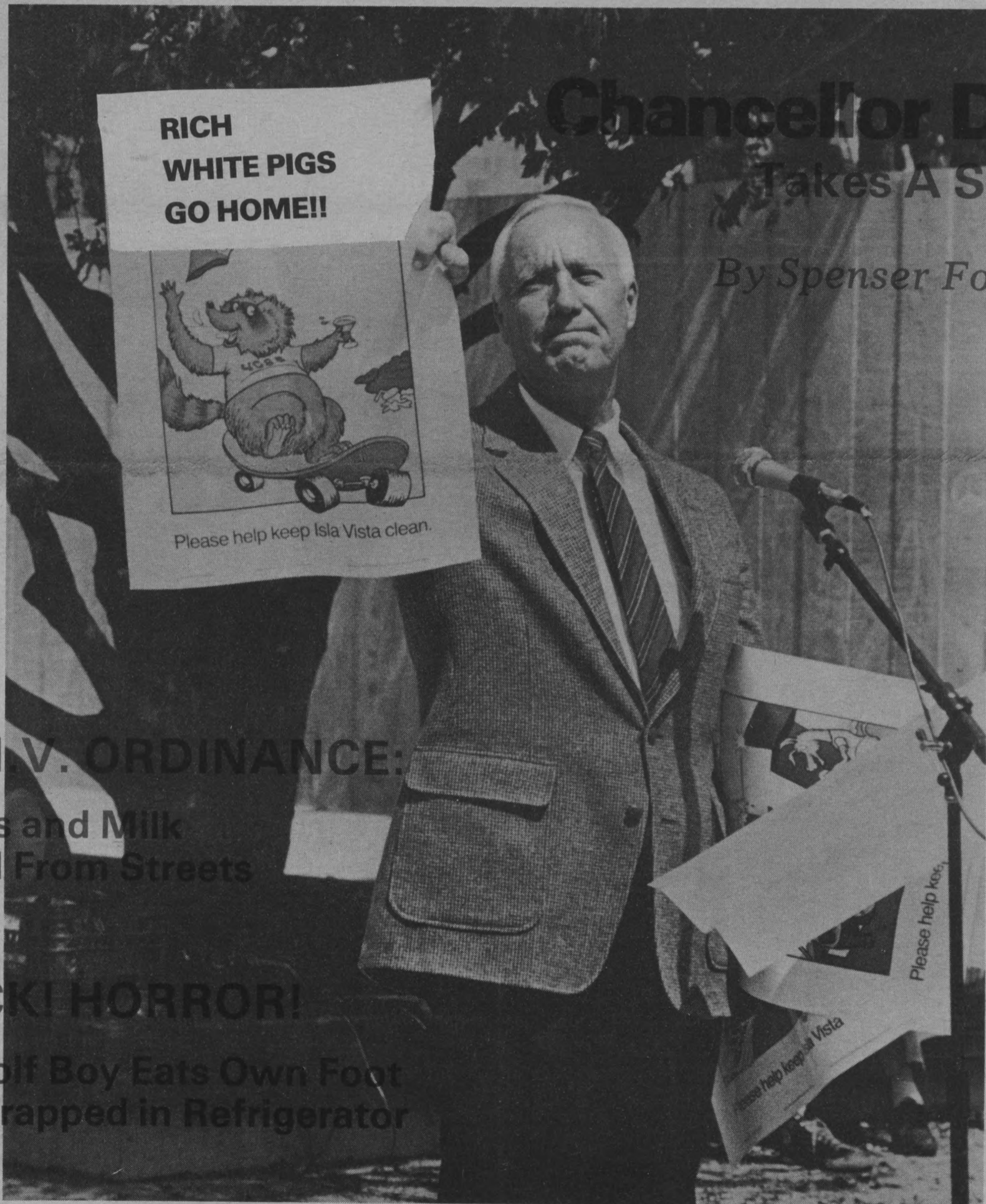

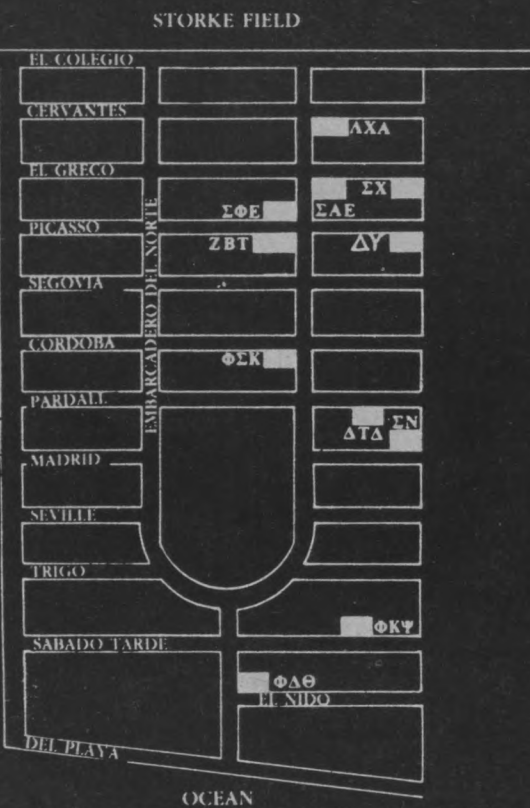

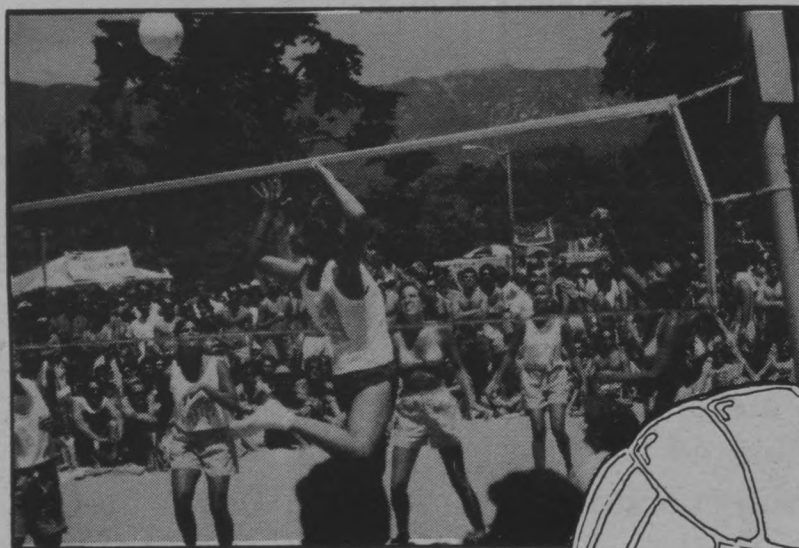

But most of all, it was a great game which won't soon be forgotten.

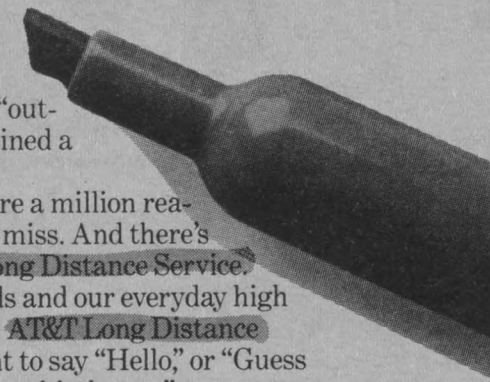
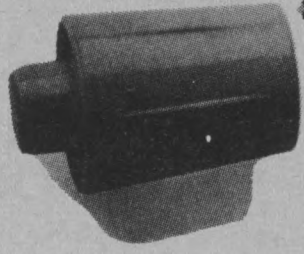
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FISH TALK

What is your favorite fish?

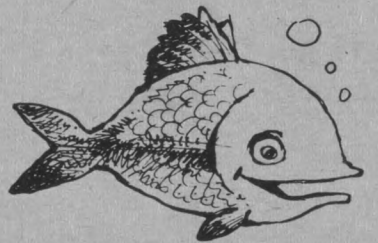

For He's a Jolly Good Fellow

Robert Huffenpuff, former chancellor at UC Santa Barbara and recently appointed commissioner to President Reagan's National Graduate Fellows Program, has faced increasing praise from administration officials following his arrest on charges of fraud, tax evasion and embezzlement.

