Employers value written and oral communication skills in addition to knowledge and competence within your discipline. They will expect you to have a breadth of knowledge about the world of work and the ability to communicate clearly about your fields and the world about

There is a general trend of our population that all students could use improvement in communication skills....

In technical areas, students have often depended too heavily upon technical and mathematical skill building and technical expertise. Almost no one works alone on projects. Therefore, an employee must be capable of speaking and writing very clearly in order to work well within the project





This is a room that was designed to help students who are in their first three years of college as well as the Senior. 



You: "(History, English, Philosophy, or any other non-trade Humanities major as the case may be.)"