Sources in the White House suggest Huffenpuff is being primed for a top-level management post in the White House Budget Office. He is also being considered to take over as head of the Internal Revenue Service. "Rob's experience is beyond reproach; he can bring nothing but a vast amount of credibility to this administration," Reagan confidante Barney Rubble said.

"He scares me," says Disunified Front guru Jamie Reaction. "He's turning into a rich white male right in front of my eyes But I still like him 'cuz he's helping me be president."

At the outset of the quarter, Yates' friends were encouraged by his new vitality and commitment. In only a matter of weeks, however, Yates started conducting bizarre tea and poodle rituals in his Abrego flat.

"We would all sit in a big circle on the floor," said one associate close to Yates who wished to remain anonymous for fear of his safety. "Drugless would get in the middle of the ring and start talking about grapes and persuasion and stuff, like it was the most important thing in the world. Then he'd get all quiet, take all our

But others disagree. "I don't see any problem with Huffenpuff's rise to the top. After all, that's what scum does," said University of California President Chauncey Gardner.

"Actually, we're glad to be rid of him. His last book cost us about a million bucks. Maybe the government can afford that, but we're a fledgling university system," asserted Gardner.

Gardner was referring to the former chancellor's last research novel, *British Imperialism and the Downfall of the Interior Decorator in Santa Barbara*.

Huffenpuff is well known for his outgoing personality, his \$104,000 kitchen and his ability to communicate with those more arrogant than himself, said Admiral Binky Poindexter.

But Huffenpuff would not comment on the prospect of his entering government life. "Seeing that this decision is sub-consideration, I shall not answer any queries."

However, a Santa Barbara public relations firm, hired to speak for the presidential pick-of-the-week, said they will start lobbying on his behalf.

"We are establishing a new fund to help the distinguished Professor Huffenpuff. We hope 'Jobs for Snobs' will garner him enough money and support so he can flee the county," said Ray K-Mart, president of the near-bankrupt K-Mart Marketing.

Fallacious said happily. "Drugless is like a son to me, yet kind of like a father. Sort of like Ghandi, Martin Luther King or Emma Goldman."

Other Yates-watchers are not so convinced. "I'm just scared someone is going to get killed or at least seriously incapacitated," said Vegetative Council member and UNLV basketball coach Shark "the Mark" Evans. "What Drugless needs to do is start smoking the bud again. Then maybe he'll mellow out. Right now he's volatile and capable of bad violence at any time."

Throughout the controversy, Yates has remained relatively silent. "I'm not gonna talk to nobody at that paper anymore, no matter what they do," he snarled when asked to comment. "Huffenpuff was right when he stopped talking, too."

Luckily for all involved, elections are coming up and Yates has graduated and left town. "We can all breathe safely now," Reaction said, grinning.

Evita: Her Story

(Editor's Note: Evita Huffenpuff continues to be a source of controversy, especially in light of the role she played in the PTL scandal, as the real "other woman" involved with televangelist Jim Bakker. In her rush autobiography *Evita: The Early Years*, co-authored with Norman Mailer and Tug Uranus, Huffenpuff described the series of events that led to her rise and fall. Here are some excerpts.)

I was born in a small town. It had a general store, a produce market and a 7-11. My parents were simple people, working days in the sausage factory, nights making Pet Rocks. I had 17 brothers and sisters, and we lived in our one-room apartment watching the paint fall off the walls. There was a lot of love in the family, but with Mom's inoperable brain tumor and Dad's iron lung, a big responsibility rested on myself and sister Lulu, the oldest in the family. Somehow I managed to keep a 4.0 grade point average through high school, play eight different varsity sports (football was my favorite) and be president of the student body.

Luckily, I was admitted to Vassar, where I majored in home economics. I lived in a dorm and was a member of a sorority. Those

were very happy years indeed. Then I had the first of a series of epiphanies. I was in a record store and saw the Ventures' *Surfing LP*. It changed my life. It made me truly aware of the incredible oppression faced by citizens of third world nations. And I liked the lyrics in their songs.

In 1966, I transferred to UC Berkeley, where I changed majors, into the newly-formed Revolutionary Young Activists program. I lived in a pacifist/vegetarian/pro-Vietnam involvement commune. One night, my roommate Rainbow gave me LSD. She put it in my Ding Dongs. The room turned purple and green. I saw all my friends become lizards. I got a strange desire to cover myself in peanut butter.

The next day at the protests, the drug-induced hallucinations returned in full force. It was on this trip that I met my future husband, Bob. He was working as an advance man on Lawrence Welk's '66 tour, and had a red satin jacket to prove it.

"What's going on?" he asked. "Don't you know? There's a war going on. I love it!"

"Wow," he said, his face turning into a toad's, then into a walrus'. It was two years later that I realized I wasn't hallucinating.

He gave me tickets to the Lawrence Welk gig, where five other bands played. I wasn't too crazy about the Stones or the Velvet Underground, but Tiny Tim put on one hell of a show that night. After the gig, Bob took me home, where I gazed wistfully into his eyes and he into mine. It was love.

In the winter of 1985, while on a business trip with Bob back east, I met Jim Bakker, who was staying in the hotel room next to ours. One of the only things I remember of that night was

the bean dip. His wife, Tammy, and I shared some really great Valium, and I had to fight to keep from passing out. But the bean dip looked like a great place to rest my weary and drugged-out head, so I drifted. When I woke up, the bean dip was gone. The room was empty, but next to the door was a note from Jim.

"I'll be in Santa Barbara next weekend. Come sin with me. Jim," the note said. Before I knew it, we were hot and heavy. I would follow



him on every tour, meeting him in cheap and sleazy dives in towns like Tucson and Modesto. We were sinning, and it felt pretty damn good.

When I learned Jim was paying his secretary to keep quiet about some supposed affair, I was hurt. So hurt, in fact, that I bought a mansion in Montecito to drown my sorrows. My only option was to throw myself behind Bob, who was coming under increased criticism. After all, I needed new silverware.

What's All That Gooky Stuff?

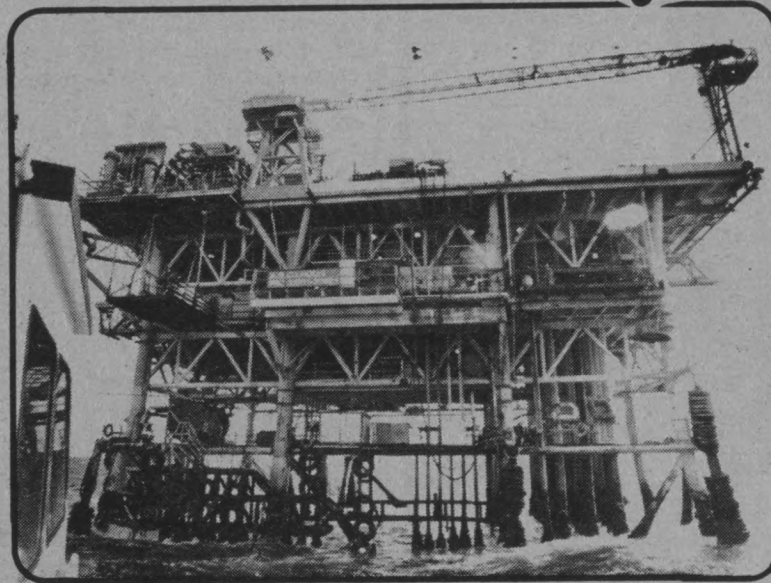

Voluminous globs of tar mysteriously appeared on Isla Vista beaches Tuesday evening, and although area legislators, members of the UCSB community and environmental groups blame ARCO's Platform Holly, company officials have vehemently denied all allegations.

U.S. Coast Guard officials estimate 25,000 barrels of oil have washed into the ocean in the last 24 hours, much of which has yet to wash up on area beaches. "It could get ugly out there," USCG Captain Don Do-Right said. "We sent divers down to the rigs, and one washed onto the shore, regulator full of tar, wetsuit covered with the shit. He was dead! What the hell can they say about that?"

ARCO Spokesman Ranger Rick offered a succinct explanation for the tar. "What're they moaning about now? We put in underwater tents to contain the natural seepage, even though everyone knows the tar is good for marine life. So what if the tents let a tidge more tar out than was planned? It seems some conservationist cretin is jumping down my ass every week."

If anyone isn't too burnt we were thinking of boating out to the rig and blowing it up," she said.

Campus radical Jamie Reaction blamed all "fat, rich, white

capitalist oil-sucking pigs everywhere" for today's debacle, and claimed his election as Assinine Students president is the only way to restore order to I.V.

Although many fish and birds were seen floating on top of the water, the tar has had minimal effects on local surfers. "I mean it's totally killer out there, man, I'm shredding," Joe Dudeson screamed, as he slithered up the beach covered with tar. "It's like physics, dude. The tar is real sticky, but the boats they've sent out there to clean up are big. We're in a western swell season, 'n' the combination has created huge, sticky waves. It's bitchin'!"

Ranger Rick pointed to the good

surf as another positive aspect of oil development off the coast. "It stokes the economy. I mean, the waves are jumbo, so all the surfers go out, and get tar all over themselves. They gotta buy baby oil to clean it off, and oil is a petroleum product, right? We clean up all the way around," he said.

UCSB marine biologist Professor Shelley Plankton indicated the department now supports the proposed Coal Oil Point project, which would add three more platforms to the coastline. "We're all for more platforms now. I mean, our intake ducts are clogged and the wildlife booked for good. But we can probably make some bucks studying the effects oil drilling has on the coast."

Ranger Rick said ARCO is "very interested" in setting up a deal with the marine biology department at UCSB to research the problems associated with development. "I don't think there are any problems, but if it'll shut them up, I'm all for it."

California Gov. George Duderagin has thought about declaring I.V. a disaster area, but has yet to take action. Capitol Hill sources say he is not sure how it will affect his political future, and is waiting for a fact-finding team to come up with results. "As far as I can tell, the only people that live there are a bunch of agro-punks and hippy anarchists.

Crack Kitchen

Two Cheadle Hall administrators have given new meaning to the term "high-level position," following Tuesday's arrests of Betsy Whatsmyjob and Hazel Richmother on felony charges of running a "crack cocaine kitchen" at the home of ex-Chancellor Robert Huffenpuff.

Sheriff and district attorney investigators raided Huffenpuff's Mission Canyon home after an undercover narcotics officer purchased 2.2 kilos of the highly (no pun intended) concentrated drug.

Based on information from "Deep Theory," a pseudonym used by an anonymous source in the UCSB administration, investigators learned the cocaine kitchen was reinforced with steel doors paid for by more than \$100,000 in repairs to Huffenpuff's epicurean center.

It took a team of detectives, as well as university gardeners, plumbers and electricians, two hours to barge through the 4-inch thick walls. The university employees were reportedly called to the scene because of their extensive familiarity with the grounds. Huffenpuff and his wife Evita were in Europe attending a conference on money management and creative tax theories.

Whatsmyjob was still in custody and unavailable for comment yesterday. She was reportedly sent to a local detox center where she is expected to receive "extensive treatment."

Sheriff Detective O.D. Onludes said both Richmother and Whatsmyjob had consumed mass quantities of the cocaine at the time of their arrest and "were unable to stop talking."

"They got their Miranda rights, but they just kept hammering nails in their coffin," Onludes explained. "Lots of people have some explaining to do," he added.

Richmother was released on \$500,000 bail late last night after long-time associate and presidential confidante Barney Rubble posted bond. Her arrest, she said, was not a pleasant experience.

"They manhandled me. I felt like a campus radical. These spurious charges have been brought by small fish in an even smaller pond. Well, I'm a pretty damn big fish and I know how to swim with sharks."
